

## **Host and Co-Host Duties for Rallies**

*If you attend our rallies, we would like you to help host them. While hosting or co-hosting takes some effort, it's the best way to get to know members of the club. If you have never hosted or co-hosted, sign up with an experienced host. These duty suggestions are dependent on what type of rally you want to host, and not all of them are mandatory!*

1. When the rally schedule for the next year is announced, sign up for a location that interests you and either recruit co-hosts or see who else signs up. Try to invite some new members to co-host with you.
2. Talk with the President-elect, **Allana Patterson**, ([allanapat@msn.com](mailto:allanapat@msn.com)) to see if she picked up info when she selected the site or if she had something specific in mind for that month. Get a copy of the confirmation, if possible.
3. Two months prior to the rally, call all agencies with whom reservations were made to assure all is still well. Stay in touch with them. RV parks change ownership and things get lost. Make sure you communicate how reservations are to be made and dates for cancellation credit. Get clear directions to the park and the phone number.
4. If possible, visit the location for amenities, area attractions, and area restaurants, etc. If you schedule a trip to a restaurant, ask members to contact you if they do not plan to attend that meal.
5. With co-hosts, select the rally theme. If there is not an obvious theme, check the internet, Chamber of Commerce, and travel guides for ideas.
6. Plan activities for the rally. If events or activities are limited in the area, schedule activities for members. Make tentative reservations as required. Leave time for members to do their own thing.
7. You may want to have a gimmick to get people out into the community. We've used "poker runs," scavenger hunts, and guided tours in the past, or think of something to keep people entertained at the RV park. This can take whatever form you want. In the past we've had crafts, played games (inside or out), shown home movies or slideshows of caravans, had talent programs, or just gossiped and entertained ourselves. Participation may involve an expense. Include the cost on the rally schedule.
8. Rallies formally start on Friday, but early arrivals come on Thursday. Most people just want to visit on Thursday evening after dinner.
9. With co-hosts, plan the menu. It's your decision what meals will be group meals and when people are on their own. Usually hosts plan suppers and breakfasts with lunches on their own. However, we have had brunches, lunches, heavy hors d'oeuvres, potlucks, potlucks with everyone bringing their own meat to grill and a side dish to share, potlucks with different parts of the alphabet assigned to food, and meals where everyone brought something for the communal pot. You may choose to have a meal catered or go to a restaurant. You may charge extra for special occasion meals. It's your rally, so you decide how much you do or do not want to do.

## *Host and Co-Host Duties for Rallies*

10. By the time of the rally prior to yours, provide the webmaster & newsletter editor with a flyer describing the rally. It should include: the name of the RV park, the address and phone number of the park, directions to the park, the theme of the rally, how much slots will cost, a schedule of activities, and a list of anything that will be needed. Set a date by which attendees must make reservations, your contact address, phone number, and email address.
11. Arrange to pick up needed items of club equipment from the President. You'll probably need signs, coffee pots, and utensils unless the keeper of the supplies is not attending the next rally.
12. Inventory the supplies and equipment with hosts of prior rally. Let the President know what supplies need to be replenished.
13. Tell people what to bring to meals, their own set ups, coffee cups, bowls, etc.
14. The coffee pot needs to be cleaned after every rally. Follow directions included with the coffee pot.
15. On the day before the rally or the first day of the rally, plan a gathering spot and put out any signs, if applicable.
16. Also, submit receipts and receive reimbursement from the treasurer if you have spent approved monies on food or supplies.
17. Assure the facility is clean and that all campers leave without any problems. Check with the park to see how the rally room should be arranged, if applicable.
18. The more you can do before you get to the rally site, the more you will enjoy the rally!

# Editor David's Airstream Club Primer

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## October 2023 : Origins

History is an integral part of our club and is, to this day, very much celebrated by the ACI and its membership. This month's primer will introduce you to the place of its origin.

In July 2022, right after the 65th International Rally in Fryeburg, ME, Kim and I joined our first caravan. This one was sponsored by the Charter Oak (CT) Club in Region 1 (more about clubs and regions in a future article) and its destination was the Maritime provinces of Northeastern Canada: New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island. We were delighted to learn that the caravan would be passing near to the site of our club's founding in Kentville, NS, and that we would be able to make a side trip there on a free day.

The event is commemorated by a plaque. It reads, in part...

### WALLY BYAM CARAVAN CLUB

FOUNDED 1955

The first meeting of the Wally Byam Caravan Club was held on this estate in the summer of 1955.

Members of the Airstream Company's 1955 "Eastern Canada Caravan" decided they would form a recreational vehicle club to continue the caravanning they so much enjoyed.

During their trip they formed a committee and by the time they reached Halifax had a new constitution and bylaws drafted. It was during their visit to Kentville that the new club held its first official meeting. They elected officers and adopted a new constitution and by laws (*sic*) on August 3, 1955. Dues were established at \$1.00 per year. The Wally Byam Caravan Club's first president was F.E. (Pop) Riley.
