To help alleviate any apprehensions you may have about hosting, we've come up with several ways in which the club is eager to support you. If you've never hosted (or maybe never even attended a rally), you may want to test the waters by co-hosting. Or, you may want to ask the leadership to connect you with an experienced mentor to guide you (Airstreamers love sharing their experience!) If you want to plan something that would require a financial outlay, we can help with that too. For instance, for the next 6 months we'll be testing a program to allocate \$150 per rally from the club treasury to support any incidental expenses. We can also consider a rally fee or an optional excursion fee if you have something special in mind, or if there's a unique event or attraction around the date and location of your rally. Talk to us! Although about five rigs from NTAC were selected for the Balloon Fiesta Airstream Rally lottery, the Brandons and the Wrights were not among them. So, at the ninth hour when there was no hope for us on the wait list, we reserved spots on a mesa just north of the field in a private industrial section that Dan Dice found last year. We knew it would be a little longer walk (from our trailers, it was .75 mile to the middle of the balloon field and 1.5 miles to where the Airstream trailers park), but we figured it would just give us a good workout every day. Parking on Friday was a breeze in this open lot and, as long as we stayed in our marked site, we could pull in from either direction. Parking in a Jack and Jill fashion, with both our awnings out, gave us a lovely shady patio area for hanging out between balloon events (and gave us a bird's eye





view of the fireworks at night!) Just like the rally parking, this is full-out boondocking; one important difference, though, is that rally attendees have the option to pay for a pumpout or water refill in case they need it. Without that in our back pocket, we had to make sure we were really efficient with our water and waste tanks Friday through Monday.

The weather was stunning and the balloons flew every morning of our long weekend there. We had arranged ahead of time to be crew for one of the balloons, the Déjà Blu, owned by veteran balloonists Gary and Cindy. Crewing a balloon gives you the participant/observer role in a whole new world of sport, and it was fairly easy to learn their routine setting up and folding up at the end. The hardest part of the job is actually keeping the crowd off the balloon when it's on the ground and out of the way when you're preparing for take-off. I guess there is one other hard part: getting up at 5:00 AM so you can be down on the field before 6:30!

I must confess that I did have an ulterior motive for offering free labor: I wanted a free ride! Sure enough, Sunday morning Cindy took me aside and said that one of us could go up with Gary and she didn't want to be the one to choose the rider. It was easy— David, Mark, and Michelle had already said they weren't good candidates for going up, so it got to be me.

Wow! The minutes spent up in the sky give you a whole different perspective than looking out of an airplane window.

As the balloon goes up, the landscape below you gradually gets smaller and smaller, but

We had to head back to the balloon field for Gary to refill the propane tanks, but then we were done for the day. Before we left though, we were treated to the fabled history of balloon flight followed by the Balloonist's Prayer and our "christening" as balloonists. We can't go next year due the conflict with the to International Rally in Sedalia, but we are already making

Editor David's Airstream Club Primer

November 2023 : Where on Earth is Region 9?

ACl¹ is a large, international organization with over 18,000 members. Each year we have an annual International Rally, plus a number of National Rallies and Caravans throughout the year, all of which are supported at the national level. In addition, there are many more regional and local events. These are supported and organized, as you may rightly guess, at regional and local levels. So what exactly does that mean? I'm glad you asked.

Our club's main headquarters is located in Jackson Center, OH, just down the road from the Airstream company's HQ and factory (*Useful Links and Contacts* in every issue of this newsletter gives the addresses for both; visitors encouraged). National events are coordinated out of this office. But the larger part of our club is geographically subdivided in a multi-level fashion so we can get together more often in progressively smaller groups at more convenient localities closer to home—wherever that is. That's where regions and clubs come in.

There are 12 regions within the ACI², cleverly numbered 1–12. Look toward the back of your *Blue Beret* magazine on the first page of the section headed *Event Schedule*. There you will find an excellent, color-coded map defining the boundaries of each of them. The numbers progress from Region 1, covering the northeastern corners of the U.S. and Canada, from north to south and east to west, all the way to Region 12, consisting of Nevada and California. We are in Region 9, which includes all of Oklahoma and Texas, except for the few square miles of Texas around El Paso that are in the Mountain time zone (that bit is in Region 11). The ACI website has a *Region Directory* where you can explore more:

Closer to home, each region is further made up of *clubs*, originally known as *units*. Some organizations might term their local bodies *chapters*; it's essentially the same thing. Clubs are identified by both a name and a number. Our club name is North Texas Airstream Club, and its number is 099. I suppose you could just say 99, but club numbers are traditionally typed using three digits, as in the *Welcome New Members* feature of the *Blue Beret*. I don't know what the highest assigned club number is, but the numbering scheme can accommodate up to 999. The ACI website also has a Club Directory:

I have a bit more to say on this topic, but I try to keep these articles short enough to be consumed along with a cup of coffee. Since I wouldn't want any of you setting this aside to fetch another cup, I'll finish up next month.

²If you click on the Region Directory link provided you will see a 13th, Region o. I can only speculate about this one. When you join ACI, you have the option not to align yourself with any local club. Such members are called Members At Large, which, incidentally, has its own "club" number 000. My guess is that Region 0 is for these folks.

NTxAC November Business Meeting Minutes

Rally Host Report
