Maintenance Minute

We recently did a faucet change in our 2019 International. The original Grohe facet was always falling out of the base on the road and splashed all over the counter when it was used. Our choice of replacement was a Kohler brushed nickel faucet we actually got at Costco for about half of what it cost at Home Depot.

Now for the maintenance part. When Doug was replacing the faucet he noticed that the cold water shut valve under the sink was rubbing against the sink drain plumbing. There was a black residue on the top shelf that was the result of rubbing was actually eating into the pipe. We wrapped the pipe with duct tape and used a furniture pad to keep the valve from any future rubbing. It is worth inspecting your plumbing to see if you have anything similar going on under your sink.
