## Region 2 News

### Region 2 News February/March 2020

The Mid-Winter IBT meeting held in Las Vegas last month is now in the rearview mirror and the kickoff of Spring camping season is up ahead and coming on FAST. The calendars of our local clubs reveal many, many camping opportunities to look forward to. Maintenance Rally, Unbutton Your Rig Rally, Spring Rendezvous... whatever your club calls it...mark up your calendar now and start counting down the days to that first outing. I know I am!

Speaking of the Mid-Winter IBT Meeting, much was accomplished during those 3 days in January. Congratulations to the clubs who had their name changes approved, including our own Al-Mon-O Pennsylvania Airstream Club. I know of several more in our Region who have or are in the process of voting on a name change. Over 75% of the local clubs in our WBCCI have made the change so far. There were several motions approved that make continued improvements to our Constitution and Bylaws, with the intent to “clean up” verbiage and complete the reformatting of the documents. The goal is to have a clean, “searchable” Constitution and By-Laws on our Club website, with policy and procedures separated from the basic foundational documents. Those approved motions will be presented for Delegate voting at the International Rally this summer out in Loveland, CO. A full slate of International Officers will also be presented for Delegate voting as current Region 1 President Per Hamnqvist #285 has accepted nomination to the office of International 3<sup>rd</sup> VP. Congratulations, Per! Additionally, the IBT voted to approve the new colorful AIC (Airstream Club, Int’l) marketing logo as one of three (3) official emblems available for club use. Look for that new logo and brand guidelines to be available for widespread download on [airstreamclub.org](http://airstreamclub.org) soon.

At our Region Officers forum, I was proud to have presented a discussion paper titled *“The Airstream Club’s Brand and Member Benefits”*. Written in collaboration with Mid-Atlantic Airstream Club President, Jonathan Jacobs #2784, the paper put forth for discussion the need to increase our Airstream Club’s member benefits. I presented and discussed our ideas on how to expand Member Benefits and add value to our Club brand. The paper and the ideas proposed were well received, stimulated some critical thinking and prompted a lot of good questions. We will continue to push for expanding the benefits of Club membership by offering and promoting those ideas such as product and service discount programs, insurance partnerships, travel services, a branded rewards credit card and educational opportunities, to name a few. I want to thank Jonathan for his help and contributions to the effort.

The new Club website continues to fill out, with more content and additions to the calendar of events. Remember, all local clubs are responsible for adding their planned activity info directly to the website. I recently sent out a reminder and included instructions on how to access and edit your calendar. Any questions on that procedure, please let me know. Transitioning our local club websites over to the new web format will begin this Spring and will be done in waves. There will be three modern, easy to implement brand-consistent templates for both Region and local clubs to use in updating their websites.

Work on the new membership data base and other items included in Phase 2 of website improvement is also under way, including a self-service member portal. Members will be able to create and input/change/update



info in a “log-in, member only” secure personal member profile. Also in the works is a new process for signing up for Caravans, including secure online application and registration, plus a centralized banking and payment process. It was reported that there are twenty (20) National Caravans being offered in 2020, the largest number ever offered by the Airstream Club!

The biggest take away from the meetings in Las Vegas is that our Airstream Club is in the midst of its largest modernization and transformation in years. We are fortunate to have a dedicated core of talented members, all volunteers, who work countless hours to the benefit of our Airstream Club and its growing membership. Lori Plummer, our Corporate Manager, and her staff do an awesome job, day in and day out, for our members. It is exciting and impressive to see the improvements being made and those in the pipeline soon to come. Stay tuned!

I am pleased to introduce Lea Plant #2256 as our new Region 2 Membership Chair. Lea is a Past-President of the Watchung NJ Airstream Club and is also Past-Editor of their club’s award-winning newsletter, *The Hillbilly*. Lea will be working to help our local clubs by acting as a liaison to Headquarters and by bringing information and ideas for club growth. I know she will do a great job and I thank her for volunteering. I am also pleased to say I have spoken with several people interested in becoming Region 2 Officers. I am confident that we will install a 1<sup>st</sup> VP in May at our Region 2 Rally in Kingston Ontario, Canada and then a 2<sup>nd</sup> VP by the end of the year. I am grateful for those who have stepped up and expressed interest in continuing our efforts to **Renew Region 2** and are dedicated to making our Region and Club the best it can be.

Finally, an update on our 2020 Region 2 Rally. On January 15<sup>th</sup>, we stopped taking registrations and started a waiting list as we were at capacity and had filled all 108 sites at Rideau Acres Campground. Since that time, we have been given a few more sites, had some cancellations that we then filled from the wait list and are now at **119 rigs registered!** Thank you for the tremendous response to the Rally and many thanks to the Ontario Club #124 for all their work and support. It is going to be awesome!

Fishing in the pond may be done but the fish have to be released.

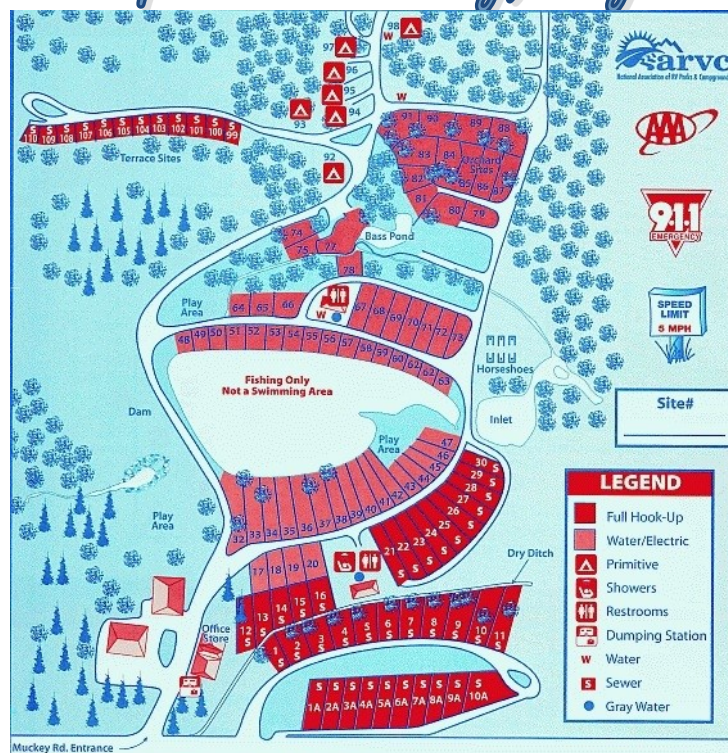
Friday morning, we will leave the campground and carpool to Ithaca and take the short easy walk to Taughannock Falls. This is handicap accessible.

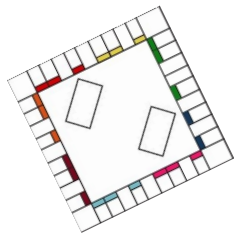

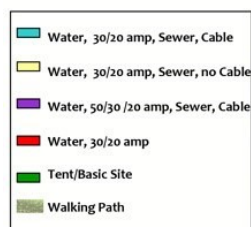

Go to “Campsite Photo Guide” tab, then, click on “Choose Site” on left side of page.

We’re going to try for the sites on the peninsula, sites A1-A22. They are the inner sites. Shoreline sites along the peninsula are walk-in sites only during our rally days. I believe that means that although you cannot reserve those shoreline sites, if you’ve reserved an inner site, you might be able to trade that reserved inner site for a shoreline site when you get there, if there’s one available.

Watch the trailer length of the site you pick. Most A sites are up to 40 foot trailers, but a few are 30 foot and Site A20 says only up to 20 foot. I’m going to try for site A18, to try to get in the middle of things.

This is a NY State campground with **dry camping only**. **NO electric, water or sewer hook-ups**. They have a dump station and there are quite a few water outlets available on the peninsula. Generators are allowed up to 5 hours per day from 9am to 11am and 4 to 7pm.

# So, Just How “Riveted” Are You?

**Anthropomorphism** the attribution of a personal nature or human characteristics to something nonhuman.

**Personification** is the humanizing an object when communicating to an audience.

Before I bought my 1966 Airstream Caravel '17 this past June, I read everything I could to become an informed buyer. What struck me at the time was that people in the Air Forums, in videos, on Instagram and in dedicated websites seemed curiously attached to their Airstreams, as if the trailer was family or a friend. Most rigs had been named, were well-loved and extensively photographed, and when work had been done to a rig, everything was so well-documented and analyzed that it seemed like a silver badge of honor. To an outsider, it was “riveting,” you might say.

After more than a year of scouring, searching, and rejecting one trailer after another, I stepped into this 1966 Caravel and I knew instantly, “she” was mine...and without really appreciating it then, I fell in line with my fellow “tincansmen,” as I started to bring her back to life.

First things first – “she” needed a name. In what quickly became a fiercely competitive naming exercise, family and friends from around the country tendered their picks. From the outside, “she” was fairly well-preserved and oh so petite, and thus the only rule was that “her” name had to be a monosyllabic throwback to the 60’s.

As texts and emails flew, with one less riveting pun after another, I kept thinking about the woman I had seen in the 1966 Caravel “Optionals” brochure, posing next to the suspended bunk bed option. With her vintage 60’s bob [that can only be achieved with curlers], her sleeveless, button-down shirt and capri pants [pressed, of course], and low heels [apparently not into hiking], I kept thinking, “Flo.” But the naysayers, who were lobbying hard for Pearl, Rosie, Lucy and Ethel, took potshots at a name that ubiquitously symbolizes an insurance spokeswoman.

To me, though, the name suited “her” perfectly, and so, I went with the “flow” and officially named her “Flo[w]” – nicknamed, “Flo” – as in go with the flow...



With the naming complete, I launched full-steam into sterilizing Flo, hand-sanding the cabinetry, and replacing the curtains and gaucho cushions...all with an eye on embracing the essence of her 1960’s style. As I stripped the clearcoat away, I knew I had found a real gem.

As family and friends climbed on board, they could see the vision, and after finding the “wine fridge,” they too were soon talking about Flo, as though she was my new bestie, with some offering gifts they thought “Flo might like.” Priceless.

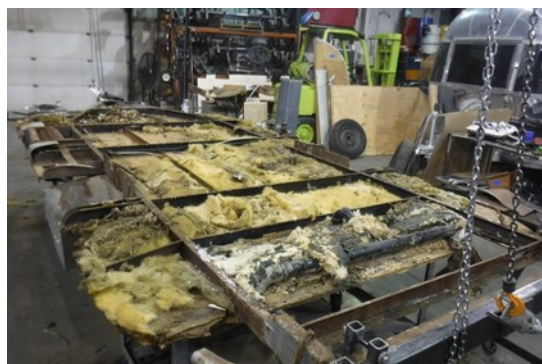
As the 2019 camping season drew to a close, I packed up all of her kitchen, bath and decorative goodies for the winter, and removed both gauchos to discover the source of the leak that developed at the Fall Rally [a poorly patched fresh water tank – bubble gum would have worked better] and the spots of rot I had found.

With a tinge of sadness and a lot of hopefulness, I drove Flo to Plattsburgh for her long-awaited “winter make-over.” Though I hated to drive away without her, this had to be done in order to preserve the essence of Flo and my ability to continue to “go with the Flo[w].”



As the first photos of her shell-off “tummy tuck” came across the transom, I gasped, “*What have I done?*”

Seeing her “bubble” as it was being carted outside on a gurney, where it would be parked in the snow and freezing temperatures until her underbelly was restored, made me want to drive back up there and cover “her” with warm blankets. And that’s when I realized I had become full-on attached to an inanimate object, as if she were family, just like so many others before me.

and stronger.



She now is sporting a custom spare tire rack that sits on  
the underside of her chassis, just like the new rigs!

And so, within a matter of days, at the hands of some very skilled artisans at Colin Hyde Restorations [including Flo's own "Flashdance" girl welder], Flo is already so much stronger, sleeker, and I am sure much happier!
