State of Florida House Bill # 109 - State Park Campsite Reservations This Bill goes into effect on January 1, 2024

Florida residents will have the opportunity to reserve state park cabins and campsites one month before nonresidents. Florida residents will be able to reserve state park cabins and campsites Including sites for RV, tent, boat, and equestrian camping - up to 11 months in

advance, and up to 10 months in advance for nonresidents. Florida residents must provide proof of residency

(a Florida drivers license or dentification card) When making reservations more than 10 months in advance. If approved by the Governor, these provisions take effect January 1, 2024. Meet The SFAC Newly Elected Board of Directors and Trustees

SFAC Unit 30 Treasurer's Report, November 3, 2023 Submitted By: Linda Laviano, Treasurer

The club checking account balance is \$3,049.79. The savings account balance is \$10,745.31. The total of the accounts are \$13,795.10.

The board voted to separate funds into an operations (checking) account and a savings account for security purposes and will be exploring options for a higher interest yield option.

Additional income reflects rally fees from both the Rallies at Katheryn Abbey Hannah (KAH) Park in Jacksonville, and the Pumpkin Fest Installation Rally at Myakka River State Park, and monthly deposits from ACI for membership dues paid to International.

Debits include rally expenses, club operating expenses, and the purchase of a portable amplification system for use at club events.

The following is a financial summary of the final 2 rallies of the Year.

The KAH Rally had 32 attendees. We collected \$736.00 in rally fees, made a \$100. Donation to Timucuan Parks Foundation and had a total of \$767.69 in food and related expenses. The club had a net loss of \$31.69 for the rally.

The Pumpkin Fest Rally had 62 attendees. We collected \$3,340.00 in rally fees, made a \$100 donation to Friends of Myakka River State Park, and had a total of 3,202.26 in food and related expenses. The club had a net gain of \$137.44 for the rally.

- Directory Editor keeps the membership list updated and sends a directory to new members.
- Facebook Administrator (chooses 2 members as manager assistants) to keep page updated with club information, monitors posts and enters new members to our page. Will keep the WBAC website up to date with club activities.
