The NC Zoo is nestled on 2,600 wooded acres centrally located in the heart of North Carolina, just south of Asheboro in Randolph County. With 500 developed acres, it is the world's largest natural habitat zoo. The zoo houses 1,800 animals of more than 250 species, primarily representing Africa and North America. https://www.nczoo.org/

Other suggested activities are Seagrove Pottery, NC Aviation Museum, American Classic Motorcycle Museum, hiking trails and a covered bridge.



Taste of the Blue Ridge Caravan 2024

Hello Piedmont Friends!

Steve and I are excited and honored to lead the TOBR 2024 Caravan and we want you to join us! The Blue Ridge Parkway is in our backyard and many may have visited it, but going with 20 Airstreams on this caravan is an adventure you won't want to miss! We start May 14, 2024 on the southern end of the Parkway in Whittier, NC near the Great Smokey Mountain National Park and drive north to end June 9th in Greenwood, VA near the Shenandoah National Park.



The parkway is only 469 miles long and we stop seven times, so travel days are short, giving you plenty of time to set up and begin exploring the area. At each stop, we will spend several days to explore the unique culture, history, geography and attractions of the southern and central Appalachian Mountains. There is SO much to see, do, eat and enjoy!

This caravan has several awesome group activities - white water rafting, zip line, bicycle ride - so get ready to join in the fun! We will spend a day rafting on the Nantahala River that ends with a thrilling splash. Want to see the tops of the trees stream below your feet? That's what we will do on our side-by-side zipline adventure with Navitat. Up in Virginia, we will ride a bus pulling a trailer of bikes up to the top of the trail then ride 17 miles downhill on the "world famous <u>Creeper Trail</u>." This former rail bed has been converted into a bike trail that gently passes through the Mount Rogers National

Recreational area and the highland country of southwest Virginia. The trail crosses and follows several streams and rivers, crosses them on bridges, and travels through mountain coves.

There will be plenty of time for individual or small group adventures. Here's an <u>article</u> about the 25 best waterfalls along the parkway, a great opportunity to go for a hike and bring your camera! Love to fish? The <u>National Park Service protects over one hundred miles of streams</u> that rise along the Blue Ridge. There's more! Crafts and art shops, golf, antique stores, shopping, museums.... So much to see and do!

We eat really well on the TOBR at local restaurants and together around the campfire. Steve and I love to cook/bake in our camp Dutch ovens and look forward to sharing how to cook with charcoal. Last year everyone loved the lasagna meal and we may add another to the agenda. If you have a camp Dutch oven, plan to bring it and help make a meal!

We also love to explore the local breweries and vineyards. Did you know that Asheville has the most breweries per capita in the US? Here's what Hop Culture says about the 9 best breweries in Asheville... a good start because there are many more! There are amazing wineries & vineyards too!

Check out the main attractions we will visit as a group.

- Cherokee Museum and the Oconaluftee Indian Village: experience the intricate culture of the Cherokee people, learn about their history, and watch artisans create authentic, handcrafted art that tell the story of the Cherokee people.
- Biltmore Estates: We will spend a day on a guided tour of "America's Largest Home." Before or after the tour, you'll have time to visit Biltmore's beautiful gardens, the Biltmore Winery, and gift shops.
- Omni Grove Park Inn: We will enjoy a spectacular brunch at this iconic resort. Before or after, you will have time to see the inn "built for the ages" that opened in July 1913.
- National D-Day Memorial in Bedford, VA: This sacred place is a memorial for American D-Day veterans. Thirty-four Virginia National Guard soldiers from in this tiny town, were killed during the first day of the invasion. Bedford VA suffered disproportionally the greatest losses of any American town during the campaign. The National D-Day Memorial is a non-profit organizations that created and maintains this extraordinary memorial without any federal support.
- Grandfather Mountain: Walk across the Mile High Swinging Bridge, America's highest suspension bridge with spectacular views, see bears, eagles, otters and other wildlife in their habitat, explore the Wilson Center for Nature Discovery, grab some lunch at Mildred's Grill, go for a hike through gentle forests or atop rugged peaks, pick up unique mementos at the gift shop, and attend daily programs with naturalists who share facts and information about the plants, animals and ecosystem of Grandfather Mountain.
- Blue Ridge Music Center Concert
- Thomas Jefferson's historic Monticello: Home of the author of the Declaration of Independence, third president of the United States and founder of the University of Virginia, step back in time to see and learn about the life and legacies of Thomas Jefferson. Follow a docent through his home, wander through the extensive gardens, and learn about the enslaved men, women and children who lived and worked on the plantation. Complete your visit by stopping at the Jefferson Vineyard.


