

Mardi Gras! Galveston - 2024 A WBCCI/ACI National Event Rally

The beads, the parades, the people – all a very exciting backdrop to 45

Airstreams! Once again, the annual Streamin' on the Strand National Event Rally sponsored by Region 9 was at Mardi Gras! Galveston on February 1 -4, 2024. This Rally takes place along the parade route with Airstreams bumper to hitch on either side of Mechanic Street in the Historic Strand District on Galveston Island. Now in its 3rd year, all agree each year has gotten successively better and this was clearly the best one yet!



Thursday afternoon, the first week of Mardi Gras! Galveston, the Airstreams begin to cross over channel at Galveston Bay onto the island and make their way to the staging area at Santa Fe Place. The volunteer



staging crew greets each rig with a goody bag and lines them

up in preparation for parking as soon as the streets are cleared and ready. The volunteer parking crew adorned in high vis-vests & orange hats with "RAT" (Rally Arrival Team) on the front are dispersed on the street and each Rig is led into the parking areas by a volunteer on a golf cart. In a matter of minutes, the rig is taken to its spot where the RAT Crew helps guide them in and level them out so the tow vehicle can be taken to an offsite parking lot and the next rig follows suit until all are parked. In 2024 we did this in record time, around 4-1/2 hours and all 45 were in place and ready to "laissez les bons temps rouler!"

By the time everyone is parked and settled, they've

worked up an appetite for a little Mardi Gras flavor so we get started with a Happy Hour at Tsunami's hosted by YAGA



Entertainment, the event developer. Afterwards we had an after party at the Hospitality Tent featuring pizza and wine. Lots of folks began decorating their rigs in classic Mardi Gras themes before they called it a night. By Friday, Airstreams are decorated, participants have gotten familiar with the entertainment district and are ready for some Mardi Gras action Galvestonstyle! The wheels and tires on your Airstream travel trailer are the key features that let you travel with the comforts of home. Proper tire and wheel care helps ensure your adventures go off without a hitch.

Jech Tip

Regular maintenance and inspection of your wheels and tires is an essential practice for all Airstream owners. One of the most important of these regular maintenance habits is to tighten the lug nuts on your Airstream's wheels.


By design, a travel trailer's wheels carry much higher loads per wheel than the wheels on a passenger vehicle or truck. Each wheel can easily end up supporting over 1,000 pounds each (check your owner's manual for specifics). And because the travel trailer's wheels are fixed and don't steer, they are subjected to very high stress as you navigate around a turn. Navigating through slow, tight turns puts especially high stress on the wheels, subjecting them to very high side loads.

For Airstream travel trailers with aluminum wheels, set your torque wrench to 110 pound-feet. If you have an older Airstream with steel wheels, set your torque wrench to 100 pound-feet.

This procedure is essential every time you replace a wheel (such as when you change a flat tire or put new tires on your travel trailer). Airstream recommends torquing lug nuts at 10, 25, and 50 miles after a wheel replacement.

It is also recommended that you torque your Airstream travel trailer's lug nuts before every trip.

Lug Nut Torque Pattern



NOTE: Use a torque wrench to tighten lug nuts. Tightening by hand or with an impact wrench is not recommended.

Itinerary:

- Sun. March 3: First night at Caverns of Sonora, Sonora, TX. 14 electric and water sites.
- Mon. March 4: Travel to Roadrunner Traveler RV Park, Study Butte, TX (290 miles). Due to being Spring Break in this part of the country, here is the best I can do 7 sites with full hookups (\$55/night), 7 sites with electricity only (\$45/night). However, the WiFi is reported to be good. There are no showers or restroom facilities here, but there is a dump station, if needed.
- Fri. March 8: Travel to Davis Mountain RV Park, Ft. Davis, TX (105 miles). 14 full hookup sites. WiFi is reported to be good.
- Mon. March 11: Travel to Canyons RV Park, Sanderson, TX (115 miles). 14 full hookup sites, however, they do not take reservations, so it is first come first serve. They told me they usually have 12-14 sites open every night, but they cannot guarantee it. They also have some tent camping so if you want to classify your Airstream as a tent, there may be extra room to boondock for a night. WiFI is reported to be good.
- Tues. March 12: Travel to Westbound RV Park, D'hanis, TX (280 miles and, yes, we are heading home). 14 full hookup sites. WiFi is reported to be good.
- Wed. March 13: You are on your own. Feel free to head home or wherever you want to wander.



The Mother Lode of the Mother Road - Route 66 Caravan is a bucket list trip for anyone who grew up taking car trips, packing lunches for picnics along the road, visiting

kitschy roadside attractions, and asking, "are we there yet".

Although no longer an officially sanctioned highway, about 85% of the original route, which started in Chicago, and ended in Los Angeles, is still drivable.

Our caravan begins in the Chicago area (Joliet) and ends in Los Angeles. For 59 days, we will travel as much of the original road as feasible, visit prominent towns rich with Rt 66 history, and check out as many off the iconic Rt 66 landmarks as we can fit in!
