the store or a restaurant? A simple and free app, Vivino might help you.

Follow the steps below to use the <u>Vivino Wine Label Scanner app.</u>

Steps

Download and open the free Vivino app.

Click on the camera icon. Make sure to allow Vivino access to your camera in your phone settings.

Take a photo of any wine label. Pay close attention to the vintage year and wine type. If its not correct, just try to scan the bottle again. Or you can type in the name of the wine.

From there, you can view ratings and reviews from a community of millions. We typically go for a 4.0 or better.

You can also scan a wine list from a restaurant.

Rally Registrations


Grapes & Grains is working hard to offer its membership as many rallies as possible. Some of these rallies have bus transportation and catered meals. When this occurs a rally then has a defined number of participants since a bus can only hold so many people and the number of attendees at a catered meal has been set. All these elements factor into the rally fee. Therefore, if a rally specifies that an individual must call the campground directly to book a campsite, it is imperative that a rally registrant perform this action prior to completing the rally registration form. If you booked a campsite online instead of calling the campground directly, and then tried to register for the rally you may be liable for paying the campground cancellation fee and risk your ability to register and attend the rally. Please follow the instructions when registering for a rally.



Grapes & Grains uses a product

called Jotform as a rally registration tool which we integrate with PayPal to collect rally fees. We recommend that whenever an individual registers for a rally and pays the fee with PayPal they verify that the funds were taken out of their account. Secondly, you must click the Return to Merchant button after paying in order to complete the transaction in both PayPal and Jotform.

You are not considered registered for the rally until PayPal has successfully debited your account. Until you have validated that this has occurred and received an email from Jotform indicating you are registered, you should not consider yourself registered for the rally. Save the Jotform email response you receive as your confirmation of registration and refer to that email if you have any problems and need to reach out to the club to resolve registration issues.

Grapes & Grains Regional Ambassador

Grapes & Grains (G&G) is rolling out a new program called Regional Ambassadors. These regional ambassadors will come from all 12 regions and will be present at rallies on behalf of the Executive Board. Some regions are quite large and may require multiple ambassadors.

Purpose

The G&G Intra-club needs to communicate its purpose and events to the greater ACI at large through ambassadors in each of the ACI Regions. Ambassadors will communicate relevant information from the G&G Executive Board to the ACI Regions and provide feedback to the Board from the Regions. Ambassadors will be selected by the Executive Board.

Responsibilities

G&G Regional Ambassadors will serve a one-year term and be eligible for a two-year term if nominated and selected, beginning with the calendar year. If selected to the office mid-year, the Ambassador will serve the remainder of that year and the following full calendar year.

Each G&G Ambassador must:

Be a member in good standing in the Airstream Club International, a member of their local unit or a member at large within the Region he or she represents and a member of the G&G Intra-Club.

Attend Regional meetings and rallies and try to attend local club rallies.

Promote G&G activities, rallies and caravans occurring in the Region's geographical vicinity.

Encourage Regional G&G members to host G&G events and rallies in their area.

Assist with the process of communicating Rally ideas to the G&G Executive Board for evaluation and approval.

Provide G&G resources to prospective rally hosts.

Promote national G&G activities (such as the International Mega-Tasting event) to the Regions.

Communicate the spirit and intent of the G&G Intra-Club.

Promote membership in the intra-club and know how to and understand the process of joining the G&G Intra-Club through the ACI website.

Provide written communications of all regional meeting activities related to G&G to the Executive Board.

Ambassadors may optionally host G&G tasting events at Regional rallies as an example of the activities hosted by G&G.

Assist in scouting and selection of future Regional Ambassadors.

An announcement will be coming out soon via email seeking volunteers to join our Regional Ambassador program. Thanks in advance for volunteering and we look forward to working with you.

Implementation of Annual Dues

Beginning January 1, 2024 Grapes & Grains will be assessing its members an annual due of \$10. These monies will be used to support rally hosts in securing campsites, venues, catering, transportation etc. during the planning phase of a rally or caravan. Annual dues will be collected on your WBCCI anniversary month. For example, if you joined WBCCI in June of 2017, every May you receive a notice that your annual dues are coming up next month. When you renew your WBCCI membership you also pay all your individual club dues at that time. This is when you will pay the annual \$10 dues for Grapes & Grains.
