Once there we had incredible views of surrounding mountains. Mount Rainier was right next door, and, in the distance, we could see St. Helens, Adams, Hood and Baker. Amazing

Barry Hook, Barbara, and Trenor, made a trip to Mount St. Helens. Quite different now compared with when we saw it in the 1980s.






Nightly entertainment included a country and western band, a jazz band, a modern music group, and an outdoor movie ("Good Morning Viet Nam") with popcorn.

MAINTENANCE MATTERS



The Tilleys think that is would a good idea to have some suggestions/hints about maintaining our Airstreams, so we are submitting the following article. As well, we hope that members of the B.C. Unit will consider submitting articles to publish in this column **or** suggestions for articles by way of an "Ask an Expert" format.

To begin, we would like to share an article from the Oregon Streamer presented by Mike Burnett, the Rally Coordinator for the Oregon Airstream Club. This is a portion of an article by Dr. Emily Lawrence from the May edition of RV News.

This article addresses a maintenance related health risk that most of us do not think about except at the beginning of the camping season: sanitizing our fresh water tanks. Improperly or infrequently sanitized fresh water tanks can pose a health risk, even if you only use your on-board fresh water for showering, hand washing, or dish washing.

The specific health risk highlighted in this article is called <u>Legionella</u> bacteria, which can cause Legionnaires Disease if inhaled. The bacteria occur naturally in lakes, rivers, and other fresh water sources and can contaminate human-made systems, including RV water tanks. If airborne particles containing the bacteria are inhaled, it can lead to a host of serious respiratory issues. Inhalation can occur due to shower spray or splashing faucets that create microscopic droplets in the air you are breathing.

Most RVs are equipped with a hot water heater, which is the perfect breeding ground for this bacteria. In addition, campers regularly travel to warmer climates where they let their vehicle sit under the hot sun. If they don't regularly clean and sanitize their water tanks, the bacteria can grow out of control. RVs are closed environments where you could be in close contact with Legionella every day. Many RV users are senior citizens, so they're inherently at higher risk of developing these issues. It's always important to be on the lookout for Legionella outbreaks, but high-risk travelers need to be extra careful. This bacteria is stubborn, so you'll need to go beyond your traditional cleaning methods to get rid of it. A recent study on Legionella revealed that only 60% of RV users cleaned their water tanks on a regular basis. Properly cleaning and sanitizing your water system can remove existing Legionella growths and prevent future infections.

The sanitation process is simple. On a regular basis, perform the following steps to keep your on-board water supply safe.

- Begin by emptying your fresh water tank.
- Next, you'll need to drain the water heater
- Turn off the water heater and let it cool down. Next, open the drain plug at the bottom and open the pressure vent lever at the top. All the water should drain out once you do this. Close everything up once you're finished, so you can refill it with water.
- Now you need to fill your fresh water tank with a mixture of water and chlorine bleach. A good rule of thumb is to add ¼ cup unscented household bleach for every 15 gallons of fresh water. Once your tank is full of this mixture, run all the faucets around your RV. Shut them off once you can smell bleach.
- Let everything sit for 24 hours. Once the waiting period is up, you can drain the entire system again (including the water heater). Check with your Airstream manual about whether you can speed up the process to less than 24 hours by adding more bleach.
- Refill the tanks with fresh water and run it through your faucets until all the bleach smell is gone. You may need to repeat this process a second time to get rid of any lingering traces of the bleach treatment. Stay on top of your RV water system maintenance. Legionella poses a serious danger to RV users. On-board water system sanitation should be a regular part of your RV maintenance for a variety of reasons, including prevention of dangerous bacterial growth in your on-board water system.

CARAVANS – Let's Get Rolling

Let's face it, Wally Byam designed a trailer providing the comforts of home while exploring the world, or even just the little corner where we live. When the WBCCI (now ACI) was formed a large group was on a caravan from the U.S. to the Maritime provinces of Canada. Those folks agreed that what they were doing promoted Fun, Friendship, and Adventure. With Wally they organized the Wally Byam Airstream Club (later International was added). They decided it was about caravanning together with that very act bringing about fun, friendship and adventure. Caravans and all they lead to was (and is) the basis of the organization.

But here's the truth folks – the problem is we just don't have enough caravans. In our local BC Unit, we used to have more. The last few years have really seen a diminution of the number. This year there was only one caravan on Vancouver Island. We've got to get rolling. Yes, we need rallies, get togethers, meals, and so on. But what we really need is caravans.

Of the few hundred people who read this newsletter there are some who have an idea of a local caravan they'd love to go on. Could be a caravan leading to several locations catering to common interests (i.e.: golf, fishing, bird watching, hiking, sandy beaches, wine tasting, or so many others). Some years ago, Marilyn Van Iderstine created the "Small Towns of BC" caravan. All these years later it's still one of my favourite caravan experiences. I know most of you have never been on this caravan. I'll bet if we asked nicely Marilyn would still give us all her notes to get us started. This would be a GREAT caravan to take your kids or grandkids. Talk about learning to understand where we live. What about a caravan to visit various First Nations groups and learn from them about their culture, land, ceremonies, etc. Or a caravan to go to next year's Region 10 Rally in Coeur D'Alene, Idaho?

I know you're thinking of a caravan you'd like to attend. I also know most of us are waiting for someone else to organize it because: "I don't know where to start"; "it just looks too complex to me"; "I'm in this for the fun, not the work"; I might get it wrong" and so on. Some folks have looked at the Caravan Leaders Handbook on the website and decided it's too daunting.

I'm asking you to do 2 things. First, share your caravan idea with another person. If they think it sounds good, then go to the second. The 2nd is, get in touch with me. See, I'm the Region 10 Caravan Chair and my job is to support more caravans happening. With the scope of that I won't have time to design caravans. But I can surely help you and several others in their efforts. So, get in touch with me. I'll help you think through the concept, create a plan, help you find others to work with you (better not to work alone and, besides, this is about Friendship, right?).

My contact information is below. Don't hesitate. Get in touch. That Airstream trailer or motor home you have isn't meant to sit in your driveway. It was made to move. Some moving will be solo. Some movement needs to be in a group called a caravan. Trust me – it's much more rewarding than you can imagine.


