Members will also be able to book courtesy parking on the website. An announcement was made in the online November Blue Beret. Courtesy Parking hosts may have already received an email describing the new program. It isn't up and running yet but in time for summer travel.

Under Executive Council reports:

Margaret Saylor, R2, was introduced as the new International Publication Chair following in the footsteps of Hedda Smithson.

John Becker read the ACI Political Policy and reminding members that all ACI functions should be politics free.

Jenny Schnettler, reported that outside funds were being raised to pay the cost of the feasibility study for the proposed RV park at Jackson Center. (All funds have now been raised and that study will proceed. The IBT will be looking for an update at the February IBT).

Lori Plummer presented her Corporate Manager's Report. As of November 13, 2023 there were 9,415 memberships (17,324 memberships).

Training of new employee, Justina, is almost complete. She is fitting in very well.

There has been an increase in "offensive, belligerent behavior towards staff members".


- New postcards are available for use by Clubs/Members for outreach.

- The following motions were approved:
 - Motion #2023-49 House keeping motion to remove all references to Delegates/meeting during Internation Rally.
 - Motion #2023-51 Region elections house keeping motion.
 - Motion #2023-46 Motion to allow Past Region 8 President Sisk to have a 200 series # assigned.
 - Motion 2023-47 Clarifies time a Region President is allowed to choose a 200 series number.
 - Motion 2023-48 Low Country Airstream Club Permanent Charter
 - Motion 2023-52 The title of the corporate manager of WBCCI shall be established as Executive Director.

We have 45 sites set aside for the rally, and 16 are currently reserved. All are pull-through sites with full hookups in one area of the campground. You can call and reserve a campsite anytime (do not reserve online). The sites are being held until 2 months before the rally. 2023 costs are ~\$70 per night. There is a weekly rate plus they offer Good Sam, AAA, Military/Veteran, First Responder/Nurse discounts.



When you call to reserve a site, let them know you are with the Region 7 Airstream Rally.

To attend the rally, you will need to do two (2) things:

1. Call Elkhorn Ridge RV Resort and reserve a campsite.
2. Register and pay the rally fees using the Rally Registration form that will be forthcoming. I hope to have it available in the March/April timeframe.

We are very actively working on the planning for the rally. Here's a list of the planned activities:

- Four Buffalo Feeding Tours (limited to 9 people each tour)
- Coffee every morning
- Happy Hours and Campfires most evenings
- A Potluck Dinner
- Ride the 1880 Train (Hill City to Keystone). Round trip with 3-hour layover in Keystone
