### **Elly Brennan's Deviled Egg Recipe**

#### ••••••••••••••••••••••••

Looking for a delicious snack while exploring the Great Outdoors? Try Elly's deviled egg recipe for a bite that's both tasty and protein-packed.

- 1. Start with 1 dozen eggs hard boiled.
- 2. Cut eggs in half lengthwise, gently removing the yolk.
- 3. Lay out the whites of the eggs (24 of them) cut side up.
- 4. Place the yolks in a separate bowl and use a fork to mash them finely.
- 5. Add 1/2 cup of Duke's Mayonnaise to the egg yolks.
- 6. Add 1 teaspoon of Penzeys Fox Point seasoning mix to the egg/mayonnaise mixture until blended.
- 7. Put egg mixture in a large plastic bag, seal bag and cut a small tip off the bag.
- 8. Squeeze egg mixture out of the bag into the whites of the eggs.
- 9. Decorate with green onions, parsley or a sprinkle of paprika.
- 10. Serve and enjoy!

\*While camping I take the shortcut and purchase the precooked and peeled eggs.

\*A tip for easy peeling: Before cooking, gently tap the larger round end of the egg until you hear the sound change (usually 2-4 taps) then boil and cool as usual.

#### **TECH TIP** Submitted by Greg Worcester.



This may be a tech tip useful for older units with manual Zip Dee awnings. I found that the locking mechanisms on our main awning support bars would not lock consistently and were getting on my nerves. Instead of buying expensive new replacement parts, I drilled through the bars and used a small hitch pin to lock them together. The old supports work like a charm now. The job took about 15 minutes and cost only \$4.00 for the pins at Snyders RV, Virginia Beach.
