The Rigs began arriving on Friday afternoon, a beautiful day in every respect. We had a total of seven rigs here. On Friday we had Tracey Calvert, Rick & Tracy Elkins, Jim & Lisa Feine, Sherry Miller & Tom Harris and the Calvert's daughter, Mel, and granddaughters, Audrey and Ashley. On Saturday Gene Guthrie, Jerry Calvert and Mel's friend from Richmond (Monica Huff) joined us; and on Sunday George and Jamie Nixon arrived. A few others were registered but had last minute change of plans and we're sorry they could not make it.

Jerry had been in the hospital for a couple of concerns but he and Tracey were bound and determined not to let that get in the way of Hosting the Rally – what troopers! Tracey had collected Rally Bags from the Chamber of Commerce filled with details of events and businesses around the area and had made a board showing the area and several special interest opportunities.

The rigs all had shady spots beneath the trees and as they arrived and got set up they were able to enjoy the cool breezes and sounds of life in the country. Tracey gave everyone tours of their home. She and Jerry had the barndominium built on property passed down through generations of Jerry's family and moved in it in 2016.



Tracey's love for genealogy and miniatures is on display in each room. They have gallery walls with photos of ancestors organized by family and fully furnished and equipped doll houses that are complete down to the contents of the kitchen cabinets.



Construction was only recently completed on a rear sunroom that overlooks their pond and back pasture. Tracey had a coffee bar set up in the sunroom with a selection so everyone could have their favorite coffee blend.

For the day of the eclipse (Monday, April 8th) there were several unfavorable

weather predictions that fortunately were incorrect for the most part. Shortly after 1 pm, we gathered on the lawn in chairs with our eclipse glasses and filtered cameras to watch the event from start to finish. Initially there was just a tiny sliver of darkness on the right edge of the sun. Occasionally the clouds would pass in front of the sun for a brief period and as they cleared we saw a greater percentage of the sun covered by the moon. Over the course of the early afternoon, we watched as the sun became just a sliver and then eventually totally dark. For



those four minutes of total darkness, we noticed that the animals around us were still and quiet. The breeze was calm, as if nature was sleeping. Then, just as it started, the eclipse continued. There was a bright diamond at the upper right edge of the sun and gradually from right to left, the sun began to appear above us. It was an amazing

experience, and we had the perfect spot to view it from! Stand by – next one visible from Texas in in 2044!

After this long weekend, we leisurely packed up and said our farewells on Tuesday morning. We enjoyed our sojourn into boondocking and now we'll add a notch to our Airstream experiences with this truly unique Rally!

Host Justin planned a great Rally as a newbie; his first ever GHAC Rally was earlier this year at the Leap Year Rally, so he jumped right into things by Hosting this rally a mere 6-weeks later. Kudos to Justin, we need more members like you!

The weather forecast for the weekend held a promise of rain by Saturday afternoon, so we made the most of exploring on Friday. We started off with breakfast – massive cinnamon rolls fresh out of the oven with

mounds of bacon, yogurt with granola, sweet berries, juice and coffee. Coffee is always an adventure as the GHAC coffee pot is an anomaly to operate. After a rough start, Tom Bundy put the coffee crew (Rick, Wayne & Justin) through a brew-training session which led to much smoother coffee making on days two and three of the Rally (wink, wink). Afterwards, we took off to check out the quaint downtown area, quilt shops, historic sites, museums and attractions in Fayette County. The Davis and the Millers even toured the

Jersey Barnyard Dairy where they got to milk a cow at this 100-year-old, four generation farm nestled in the rolling hills near LaGrange among many beautiful oak trees.

Friday afternoon the cornhole boards were out for several rounds of play, we had long chats under the shade trees on the banks of the Colorado River and some even found time for a nap as

the Spring breezes and awnings kept temps pleasant.

By late afternoon, the grills and fire disc were set up and we had a huge spread of chicken fajitas & grilled portabella mushrooms with black beans, rice, guacamole, pico de gallo, and flour tortillas. We topped off the evening with sopapilla cheesecake to



celebrate Ashley Billard's birthday a few days early!

Saturday, we had a workday at Kreische Brewery, a Texas Historic Site; our efforts were in honor of Earth Day on Monday. To prepare for a morning of labor, a hearty breakfast of sausage, eggs and biscuits were served.

With loppers, saws, and gloves we hiked into the brewery site. It dates back to 1860 when German immigrant and master stonemason Heinrich Kreische built the brewery on the Bluff south of LaGrange to take advantage of the spring water in the nearby ravine. The brewery shut down in 1884 but much of the stone structure remains, so our task was to clear out vegetation and open up several areas that had become overgrown. We cleared small trees, weeds, and vines, all the while being watchful for snakes we were warned about, and poison oak which was prevalent. After a couple of hours, we made a huge difference and had a mound of debris to show for our efforts. President Rick even contributed a set of glasses that flew off his face while he was throwing trees down the bluff! The rain was just starting to sprinkle as we hiked out of the brewery area back to our vehicles. Well done, GHAC crew!

After a few hours to clean up and recuperate, a small group gathered for a tech talk on navigation and weather apps led by Tom Raia and the grill team took



advantage of a break in the rain to get the burgers and wieners on the grill for dinner. With the help of some trusty umbrella bearers, they pulled off some delicious burgers and dogs to feed

the hungry campers gathered in the Rally Room munching on Happy Hour appetizers including boiled shrimp, bean dip and a delicious fruit salad. After dinner we pulled out all the stops with an Ice Cream Sundae Bar in honor of John Davis' birthday on Monday; Airstreams and Ice Cream – it's a natural!

Although the rain prevented the planned Chicken Races, we had a lively raffle drawing for prizes won by Justin Hargadine, Ashley Billard, Wayne Wilkerson and Chris Newhouse (from the RV Park Office).

Being able to include one's loyal and loving pets in an Airstream life or event is a true blessing.

For members attending Airstream Rallies, Airstream Club International provides guidelines for pets. When we rally, please be aware.

Recommended Pet Policy for Events

All pets must be on a 6-foot, non-retractable leashes when outside the Airstream, Always check collars and leashes to ensure they fit correctly and are working properly. A size-appropriate pet containment system can be used at the campsite. Pets are not permitted in the buildings or outside dining areas during a meal except for working service animals. Well-mannered dogs are welcome to play and exercise in designated dog parks. Always clean up after your pet. And make sure your pet has an ID tag.

Tech Tip By Rick Elkins

Do you struggle with getting sticky windows open on your Airstream? It is very important to follow Airstream guidelines for cleaning and conditioning/lubricating your window seals on a regular basis.

Regular, routine cleaning of window seals using soapy water and then when seals are dry, applying a silicone product or 303 Aerospace Protectant to the seals protects and extends the life of the window seals as well as making window opening easier.

Despite doing these measures which are essential for the windows, you will still find sticking windows from time to time. The link below shows a product you can add to your Airstream which will assist you in opening the sticky window from inside your rig.
