



We started our New England Fall Foliage Leaf Peeper adventure in Plattsburgh, New York where we keep our AirStream Dream Chrome Home.

It was all setup for us at Plattsburgh RV Park, so all we had to do was sleep off our Flight from England when we arrived. After a day of loading up the Airstream and K.C. hitting the Plattsburgh Quilters show as well as her favorite Antiques shops in town we headed across Lake Champlain to Vermont and the Shelburne Museum. WOW! Completely unexpected, this place is a full on, life size contribution to Americana! You have to visit it to believe it! Not just a Museum building full of relics but 45 acres, 39 buildings and over 150,000 artifacts from Renoir originals to hand made 17<sup>th</sup> century toys. Including a full on 200 foot Paddle Wheel Steam Ship and a covered bridge.

From Shelburne we headed to ShoreHam Vermont to visit the WhistlePig Distillery. We spent the night at the Farm house there and helped to make a batch of Whistler Pig Rye Whiskey in the middle of the night. Really cool old Farmhouse with gourmet meals and tasting of all Whistle Pig products, including the Boss Hogg, winner of the Best Rye Whiskey in the world! Yum!!!!!! (K.C. even liked it, why not at \$475 per bottle).

Next stop was to catch up with the Hudson-Mohawk Unit of the WBCCI Airstream Club at Salisbury Beach Recreation area in Salisbury Beach Massachusetts. We had 4 wonderful days meeting fellow Airstreamers and exploring this part of Massachusetts and New Hampshire. We had fresh lobsters and oysters at the local fresh Lobster place. I also tried to relocate a steel fire ring with my shinbone in the dark, ouch!

We headed north to York, Maine. Where we camped on the Beach (well almost the on beach, sort of on a cliff above the beach).

Next stop was Cavindish, New Hampshire.

Then Glenn Ellis Family Campground. The most FANTASTIC campground I have have ever visited. Our space was right on a river surrounded by beautiful trees with turning leaves.

We spent 2 nights at Glenn Ellis where we took day trips to explore the Kancamagus and White Mountain Highways. We even took a hike up to Ripley waterfall and managed to get a little lost on our way back (I forgot to bring bread crumbs).

We then headed to Stowe, Vermont to do some more of the same – leaf peeping, antique shops, museums and tourist traps(Did I mention Ben & Jerry's ice Cream factory? One hour wait to buy an ice cream cone and a 2 hour wait for a tour, we hit the gift shop and moved on). We did enjoy stops at a cider mill and a Big red coffee barn(be warned, the toilet seats are heated for a reason there).

Campgrounds start closing in September and October and we managed to stay the last night of all but one of the 9 stops we made.

Next stop was the Apple Island Resort in South Hero Vermont for 4 nights before they shut down for the winter. From there Day trips included a visit back to the Shelburne Museum and more antique shops (a lot easier to stop when it is just the truck than with the AirStream behind us). One thing about Vermont is there are no shoulders on the roads to pull off on with a trailer and you have to drive several miles before you can find a way to turn around with the trailer, the other thing is every retailer has a sign in the window that says "no restroom". (Vermont must have a strong Urologists lobby.) We had beautiful weather in spite of the grounds keeper telling us it was usually in the 30s on the last day in previous years on the day the shut down.

We ended our trip by returning the airstream to storage at Plattsburgh and flew home from Montreal, Quebec, Canada.

Sites are available with gravel trailer back-in sites up to 40 foot, with 30A electric. No water or sewer hookups, so make sure your trailer has a full water tank and empty gray and black water tanks when you arrive!

Suggested sites are Loop 2, sites 74-94. The outside sites tend to be more level and a bit larger: the inside sites are sometimes on a uphill slope.
