Dispersed camping By Doug White

Being relatively new to Airstreaming, Linda and I would like to identify a few campsites we have experienced that are basic and somewhat local (using a Nevada standard of measure) while enjoyable. We prefer National Forests Service-designated dispersed campgrounds that balance basic needs: relaxation, nature, wildlife activities like hiking and fishing, and, usually, surprisingly good neighbors. One thing to note within Nevada is to have a senior pass for camping in state parks that offers free camping unless you have electric hookups at the site; then, it is \$10 a night, a great deal. Nevada has implemented their new campsite reservation system, which has become a bit complicated, but that should be another article. Here is our list:

Dispersed camping By Doug White

Fletcher's Campground at Mount Charleston

National Forest Service operated with full hookups. It is a small campground with 11 sites; some are reserved, and others on a first-come, first-serve basis. Some forty minutes from Las Vegas, it has high altitude, cool temperatures, and hiking trails. It is a great getaway any month other than summer when site availability can be challenging.

McWilliams Campground at Mount Charleston

If Fletchers is full, McWilliams has 75 designated dispersed sites available. Again, it is a short drive from home.

Arch Rock at Valley of Fire

Designated dispersed camping in the park among the vast rock formations. Water is available at the campground and vaulted toilets. Lots of sightseeing, hiking, and wildlife available, and a lot quieter and more relaxing than Atlatl

Echo Canyon Reservoir State Park

It is our first state park visit, and we still plan to spend a few days or a week there, enjoying the quiet and some limited hiking. Three hours from Las Vegas, full hookups are placed above the reservoir and designated to be dispersed on the other side of the reservoir. There is lots of wildlife and fishing for trout and smallmouth bass.

Cathedral Gorge State Park

Three hours north on Route 93, this park has full hookup sites and plenty of hiking. It's not our favorite park, but we made a mandatory stay to experience it.

Kershaw Ryan State Park

Located in Caliente, Nevada, this is a small campsite with 16 sites, some with full hookups. Above the campground is a beautiful scenic canyon with flora, fauna, and hiking.

Ward Mountain Campground

In Ruth, Nevada, about four hours north toward Ely, this is a National Forest-designated dispersed campground where some sites are reservable and others on a first come, first served basis. At 7400 ft elevation, it's cool within a pine forest. You have water available, but not at your site, reasonably good privacy, incredible star gazing at night, and some hiking.

Thomas Canyon Campground

It is a good six-hour trip in Lamoille Canyon just south of Elko, Nevada, but if you haven't been, it's a great outing. You can reserve a National Forest Service reservation for the limited number of sites that accommodate rigs over 20 feet. At nearly 7,500 feet elevation, we stayed here in August for a week and enjoyed the chilly nights, dark skies, beautiful scenery of the canyon, and cliff divers. Above the park, fishing is done in the multiple beaver dams, and there is a hike-in high altitude lake, which has really small trout but is fun.

Valley of Fire Rally By Suzy Mellington

Las Vegas Airstream Club's Valentine's Rally was held at the majestic Valley of Fire State Park from February 1 to 4, 2004. Located about an hour north of Las Vegas, this park is known for its 46,000 acres of bright red Aztec sandstone, which contains ancient petrified trees and petroglyphs dating back more than 2,000 years.

Steve and Suzy Mellington hosted the rally, and the rally participants were welcomed with rain, wind, and sightings of Bighorn Sheep! Fortunately for us, the weather began cooperating on Friday, and we were able to enjoy the beautiful park and catch up with our friends old and new.

Now, the fantastic bit about this rally, besides the gorgeous surrounding area and the attendees, was the fabulous food and spirits! We are talking about Dutch Oven masterpieces and Whiskey Tasting!

A big thank you to Dale Musser, Diane Hancock, Max Stering, and Linda White for their amazing Dutch Oven meals and desserts. They made sure to keep the masses well-fed!

It was a wonderful rally, and we were so happy to host all of these Happy Glampers at Vally of Fire State Park.
