
### President's Messages

New info shown in green. Dates are arrival and departure, although you can often request early arrival or Monday departure. Sign-ups are accomplished by submitting a completed Registration Jotform and payment to the Club Registrar. If a rally is full, there is a wait list. "Buddy" events allow you to invite a non-member even if they don't own an Airstream. Events lacking hosts or the minimum number of campers may be be cancelled.

### NorCalers Attend Region 12 Rally in Pismo Beach

The Region 12 Rally in 2023 was held at the Pismo Coast Village RV Resort October 25 - 29. Several NorCalers attended, many who had never been to a NorCal Rally. The event was super fun, in part because it was held during the time the Resort celebrates Halloween by reserving a whole area for Rvers who seriously and extravagantly decorate their RV and site during at least one week before Halloween. At night, it was like walking through Disneyland, with lights and animatronics. The rally planners also had intriguing events such as a roving "happy hour" hosted at 10 different trailers by their owners, with a small subsidy from the club. You could visit as many trailers as you wanted. Each did something different, and most hosts and hostesses dressed up for the occasion in Halloween gear. There was also a Region trailer decorating contest that I did not win despite the fact my spiders were helping to eliminate the overpopulation of flamingos, along with a pets and people costume contest.

The food offerings at the rally were pretty good too: a catered taco night with several choices, a burrito breakfast, another breakfast featuring cinnamon buns



from the Old West Cinnamon Bun Company, and on the last night, a wonderful chicken and brisket dinner cooked by caterer Mario, along with a libation of your choice. The clubhouse and outside patio area with fire pits were fully available during the rally and were very pleasant to sit around in the mornings and evenings. The rest of the time, you could just enjoy the area.

A highlight of the event was the silent auction to raise money for two local charities vetted by the rally committee. Baskets were donated to the auction by every Club in the Region except for NorCal for some reason. In any event, when the dust had settled, the Region raised over \$5,000 for two deserving charities vetted by the planning committee. Doug Fitzgerald won a basket donated by the Sierra Club, while yours truly was the high bidder on a flamingo quilt donated by First Lady LaVerne McHenry after she won it at the Potlatch Rally in Olympia, Washington, earlier this year.

Next year's region rally will be held in Bishop next September 11-15, off Highway 395. This area is close to wonderful sightseeing and many points of interest.

Over 30 Airstreams docked at the Pismo Coast Village RV Resort for the Pirate Palooza Ralty last November, one week after the Region 12 Rally celebrated Halloween there. The hosts were initially thrown for a loop when they learned they were marooned with no indoor rally facility. However, they quickly regrouped and prevented a total shipwreck by creating a small gathering area between two trailers, then decorating the area with skull lights and lanterns under a billowing pirate flag. Fortunately the weather cooperated.

As vessels came into camp, they were met by the Welcoming Crew of Tary Salinger and Ed Ungerman and given goodie bags featuring Janie Salinger's Pirate Booty, a flamingo coin purse containing a large chocolate gold doubloon, and a list of pirate phrases and words. Blimey! Wednesday evening, the hosts proffered hot grog and cider to thirsty pirates who then feasted on proffered appetizers in the outdoor quarters. Turned out to be quite fun and festive, if not a bit cramped, and many said they liked the grog and cider party better than a meal on Wednesday evening. Friday night, the majority of mateys headed up the road to the Oceano Melodrama to see Trudy and the Beast, a take-off on Beauty and the Beast. Thursday night, the grog and cider party continued with fresh appetizers. Our mateys enjoyed the time ashore, turning the happy "hour" into an evening-long event for many. Unfortunately, earlier in the day, the Ungermans were informed that Elisa's mom was sent to the Emergency Room, so they had to leave the rally and the execution of the

Saturday night was the headliner event in the clubhouse: a sit down, fully plated and served dinner of brisket and chicken with several sides, salad and dessert. After dinner, a BRN raffle was held, with various pirate-themed blankets as prizes for the upcoming cold weather. One was given to Matteo since it was his birthday. Other prizes (silicon skull ice cube molds) were given out too. Thank-you gifts were given to our caterer, Mario, (owner of the Rock and Roll Diner in Oceano and the Pismo Café at the RV Park) who secured our use of the clubhouse on Saturday night and saved our hineys. (If you are in the area – please support his businesses; his food is very good!) By the end of the evening, all the "smuggled" alcohol was gone along with most of the doubloons, the sign of a good evening among pirates. The next day, the pirates battened down their hatches and sailed off to new ports of call, say the Black Oak Casino in Tuolumne.


### Airstream Club Renewal

That was followed by a tournament of the dice game "5,000" and several attendees won prizes.








