Maintenance Minute

Maintaining all of your water tanks is critical for successful outings and to keep your rig in tip top shape. A couple things we need to keep in mind.

You should sanitize your fresh water tank at least once per year (more frequently if you are a regular camper). The process is relatively simple and will sanitize not just the fresh water tank, but also the pipes and fixtures. Here is the process:

Mix 3.9 oz bleach to a full tank of water ($0.13 \times total gallons of fresh H2O$ <u>capacity = onces of household bleach</u>). Run each of the faucets (including the shower head) until you can smell bleach. If you have a water filtration system, check the Owner's Manual before running the bleached water through it. Let the water stand in the system 3-4 hours, or double the formula for a one-hour standing time. Drain fresh tank and refill with clean water. I like to run some bleach water into my gray water tanks just to clean it up as well. However, avoid bleach in your black tank. You want a certain level of bacteria build up in the black tank to break down waste and the bleach will kill them.

Speaking of the black tank, we have been using the Unique RV Digest-It Drop-In pods for about a year now. They seem to work really well as we have had no smells or build up (that we know of) in our black tanks. These pods are supposed to clean your sensors to keep them in working order. As often as possible, we also make sure to run the spray nozzles in the black tank whenever we dump it.
