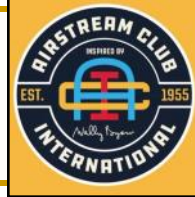

MAINTENANCE MATTERS



Recently, Tom Akam, our new Treasurer, loaned me a book written during the Africa and Europe Caravan led by Wally Byam at the end of 1959. It describes several of the earliest caravans of the club. Along with those descriptions, he offered suggestions for living in a travel trailer, suggestions for how to buy one, information about preparing for trips, and other advice. The Appendix named the items that trailer owners should bring with them. I have shared that list below because I found it interesting to compare it with the items we carry with us today: some are similar, others are quite different as you will note below.

Tow rope – 1 inch nylon, at least 35 feet

Chain – at least 2 lengths 1/4 inch by 15 feet long with hooks on both ends

Lug wrench – the 4-socket "cross type"

Hydraulic jacks – two long-handled types, one for the axle and one for the bumper

Spare tires – one for the car and one for the trailer

Tire pump

Fire extinguisher – "better to be safe than sorry"

Plastic buckets – 2- or 3-gallon nesting ones

Water can – for an emergency supply of water

Wheel chocks – blocks of wood 7" square, 4" thick and slanted at one end, plus a triangular 3-foot-long wedge about 5" high for levelling the trailer

Gasoline can

High pressure hose – 2- or 3- 25' lengths for those occasions when you have to get water from a hydrant, along with a "Y" connection so that if you travel with others, the trailers can all be hooked together on one faucet

Light cord – 50' cord – heavy rubber-covered type

Flashlight – with an extra bulb in the base or head

Coleman lantern – kerosene as a fuel source

Shovel – for digging "gopher holes" – a hole into which human waste could be dropped (that would now be stored in a black tank)

Funnel – for pouring water into the trailer water tank

Folding chair(s) – one per person

Junk pile – a metal box or old dishpan containing "everything" (miscellaneous items)

Tools – "the usual assortment" – a screwdriver kit, pipe wrench, socket wrench kit, hammer, saw, pliers, chisel, ax, etc.

Cleaning equipment – broom, mop, dustpan, mop bucket, and synthetic sponges to clean the trailer windows

First aid kit

Sewer hose – as long as you can carry

Sink hose – this is for draining the sink when camping without utility connections

Ball hitch on the front of the car – when you have to back your trailer into a tight spot it is much easier to do it from the front than from the back, or if you are stuck and need a tow it is easier to hook a chain or rope to this hitch than to crawl under the car to hook it to the frame
