Editor David's Airstream Club Primer

November 2023: Where on Earth is Region 9? (redux)

Grab another cup of coffee while I finish up this topic. Last month I introduced the geographical and hierarchical organization of the Airstream club: International > Regional > Local. But there's more to it than that. There are two more concepts to cover: International and Intra-Club.

I'm going to start with Intra-Club because it's more straightforward. Here's what the website has to say about Intra-Clubs on the <u>Heritage</u> page directed at future members:

By the early 1960s, club members with special interests began forming theme-specific sub-clubs within WBCCI. We now call these Intra-Clubs. The first Intra-Clubs allowed members to share their interests in square dancing, amateur radios, and CB radios. Eventually, Intra-Clubs were formed with a variety of other focuses, ranging from single Airstreamers, "Teen-Streamers", [sic] and "Full Timers" to Gems & Minerals, Personal Computers, Geneology, [sic] and Vintage Airstreams. Several Intra-Clubs remain active today.

Intra-Clubs span our geographical hierarchy as they are organized around themes rather than localities. Anyone can join regardless of their region. Of course, Intra-Clubs have their own section on the ACI website, so that's a good place to learn more about the currently active ones: https://airstreamclub.org/explore/intra-clubs.

Now for the part that's less well-defined: the "I' in both ACI and WBCCI – which stands for International. The most obvious international component is our friends up in Canada. Their local units are distributed by province across Regions 1, 2, 7 & 10. There are more mysterious bits, though. If you look at the color-coded region map in the Blue Beret, which I mentioned last month, you'll see that Mexico is shaded in the same color as Region 11, yet there are no local clubs listed. Do we have designs on southerly expansion? Maybe a good question for Region 11 or International Leadership. And then there's Europe. As late as April, 2022, the Blue Beret published a link for airstreamclub.org/europe. If you navigate there now, you'll get an "access denied" message. Where did they go? Maybe the Find a Club page implies the answer. There is a selector for North America or Europe. If you click Europe, it comes up as 0 clubs. And yet ther is still an International Relations Committee whose chairman has European connections. I think the answer can be found here: https://www.airstreamclubeurope.org/about-us-en. I'll leave it to you to enlighten yourselves.
