

Several Region 9 members are responsible for leading Airstreamers from across Canada and the US through our Region. West of the Pecos Caravan led by Nancy and Brian Powers of THLAC has gone National! WOP is now a National Caravan and may still have a site or two open for October trip to our Region's state treasure, Big Bend, in 2024. Mother Lode of the Mother Road - Rt 66 National Caravan led by Vicki and Tom Ketchum and co-leaders Tracy and Rick Elkins, all from GHAC are getting their kicks from Illinois to California. This 8-week caravan is the first national caravan to traverse the entire 3.2k miles. Several Region 9 members work to make our Streamin' on the Strand, a National Event Rally, a success. Marya and Bruce Barefoot, THLAC, Tracy and Rick Elkins, GHAC, Anna and David Brandon, NTxAC, and Rich and Diane Espinosa, TAU are the official hosts for this 3rd annual event that brings Airstreamers from Michigan to Colorado to Arizona and beyond to party on The Strand in Galveston, Feb 1-4, 2024. Did you know that Texas Six Shooter National Caravan led by Jim and Pam Dudley and co leaders Keith and Barbara Roberts all THLAC is a redesigned caravan of the previously Gone to Texas Caravan. This is a beautiful Spring 2024 trip from Alpine to San Antonio to Fredericksburg to Fort Worth with visits to the most iconic Texas sites we have to offer. A goal for Region 9 is to reach out to new and old members with a variety of Airstream Clinics offered in three areas of our Region. Frank Steed, THLAC, is Region 9 Special Events Chair and is working to bring those clinics into existence as a coordinated opportunity for all our local clubs.

The intent is to advertise all our clubs through connections with the Airstream dealerships. Frank is not reinventing the wheel, however. It's a beginning and we welcome any who want to participate in this outreach to let me know. This is a free one-year membership to WBCCI that is made available through dealerships to all new Airstream purchasers. To qualify, the new owner becomes a member at large and is introduced to all the local clubs via letters, phone calls, brochures, and we hope takes the time to rally with several local clubs before joining the "tribe." Dutch Apple Pancakes (Submitted by AnnMarie Esparza)

GWEN JONES BRYAN TEXAS UTILITIES

Oven-baked pancakes are impressive with their highly puffed sides. This Dutch apple version is wonderfully spiced and makes for a great breakfast or dessert.

4 eggs

½ cup flour

½ cup plus 1 tablespoon sugar,

divided use

½ teaspoon baking powder

Pinch salt

1 cup milk

2 tablespoons (¼ stick) butter, melted

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 teaspoon ground nutmeg, divided use

4 tablespoons (½ stick) butter

½ teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 large tart apple, peeled, cored and thinly sliced

- 1). In a large bowl, whisk together eggs, flour, 1 tablespoon sugar, baking powder and salt. Gradually whisk in milk until smooth, then whisk in melted butter, vanilla and 1/2 tsp nutmeg. Let batter rest at least 30 minutes and up to overnight ** AnnMarie notes that you can make in ziplock bags.
- 2) When ready to bake, preheat oven to 425 degrees.
- 3) Heat a 10-inch cast-iron skillet over medium and add 4 tablespoons butter. Once melted, brush butter up sides of pan and remove from heat.
- 4) In a small bowl, combine ¼ cup sugar, cinnamon and remaining ½ teaspoon nutmeg, then sprinkle evenly over the melted butter. Arrange the apple slices over the sugar mixture, then sprinkle the remaining ¼ cup sugar over the apples.
- 5) Place the pan over medium-high heat and cook just until the liquid starts to bubble. Remove from heat and evenly pour the batter over the apples.
- 6) Bake 15 minutes, then reduce heat to 375 and bake 10 minutes more. Serve immediately.

SERVES 4



Caribbean Jerk Chicken (Submitted by Roseann Young)

- 3 Tablespoons McCormick A Hint of Sea Salt Caribbean Jerk Chicken Seasoning
- *Roseann used Adams Jerk Seasoning
- 3 Tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 Tablespoons soy sauce
- 1 Tablespoon cider vinegar
- 2 1/2 pounds bone-in chicken parts
- 1) Mix Seasoning, oil, soy sauce and vinegar in a small bowl. Reserve 2 tbsp. marinade for basting. Place chicken in a large resealable plastic bag or glass dish. Add remaining marinade; turn to coat well.
- 2) Refrigerate 30 minutes or longer for extra flavor. Remove chicken from marinade. Discard any remaining marinade.
- 3) Grill over medium heat with lid closed 30-40 minutes or until chicken is cooked through, turning occasionally and basting with reserved marinade during the last few minutes of cooking.
