### **BIRDING IN TEXAS**

The Lone Star state is home to some of the most famous birding sites in the country. Here you can experience some of the most exciting spring migration in the country. Perhaps you will spot a Whooping Crane, Least Grebe, Green Jay, a Goldencheeked Warbler or a Colima Warbler.

**April and May** allows birders to see South Texas specialties and migrants at the same time. It's possible to tally up over 100 species along the coast in a single day. Spring migration along the coast peaks approximately April 15th through May 10th.

Plan your birding trip in advance checking out the parking available. For site information visit the Audubon Society at <u>https://www.audubon.org/news/birding-texas</u>. Also check out the Texas State Parks Birding page at <u>https://tpwd.texas.gov/stateparks/parks/things-to-do/state-park-birding</u>. Many state parks have bird blinds, offer birding checklists and sponsor birding events.

**Top Ten Birding Sites:** Anahuac National Wildlife Refuge, Brazos Bend State Park, Hagerman National Wildlife Refuge, Hornsby Bend Bird Observatory, Mitchell Lake Audubon Center, Choke Canyon State Park, Aransas National Wildlife Refuge, Bentsen Rio Grande Valley State Park, Santa Ana National Wildlife Refuge, Big Bend National Park

**Birding Tips:** Go before 9 a.m. before joggers, bikers and dogs disturb the birds. Dusk is also a good time to catch both daytime and nighttime birds. Dress comfortably in subdued shades of gray, brown, and green and completely avoid bright colors, especially white, which is a color birds most often associate with danger. Bring along a pair of binoculars or a camera with a distance lens. When you begin, scan the treetops, brushy undergrowth and shoreline for movement with your naked eye and listen for bird sounds. Carefully bring your binoculars to your eyes and look in the direction of the movement/sound. Don't forget to look up for birds in flight. For identification be sure to carry a field guide. You may also want to use a website or app such as <u>AllAboutBirds.org</u>, <u>eBird.org</u> and <u>iNaturalist.org</u>. Don't hesitate to ask other birders what they have seen in the area. Most of all, have fun!



Dear Rivet, Why is it so important to level my Airstream? Just A Littleoff

Good question! When your rig is level it keeps the doors working properly preventing them from jamming or opening when not expected. Also, most rigs have a gas/electric refrigerator which has a flame putting off heat and fumes. These can escape to the outside easily when all is level. Finally, most importantly, the sewer system is manufactured to be slightly tilted toward the outside of the rig making everything flow easily when draining out and away from the rig. Useful tools for leveling are a carpenter's level or bubble level. Also available is the LevelMatePRO leveling device and phone app.



Because of the remote location, we will have a group cookout that night at our Airstreams to continue to get to know each other.

The next stop will be Davis Mountains State Park. Here we will explore hiking trails, Big Bend Museum at Sul Ross University (the map room is fantastic), lunch at the famous Reata Restaurant in Alpine and explore the beautiful murals painted on walls all over town. You can also go to Marfa and explore the art installations and we may be lucky to view the Marfa Lights. The Chihuahuan Desert Conservatory will show us flora and fauna of this magnificent desert that spans 193,783 square miles and is the largest in North America. One evening we will attend a Star Party at the McDonald Observatory. With the dark skies of this area, the observatory is in a perfect place.

We then push on to the jewel of the trip, Big Bend National Park. All 800,000 acres of this park are rich with a history of a 10,000-year-old archeological site and the Chisos Mountains. Hiking, biking, kayaking, heading to Mexico (bring your passports) for lunch in Boquillas, Mexico. The remote beauty of this national park is so special. I always say I come back with the Big Bend Glow.

Our final stop is back to civilization and the incomparable Maverick Ranch in Terlingua. As part of the Lajitas Golf Resort and Spa, you can see green grass! Not only that, you can play golf, kayak, take a float trip along the Rio Grande, zip line, and jeep rides and then spend the evening at the bar and restaurant. But wait, Terlingua also has the famous Starlight Theatre, where we will have dinner. The best pizza in Texas will be another evening at Long Draw Pizza. All this fun with Big Bend State Park and its 300,000 acres right next to us to enjoy. You have to take a road trip up Route 170 to see the rugged geology and view the Rio Grande River. There are also short hikes such as a slot canyon hike, hoodoo hike and many other options, including very long hikes and biking in the State Park. So join us as we ride into the Sunset off West Texas.


