After that adventure we stopped for a couple nights in Cody, WY traveling with Brian and Nancy Powers where we visited the Bill Cody Historical Museum and tried out a couple restaurants. This turned out to be a fun stop. We then met up with other THLAC members gathering in Roswell, WY the night before going to International so we could park together in Rock Springs. Pam and Jim Dudley with Keith and Barbara Richards organized a group dinner on spur of the moment for all of us and a few other folks they had met along the way.
