For me April means one thing. Some of you may think of moving the clocks forward, as in spring ahead. For me the truck and trailer come out of winter storage.


In March we had our Mid-Winter IBT Strategy meeting in Jackson Center.

In March I sent out a News Flash about the June election. Below is a map of the members in North America. As you can see, there is a very high density of members in Region 2. As I pointed out in the News Flash, only 311 people out of 965 from Region 2 voted in the last election. Region 2 has 13 clubs so that means on average 24 members from each club voted. Jackson Center will have a Campfire meeting where the topic for the vote will be centerstage as well as sending out multiple emails on the topic. To make sure people without email access are notified, I will be contacting the local Club Presidents, and a snail mail notification will be sent to members without an email address. Jackson Center will send out a paper ballot if one is requested.

How to Find, Sign Up and Pay for an ACI Event Online

- Log on to https://airstreamclub.org/
- Click on the EVENTS tab
- A map of the US will be displayed containing pins for all the events for all the Airstream clubs. Just above the map on the right side of the screen is the Clubs box. Click on the down arrow to display the list of clubs then scroll down to Watchung NJ Club. Clicking on this will cause the map to display only Watchung club events.
- Find the event you wish to sign up for and click on the associated pin.
- A text box giving a brief description of the event will be displayed. Click on the arrow in the orange box that says More.
- A new page will be displayed. If a registration form has been created for the event this page will give you two options: online registration or mailin registration using a download of the form. The online form allows payment via PayPal. If you prefer to pay via check download and print the form, which includes payment instructions. If there is no registration form available yet one will be at a later date.

Spring Trip West

Sitting around bored in February we decided to change things up by taking a road trip to visit old friends in Oregon and Washington. We left March 25th and we are still on the road. Here are some first impressions and photos.

First takes:

- The sky in Kansas is crisscrossed by dozens of contrails all day long. The sky in northern Montana is empty all day long save for clouds.
- Tens of thousands of acres for miles and miles in Kansas along I-70 were burning or burned when we passed through. We wondered why. Wikipedia says some prairie fires in this area are deliberate to encourage new growth.
- There's a fixation in the Midwest on "world's largest" attractions: windchime (Illinois), ball of twine (Kansas), buffalo (statue; North Dakota); basket (Ohio); easel painting (Kansas). The list could go on.
- Grain elevators are the skyscrapers of the Midwest.
- Vast wind farms stretch from one horizon to the other in the Great Plains. Each blade is about 150 feet long; the trucks that haul them are really cool (it's a guy thing).
- We've seen a lot of very large, very interesting farming equipment we've never seen before. Some of them take up almost two lanes and look like real-life Transformers. We have no idea what any of them do.
- AT&T mobile service does not know what time it is. Four of the eight Kansas counties that border Colorado are on Mountain time, four are on Central. As soon as we hit the eastern border of the county we were staying in the truck clock switched to Mountain time. Our AT&T cell phones did not. When we got to the campground we asked the owner what time zone we were in. "Mountain", she said. We mentioned our phones still showed Central. "Do you have AT&T?" she asked, "because they don't switch to Mountain until you cross the Colorado border." Thirty miles into Colorado the phones switched to Mountain. Same time zone mobile phone issue crossing from Montana to North Dakota. What does Ford know that AT&T doesn't?
- Lowest overnight temperature: 22°F City of Rocks National Preserve, Almo, Idaho. We kept warm with our electric heater. The furnace came on once or twice between 4 and 5 am.
- Favorite campsites to date. We prefer remote, scenic spots and are happy to go without full hookups to get them. Cheyenne Mountain State Park, Colorado Springs (full hookups!); Smoky Mountain, (Idaho state park co-managed with National Park Service), City of Rocks, Almo, Idaho (water and electric at the campsite but water was turned off due to the temperature); Sully Creek State Park, Medora, North Dakota. (electric only, watering station); Hells Gate State Park, Lewiston, Idaho (water/electric; fabulous in-park hiking along and way above the Snake River).
- Montana State Parks and National Parks have no hookups, just the campsite (at least the ones
 we investigated). We only stayed in campgrounds with electricity to run our heater; our AGM
 batteries can't keep the furnace going all night long. We are considering converting to lithium.






Alumalina is now open for signups

The 18th edition of Alumalina will be held October 24-27, 2024 at Camping World Rally Park, Marion, NC. Alumalina (aluminum + Carolina) is a non-sanctioned Airstream-only rally. Last year's rally attracted about 270 rigs from across the US and Canada. The rally features food, fellowship, seminars, a craft fair, flea market, beer swap, bourbon trail, and wine tasting as well as walking, biking hiking, paddling, picnicking, campfires and miles of aluminum. The rally park has over 300 full-hookup sites. The camping fee (paid separately on arrival to Camping World) is \$35 per night. Most attendees come early and stay late. The rally fee, also payable on arrival, is \$65 per person. Last year that included three dinners and three donut and coffee breakfasts. Who wants to start off 2024 with a great Region 2 Rally event?

The Region 2 team has been working hard to organize this event. Now we need you to sign up! Registration is now open!

The Centre County Grange Encampment & Fair better known as 'The Grange Fair' is the location for the 2024 Region 2 rally. The area is best known as the home of Penn State University. From beautiful waterfalls to historic buildings to caverns to museums, they are all in Centre County to explore!

Bald Eagle State Park is one of the most-visited state parks in the area. With 1,730 acres and Sayers Lake you have plenty to explore on a walk.

If you are into trains, there is the abandoned Coburn Railroad Tunnel. The abandoned Coburn railroad tunnel was constructed as part of the Lewisburg, Centre and Spruce Creek Railroad in the 1870s, and was in service nearly 100 years until it was officially abandoned by the Penn Central Railroad in 1970.

Penn's Cave in Centre County offers the only cavern tour in the United States that is conducted completely by boat. Woodward Cave contains 5 large rooms, hundreds of yards of tunnels and passageways and the largest stalagmite in Pennsylvania!

We are working hard to ensure that this will be a memorable Rally. Registration and Payment is now available on the Region 2 ACI website entitled 2024 Region 2 Rally or you can use the link below:

We have 100 sites available with water and electric, no pump outs are provided. Dump stations are on the fairgrounds. Our trailer rate is \$47 per night + kitty for food \$65.00/PP. The kitty covers 1 hot breakfast, 1 hot buffet meal and 1 continental breakfast. On Saturday night we have a spectacular band scheduled to play. The Rally is from May 2nd to May 5th, but the 'core' will be from Friday May 2nd to Sunday May 4th.
