in Flint Michigan. This year's Region 4 Community Service Rally assists the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan, located in Flint. This is a very impressive facility with the capacity to have up to 100 volunteers working at a time! Details: Food Bank of Eastern Michigan (FBEM.org) 1939 Howard Ave., Flint, MI 48503. There will be volunteer opportunities on Thursday May 29th and Friday May 30th from 9:00-Noon and 1:00-4:00 (You are free to work as many or few shifts as you like, taking a break during a shift as you may need.) Campground: Groveland Oaks County Park Campground, 14555 Dixie Highway, Holly, MI 48442. This campground is about 20 minutes from the Food Bank. A covered pavilion and a couple firepits are at each group site. Fill up with water when you get to the campground and empty your tanks. 30 Amp power, only, provided for each rig. Rally fee of \$100/rig gets you your site from Wednesday-Tuesday and lunch, at the Food Bank, if you decide to work both the morning and afternoon shifts. AOAC June Rally at Sauder Village, Archbold, Ohio (22611 State Rt 2, 43502) June 11th – 14th (Tuesday - Friday) hosted by the Wilch's. We have 15 sites reserved for the Akron Ohio Airstream Club and once we commit to 10 or more, our cost/night drops from \$46 to \$44. Reservations can be made by calling this number directly: 800.590.9755. On site, the Sauder Village experience will take us on a walk through time from 1803 (Ohio becomes a state) through the 1920s while visiting Natives & Newcomers, Pioneer Settlement, and the 1920s Main Street. As of the release of this newsletter, we have 5 sites already reserved so please register sooner than later—and follow up with a RSVP email to me or use the "Register Now" on the website (don't worry about the \$25 fee—we'll determine/collect the rally fee at

the campground).

 Location: The rally is often held in a picturesque setting, such as a national park, beachside campground, or a lush green field, providing




