PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This time of year is great for reflecting and for looking ahead. As a club, we have a lot to think back on and even more to look forward to. 2023 has been a year filled with great memories of camping adventures that included travel to familiar and new places, and most importantly spending precious time with close friends while making new friends.

In 2023, the Oregon Airstream Club hosted over 35 rallies in all parts of the state and at many points north in Washington. Our club organized three caravans from Oregon to the Airstream Clubs International Rally in Rock Springs, WY, ensuring the OAC and Region 10 was well represented. We hosted local breakfasts, including our annual holiday brunch, and monthly coffee gatherings as ways to keep our members connected throughout the year. Our members rallied and caravanned as part of other ACI events, including traveling south to Pasadena to attend to the Rose Parade National Event Rally; north for the North to Alaska Caravan; and northeast for the Canadian Rocky Mountain Caravan.



We have so much to look forward to in 2024. With close to 40 rallies, scheduled and approved, there are camping opportunities in familiar and favorite places, including a few new rallies that have been added as a result of the creativity of this group.

A big thank you to our rally coordinator Mike Burnett and all of the volunteer hosts and co-hosts who have stepped forward to make this possible!

A sneak preview of the 2024 rally schedule was shared at the Year End Rally and emailed to all members after the Year End Rally. The 2024 version of the rally handbook will be available mid-December. The printed edition will be sent to all members' home addresses and the online version will be on the OAC website. We will hold rally registration in January for most rallies, opening registration for a couple of rallies including the Leak Test Rally a bit earlier. Notification and reminder emails will be sent providing key dates for you to plan... be sure to mark your calendar!

We learned a lot about the registration process in 2023 from member feedback and through analysis of the registration data. Using this information, we've made a few modifications to the process to make registering for

rallies as inclusive as possible. Our <u>registration policy is posted online</u> and everyone is encouraged to review before registration opens. When registration opens, it will be in three parts: day one for hosts and cohosts to register for their rallies; day two for hosts and cohosts to register for thank you rallies; and day three registration for all members, a rolling start at noon with rallies opening in calendar date order.

Last, but not least, at our Year End Rally we welcomed new executive board members, thanked ALL board members for their service and transitioned a few board positions.

Please join me in thanking Norma Massier for her service as our board secretary and Brenda Leppo, Buzz and Lynn Blick for their service on our board as directors.

With this transition, we have two new members joining our executive board to fill out our roster. Welcome to Rachel Collins, our new second vice president, and Gary Crumley as our new club secretary.

Recently, while working with the ownership and management of a new, upscale RV Resort in Dundee, Oregon, I was able to negotiate discounted cost and facility arrangements for two




planned 2024 OAC Rallies. These friendly and business-like interactions were a pathway to a very positive and forward looking relationship, both for me, the OAC, and the Resort.


MEMBERSHIP


from AZ, CA, ID, ME, OR, and WA.

September 28 – October 1, 2023 Champoeg State Heritage Area, OR



Annual silent auction at the Year End Rally

On October 7, 2023, at Silver Cove RV Park, in Washington, the Oregon Airstream Club held their annual silent auction. They generously donated \$1400 to the Gospel Mission Homeless center in Salem, Oregon and received lots of cool "stuff" in return.

Oregon Airstream Club is a non-profit camping enthusiast group, one of the biggest and most active in the United States. It is part of the Airstream International Club, originally founded in the 1950s by Wally Byam, a native Oregonian.

The Gospel Mission is a non-denominational, non-profit organization that provides many community services in Salem, Oregon's capitol. It offers homeless shelters, drug and alcohol counseling, occupational training, and three nutritious, meals a day, 365 days a year.

The Mission also has a warm and attractive day area, medical care, and special homeless programs for men, women, and children. It is funded with private donations and community grants. It also receives proceeds from a thrift shop next door, which provides vouchers for the needy, as well.

For the silent auction, 33 gifts were donated by approximately 70 participants from 35 Airstream RV trailers. The gifts included crafts, pieces of art, tools, gift baskets, bottles of fine wine and Irish whiskey, sold for as much as \$80 each. One contributor and his wife bought over \$200 worth of gifts in the auction.

Ruby Troncin, who organized the event, said it was great fun putting together gifts for the event. It was especially exciting to see the unique items sold for a good cause. She was very pleased one of her five gifts, a large organically grown pumpkin, sold for the princely sum of \$25.

All of these gifts and contributions will be greatly appreciated and will help make a significant difference in our community.

TIPS ON OPERATING YOUR CONVECTION OVEN/MICROWAVE IN YOUR AIRSTREAM.

How many of you who have the oven/microwave combo have pulled your hair out trying to figure out how to use it? (I certainly have!) I'll admit it's not as intuitive as I thought it would be, and through some trials and tribulations, I think I have figured out enough that I want to share.

The oven/microwave can do many things, although I have only been able to explore a couple settings (still trying to figure out the dishwasher setting haha). The convection oven settings have many uses. I recently started using it to proof bread dough when it's too cold on the countertop. I put my dough in a bowl covered in plastic in the oven before I turn it on. For proofing yeasted doughs, click Convection - 1 - Start. It's only going to 100F so nothing is going to melt. Once it beeps (meaning up to temp) I'll just leave it and it automatically shuts off after 5 min. If I want to hold that temp for longer, I open the door and set time for say 30 min and click start. After 30 min, it will auto shut off. I check on how the proof is going and turn it back on (convection - 1 - start) to warm it back up if needed. Easy to do!

RECIPE: BREAKFAST ENGLISH MUFFIN STACKED WITH AVOCADO, SAUTÉED VEGETABLES, AND TOPPED WITH AN EGG AND CHEESE.

Prep time: 15 mins Cook time: 15 mins

2 Servings

<u>Ingredients</u>

1 English muffin

2 eggs

1/2 avocado, halved

Oil olive

Salt, to taste

Black pepper, to taste

1/3 cup onion, diced

1/2 bell pepper, diced

1/3 cup mushrooms, sliced

2 Tb tomato, small diced

Your favorite cheese, about 2 Tb divided



Directions

- 1. Split and toast English muffin in a toaster or using your oven at 350F. Divide avocado between the two English muffin halves. Mash on toasted bread and salt to taste.
- 2. Sauté onion, pepper and mushroom in a small amount of olive oil in a hot pan. Season with salt and pepper. Layer mixture on top of avocado. Top with cheese.
- 3. Cook egg as you wish. Layer on top of cheese, top with diced tomato and serve.

CRANBERRY ICE

Cranberry Ice

2 cups water

2 cups sugar

4 cups fresh cranberries

Juice of 1 to 1½ lemons and some of lemon zest

Juice of 2 oranges and some orange zest

1 cup pineapple juice

Boil water, sugar and cranberries until cranberries pop.

Process the cranberries through a food mill. Discard skins and seeds.

Add the lemon, orange and pineapple juice.

Stir in the lemon and orange zests.

Freeze.

As crystals begin to form, whip with a hand mixer.

Continue to freeze and mix until light pink in color.








