

Jen Dice's FLORIDA IN THE WINTER - Part One of a Series

Our 2023 ended and 2024 started in Santa Rosa Beach, Florida while attending both Pre-Canopener and Canopener. I loved staying in one spot for a bit and exploring the area. Topsail HIII Preserve State Park is a beautiful location off 30A which provided me with a lot of opportunity to walk, play, and



bike with Jade while getting my fill of tuna dip. I was so thrilled to finally attend Canopener after hearing so many great things about it. During those two weeks, I reconnected with old friends and made some new ones. If you are interested in going, I highly recommend you download Wandering Labs (www.wanderinglabs.com) and be ready to jump on last minute cancellations in the last couple weeks prior to the rally. The Rally also has a very active Facebook site where those releasing reservations give others a heads up before doing so. Reservations for 2025 may be even harder to obtain given the change to Florida State Parks which allows Floridians to book sites a full month before residents of other states.

We left Santa Rosa Beach and headed a few hours south to

Dunnellon, Florida for a short stay at Rainbow Springs State Park, but not before making the crazy choice to stop into a Trader Joe's in Gainesville. The parking lot here is very big and usually not busy, so we anticipated being able to easily park and do some grocery shopping at one of our favorite places. What we didn't anticipate was the start of the school year for the University of Florida the next day and a very very congested parking lot. Dan and our travel partner, Jennifer Olsem, navigated the chaos like pros, found parking, and she and I popped in quickly to pick up food.

Rainbow Springs State Park is another beautiful Florida State Park with level sites, and lots of privacy between each site. This park is very small, but had some great trails and a put-in for kayaks, canoes, and SUPs directly into the sapphire blue waters of Rainbow Spring.

While there, we took a day trip over to Crystal River, which is only about 25 minutes away. The weather had been overcast all day with off and on rain. We explored the Crystal River National Wildlife Reserve, an

80-acre refuge established in 1983 to protect the West Indian manatee. The refuge also preserves the Three Sisters Springs,



the last unspoiled and undeveloped spring habitat in Kings Bay. The preserve has several volunteers around to answer questions, provide helpful information, and educate the public on manatee etiquette.



The water is astonishing shades of blue and turquoise and filled with manatees.

From there we headed over to Paddles Outdoor Rentals to join a paddling tour in clear kayaks to see the manatees. There was no shortage of laughs as Jennifer and I tried to get into the kayaks without falling into

the spring and Dan shouting encouragement from afar while taking photos just in case we did! Our guide provided a great tour of the small islands, including a house that had been taken over by pelicans, how to tell the adolescent pelican vs. a mature one, and took us into little coves to see manatees



regularly. We ended up floating in the waters of the Preserve I previously described and we

got up close with several of the manatees. They are naturally inquisitive creatures and will surprise you by silently cruising up to the kayak and sticking their face out of the water. Our tour guide emphasized that manatees don't have any natural predators, living up to 60 years old or more, and are generally injured by boat motors. While out, we dodged a few more rain clouds and initiated an off and on game of competitive rowing to see who could outrun the drops. I would love to go back to this location sometime and snorkel with the manatees. They are so chill and relaxing to watch. Fun fact: they can regulate their buoyancy by passing gas...


As mentioned, we were experiencing some chilly and rainy weather with some dangerous winds headed our way the next day so we got out of Dunnellon early and headed to Naples,

The North Texas Airstream Club was represented well at the third annual "Streamin' on the Strand Airstream Rally" during the first weekend of historic Mardi Gras! Galveston February 1st-4th (next year it will be held February 20-23rd).

Streamin' on the Strand became an ACI National Event Rally last year and plans are for this to keep going until no Airstreamers sign up! Not likely to happen because this event is a blast. It begins with the most amazing parking feat of getting 45 or 50 Airstreams parked on Mechanic St, parallel to the curb, nose to tail, in 2–3 hours over four city blocks.



This year everyone was parked by around 8:30. YAGA, the city event organizer, provided a free happy hour from 8-10. Then everyone headed to the hospitality tent for pizza & beverages.

The real fun begins on Friday with coffee, mimosas, and King Cake in the morning. The city opening of Mardi Gras! doesn't begin until 5:00 PM, leaving plenty of time to walk down the Strand and look in all the cool stores, walk down to the seawall and beach, or have a really good lunch at one of the city's great restaurants. We gathered at the hospitality tent again on Friday evening for a Whiskey Bourbon tasting and snacks between the parades. For the second year (and now I guess this is a "grandfathered" event) Nancy Henderson of the Texas Plains Unit organized a Flamingo entry to the famous event Umbrella Parade. A lot of us have attended many parades in our lives, but this time you get to be part of the parade! If you doubt the fun of it, just talk to our new member Stacey Daniel who rocked it! Saturday began with the Jolly Jester 5K walk/run; this year we only had one in the race, Cathy McDonald of the Heart of Texas

Camping Unit, but she had plenty of us to cheer her on. The parades were slated to begin at 11 but were pushed back a bit because of rain overnight. Some of us sat in our chairs and enjoyed being showered with beads, and others stood in their doorways playing "catch the beads" with the floats as they went by. In the event you had too many beads, you could always hand them back out to the High School marching bands that came through regularly in the parades. Recycling beads is one way the high schools generate funds, so it was wonderful to receive and give back! The last parade is generally through by 10 PM, but then you can walk one block over to the Strand for all of the concerts.



February 2024: Caravans and Rallies

I was trying to come up with a subject for this month's primer and two things popped into my head providing inspiration: the name of the club and the big shipping container that travels to the International Rally every year. Kinda random thoughts, I know, but who knows what makes the proverbial light bulb over the head light up?

Let's start with WBCCI, or Wally Byam Caravan Club International. Now focus on that word caravan. How does this idea of caravaning fit in with the Airstream Club? My trusty Merriam—Webster's app defines a caravan as "a company of travelers on a journey through desert or hostile territory." A rather uncomfortable thought. But one of Wally Byam's driving ideas behind the Airstream was to travel with all the comforts of home. So I see the Airstream as taming this historical idea of the caravan as a trial of survival. Although his early caravans faced many setbacks and hardships, I think he ultimately succeeded masterfully at upending the rugged connotation of a caravan. Now we can caravan in fun and fellowship—across deserts and more—and not worry so much about hostility.

And, of course, Wally being a marketing man, the caravans were an adventurous way to promote his brand. As his cousin, Dale "PeeWee" Schwamborn, <u>put it</u>, "Airstream, like any other manufacturing company, was created to make a product. For the owner and entrepreneur, Wally Byam, to fulfill his goals in life and to make a living.

The first Caravan in 1951 was conceived to assist Airstream owners and others (the first few Caravans were open to all manufactured RV's), to travel as an American Community. Airstream's reward was publicity to sell Airstreams."

On to the second inspiration—the club's shipping container. On the side is painted a very large slogan—We Rally. Ol' Webster's definition 2 of the noun form says a rally is "a mass meeting intended to arouse group enthusiasm." This is fairly close. In the Airstreaming context, though, I think group enthusiasm is a precondition. We know we'll be meeting up to have some fun so we're already enthusiastic. Rallying repeats caravaning's themes of fun and fellowship, but unlike caravans, which move, we rally in place at a predetermined location.

Caravans and rallies suit different kinds of travelers and personalities. Many have a preference for one over the other. You'll never know for yourself which you prefer until you try both.
