Some of our Club members are considering upgrading their house batteries to Lithium . . . doing so has many advantages, primarily the doubling of the amperage capacity given that AGM batteries should not be drawn down to below 50%--whereas lithium batteries have no such limit. Lithium batteries are also about half the weight and can be mounted upright, on their sides, etc. When upgrading our rig, I did NOT opt for the ultraexpensive Battleborn brand and went with a pair Weize LiFePO4's that now cost less: \$280 each. They have the Built-in Smart BMS, Low Temp protection and a 4.5/5 star rating on Amazon. Because Lithium batteries require a higher charging voltage, I had to upgrade our unit's converter (newer Airstreams come with a switchable converter that increases the charging voltage.) I reached out to "Randy" at Bestconverter.com for advice to replace my WFCO converter and he recommended the WildKat PD4655L/MBA as it's American made and has a 2-year warranty. The cost was about \$280 and it was an easy plug-n-play installation. Next, I went with the <u>Victron Energy 500 amp SmartShunt</u> that has a Bluetooth connection to my phone and displays the batteries' state of charge and acts like a fuel gauge. Cost: about \$120 on Amazon. Last, since our coach does NOT have the solar package, I opted for two <u>Baldr</u> 120W Portable Solar Panel (suitcase style) with 20' of cabling so I can park in the shade yet set up my solar panels in the sun. They run about \$160 each (on Amazon) and you'll also need the <u>Victron SmartSolar MPPT solar charge controller</u> (w/ Bluetooth) . . . cost: \$90. This unit maximizes the energy harvest from your panels as your lithium batteries are charged. Add in the costs for

connectors/cabling of about \$50 and your grand total to "convert" \$ 560.00 converter \$ 280.00 totals roughly \$1340.
