Hosts now know how many to prepare for, event planners are better prepared, and it's more efficient. No more having to collect dues during the rallies!



### Nuts & Bolts by Eric Graham (BRN 05097)

Palmetto State's signature boondocking rally is "Silver in the City" and is just around the corner, and many of us may be dusting off the furniture and giving your shiny aluminum-on-wheels a well-deserved bath.

Right now, it is time to do your post-winter maintenance and enjoy an exciting camping season this year. As you are checking over your Airstream don't forget to give some love to your



batteries because they will be at center stage at our next rally. Boondocking is a test of comfort + resourcefulness = enjoyment, and it all hinges on your batteries.

If you have wet (flooded) batteries, be sure they have a full charge and then top them off with distilled water. Make sure to test your batteries before the rally so you do not run into surprises.

Run a few high-current systems such as the water pump or tongue jack. If it is struggling or slowing down after a few minutes you may need to have your batteries tested further. Next test their longevity

by running fans and lights for an hour to determine if they begin to slow or dim. This simple test will help you determine if your batteries are holding a long-term charge.

Be sure you don't discharge below 50%, and recharge when you're finished. If you are questioning your batteries' longevity or if they are over four years old, take them to an auto part store and have them tested. They will test the cells of each battery and determine if the batteries are near the end of their life.

Take some time while you are checking out your Airstream to make sure you are ready to enjoy a great weekend off-the-grid.

April 11<sup>th</sup> thru 14<sup>th</sup> YORK, SC SOME GOOD THINGS TO KNOW

Welcome to Silver in the City, a "Wake Up Downtown" Airstream Rally hosted by members of the Palmetto State Airstream Club and the City of **York, SC**, population 9,300. We are very glad to have you joining us for this 7<sup>th</sup> annual unique and fun event.

We will be parking along the curb on both sides of Congress Street (our main street) and also in 2 parking lots located on Congress. It will not be necessary to unhook at either location unless you want to. Everything York has to offer is within easy walking from where you are parked: Shopping, restaurants, watering holes, and churches, all surrounded by our very large and beautiful **Historic District.** 

Congress Street downtown will be closed to vehicular traffic from 9am Friday to 12 noon on Sunday, yet we will have an exit plan should an emergency arise for those parked at either location.

This is a 3-day boundocking rally, so please arrive with empty black and grey tanks, a full fresh-water tank, and full propane. We will have a dump station available Sunday morning. Quiet generators are welcome, please be considerate of your neighbors when in use.

The festivities begin on **Thursday** at the York Place Campus, **234 Kings Mountain Street**, 3 blocks from downtown. The entrance will be marked. We gather here, parked on level grass but with no facilities, and we will provide a complimentary light supper. A \$\$ coffee/pastry bar will be available starting around 7am Friday. **Friday morning at 9am** sharp we parade into town, escorted by the York Police Department (YPD). If you have flags...Fly them!!

The YPD will escort us through town to the **bull pen/staging** area at **105** Garner Street where we will begin the actual parking process. **Parking** is the most difficult task at any downtown rally and must be staged, so please be patient. We can usually park 4 rigs at a time thanks to our multiple locations. Including the 3-block parade, parking typically only takes about an hour. We will help you all the way.

We have the East and West sides of Congress, and the 2 parking lots on Congress. What we don't have is any guarantees of which place you will park. We must place you as efficiently and as safely as we can. **It is all good**, and you will like it.

Our central gathering point during the rally is downtown at the **City Market**, where we kick things off at **5pm Friday**. Other than an **Open House** on **Saturday**, and a \$\$ coffee/pastry bar **Sunday morning at the City Market**, we have no organized events planned, so enjoy downtown small-town America from the comforts of your front door!



The **Open House** is scheduled Saturday afternoon from 1-4. The locals love to peek inside and ask questions but participate **only if you want to.** If you choose not to participate, simply close your door.

If you are a member of the **Airstream Club**, we encourage you to wear your name badge, not only so we can call each other by name, but more importantly, so the merchants and locals downtown can recognize your presence there. We are there for them, they are there for us. No Club, No badge...No problem.

There is no Rally Fee. Instead, we ask that you consider a generous donation to **PATH**... **P**eople **A**ttempting **To H**elp. PATH is a nondenominational, muti-church sponsored outreach organization that reaches far into the York community. Cash or check made payable to PATH. Thank you in advance.

If it becomes necessary to change your plans and you need to cancel, we would appreciate that info so that someone on the waiting list can come join the fun.

Last-but-not-least.... We would love to be able to tell you there is no crime in our beloved town, but that cannot be truthfully said anywhere anymore. Please be careful getting here and while you're here, watch out for each other and don't tempt the casual thief with loose gear. Secure bicycles, generators, cell phones, and any items that might grow legs and wander off. We want everyone happy, safe and sound, and ready to embrace main street small town America.



### A Young Prodigy by Bob & Jan Wilson (BRN 20673)

Anna Rose Nicholson was born in Yangchuan City in Guangdong, China in 2006. She moved to



North Carolina when she was adopted by her forever family at the age of 16 months. Severe neglect in the orphanage left Anna extremely developmental delayed. With the love of her family, proper nutrition, many therapies, and amazing determination on her part, Anna began to grow and reach significant physical and developmental milestones. Even with this progress, Anna still faced many challenges socially and emotionally. At the age of five, Anna was diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder.

Music has played a huge role in Anna's development. From an early age, it was obvious that Anna needed music. It spoke to her when she could not understand words and it soothed her when she was overstimulated and had no words of her own. At age 4 ½, Anna began Suzuki violin lessons with her beloved teacher Rachel Pino of New Bern, NC and at seven, she started cello lessons. She took to these instruments very quickly and they remain her best therapies.



Anna continues to study violin with Rachel and is currently studying cello with Katherine Haig of Asheville, NC.

Despite her challenges and the fact that she does not read music, Anna has become quite a musician. Anna has performed as a soloist at the NC Suzuki Institute at East Carolina University (2016, 2017). She has been a guest artist for ECU Suzuki Pedagogy Master's Program Seminar (2018). And she has been a soloist at the NC Chamber Music Festival several times, (2015-2019) and most recently at the Festival, performed Vivaldi Spring as the soloist beside several members of the Boston Symphony (2024).

Anna prefers to play classical music but can also fiddle and enjoys a good jam session. Her other hobbies include walking or running around Lake Junaluska, making cards, writing letters and most recently learning to play the piano.

The dates are May 10th through May 18th, 2025. NOTE: The timeline is longer due to the travel time.




#### Cape Hatteras RV Resort organized by our 1st VP Eric Graham (BRN 05097)

### Must Visit Campground by Charlie & Mary Ann Purser (BRN 28742)

#### Poplar Point Campground (Pittsboro, NC) - NC Division of Parks

Poplar Point is located on the shores of Jordan Lake (14,000 acres). Although close to Chapel Hill, Durham and Raleigh, the campground is quiet and spacious.

Poplar Point campsites are built on the peninsula fingers and most sites are either on the water or have a water view. Poplar Point has over 300 sites.

Along with its neighboring NC State Parks (Parker's Creek, Crosswinds and Ebenezer), there are over 1,000 campsites near the main Jordan Lake bridge (Hwy 64). All offer privacy, lots of trees, bath houses, picnic tables, decks (for some water sites), miles of trails & park roads and a combed beach!





Dates of stay: May 3-5, 2023. 300 sites spread out over 5-6 loops. Very private, quiet and affordable (\$35). No septic at site; however, the dump stations are very large and can accommodate 6 RVs at one time. Pittsboro is nearby. Running/hiking score: 4.5 There is a nice central trail that crosses most of the loops. Mostly flat. The asphalt roads are also nice and there is practically no traffic in the park. Attached pictures were taken from our site and the combed beach at the end of park.


Recommendation: If you go, take Hwy 64 instead of I-40/85. **From the WNC mountains**, you can get on 64 in Mocksville, NC. It's a beautiful drive through Central NC and easy for an Airstream. The NC Zoo (Asheboro) is along the way. You will also bypass Ramseur, Siler City, Pittsboro, etc. **From Charlotte**: You can take Hwy 49 to Asheboro and then catch Hwy 64.

## Honey Bun Cake (9 servings)



### **Batter Ingredients:**

2-1/3 cups flour 1/4 cup vegetable oil 1-1/2 cups sugar 1 stick butter, softened

1 Tbsp. baking powder 1 Tbsp. vanilla

1 cup sour cream 2 eggs & 2 egg yolks

### Filling: Glaze:

1 cup brown sugar 2 cups powdered sugar

Cinnamon 3 Tbsp. milk

(plus, extra for dusting) 2 tsp. vanilla

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease 9x9" baking pan.
- 2. Mix the softened butter, sour cream, vegetable oil, vanilla, and eggs until well combined.
- 3. Add flour, sugar and baking powder.
- 4. Pour 1/3 of the batter in the bottom of the baking pan and spread.
- 5. In a small bowl, mix the filling ingredients and then sprinkle over the cake batter in the baking pan.
- 6. Add in second 2/3rds of the batter carefully.
- 7. Bake for 40-45 minutes or until top has begun browning and a knife comes out clean.
- 8. Cool completely.
- 9. Combine glaze ingredients and pour over cooled cake.
- 10. Dust with cinnamon.
