CYBERSECURITY WHILE TRAVELING

ood to know; In a world where we are constantly connected, cybersecurity cannot be limited to the home or office. When you're traveling— whether domestic or international—it is always important to practice safe online behavior and take proactive steps to secure Internetenabled devices. The more we travel, the more we are at risk for cyberattacks. #BeCyberSmart and use these tips to connect with confidence while on the go.



SIMPLE TIPS:

BEFORE YOU GO

- If You Connect IT, Protect IT. Whether it's your computer, smartphone, game device, or other network devices, the best defense against viruses and malware is to update to the latest security software, web browser, and operating systems. Sign up for automatic updates, if you can, and protect your devices with anti-virus software.
- Back up your information. Back up your contacts, financial data, photos, videos, and other mobile device data to another device or cloud service in case your device is compromised, and you have to reset it to factory settings.
- Connect only with people you trust. While some social networks might seem safer for connecting because of the limited personal information shared through them, keep your connections to people you know and trust.
- Keep up to date. Keep your software updated to the latest version available. Maintain your security settings to keeping your information safe by turning on automatic updates so you don't have to think about it and set your security software to run regular scans.
- Double your login protection. Enable multi-factor authentication (MFA) to ensure that the only person who has access to your account is you. Use it for email, banking, social media, and any other service that requires logging in. If MFA is an option, enable it by using a trusted mobile device, such as your smartphone, an authenticator app, or a secure token—a small physical device that can hook onto your key ring. Read the Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) How-to-Guide for more information.

DURING YOUR TRIP

- Stop auto connecting. Some devices will automatically seek and connect to available wireless networks or Bluetooth devices. This instant connection opens the door for cyber criminals to remotely access your devices. Disable these features so that you actively choose when to connect to a safe network.
- Stay protected while connected. Before you connect to any public wireless hotspot—such as at an airport, hotel, or café—be sure to confirm the name of the network and exact login procedures with appropriate staff to ensure that the network is legitimate. If you do use an unsecured public access point, practice good Internet hygiene by avoiding sensitive activities (e.g., banking) that require passwords or credit cards. Your personal hotspot is often a safer alternative to free WiFi. Only use sites that begin with "https://" when online shopping or banking.
- Play hard to get with strangers. Cyber criminals use phishing tactics, hoping to fool their victims. If you're unsure who an email is from—even if the details appear accurate—or if the email looks "phishy," do not respond and do not click on any links or attachments found in that email. When available use the "junk" or "block" option to no longer receive messages from a particular sender.
- Never click and tell. Limit what information you post on social media—from personal addresses to where you like to grab coffee. What many people don't realize is that these seemingly random details are all that criminals need to know to target you, your loved ones, and your physical belongings—online and in the real world. Keep Social Security numbers, account numbers, and passwords private, as well as specific information about yourself, such as your full name, address, birthday, and even vacation plans. Disable location services that allow anyone to see where you are—and where you aren't— at any given time. Read the Social Media Cybersecurity Tip Sheet for more information.
- Guard your mobile devices. To prevent theft and unauthorized access or loss of sensitive information, never leave your equipment—including any USB or external storage devices—unattended in a public place. Keep your devices secured in taxis, at airports, on airplanes, and in your hotel room.

Sue Whittle shared that our good friend Claudia Stark could use our positive thoughts, good vibes and prayers.


So happy that Sandy Boogertman joined us for lunch. She is a Lifetime member who transferred from Washington Airstream Club and now lives in Vermont.

Rally on **June 9, 10 and 11, 2022** at Wilcox Memorial Park, a beautiful 614-acre park that sits at the base of the Stissing Mountain range

located in northern Dutchess County in the Town of Milan, New York. It has 11 miles of hiking trails, one with a glorious Catskill view, fishing, boating and one of the region's finest disc golf courses.



The park has 10 shaded RV campsites

sites in its Forest Acres Campground, each with 30 amp and water hookups, picnic table and fire ring (\$30/night), plus boondocking sites,

if more spots are needed. The Dutchess County Parks and Recreation Department has blocked all 10 RV sites until May 1st, when any unreserved spots will be released to the public...hopefully that won't happen, so that we can have the whole park to ourselves! Furry friends on leashes are welcome!



In addition to nightly campfires at the Flo Café, activities will include a BYOL with a nosh to share picnic and private wine (or seltzer) tasting at the celebrated Millbrook winery, overlooking the Catskill and Shawgunk mountains (Friday).

It is worth the trip for the view alone!

And for those with a more distilled palette, a jaunt to the nearby Taconic Distillery, where all can enjoy a BYOL and lovely countryside view (Saturday).
