
A Word from Our President

Another first timer was Tornado, Darrell and Maureen Ostyn's furry friend. Their photos suggest that he enjoyed himself on




the trip as well.

The Oregon Trail—Wally Byam Roots Rally Baker City, Oregon—June 20-23 2024



Nestled in the verdant Powder Valley, Baker City hosts an excellent Oregon Trail Interpretive Center and the Baker Heritage Museum which features an exhibit on Airstream visionary Wally Byam, born in Baker City July 4, 1896. The wheel wasn't actually invented here, but the locals made good use of it.

We're lining up visits to the Oregon Trail Center and the Baker Museum and we'll have a potluck rally dinner with BBQ. Experience the best of Baker City's history and present in a beautiful setting:

- Oregon Trail Roots: National Historic Oregon Trail Interpretive Center | Bureau of Land Management (blm.gov) offers living history demonstrations, interpretive programs, exhibits, multi-media presentations, special events, and more than four miles of interpretive trails.
- Airstream Roots: The Baker Heritage Museum in the 100-year-old Municipal Natatorium displays the community's history from the 1860's. Native son Wally Byam's Airstream experience is a core exhibit. Others include logging, ranching, mining, a collection of regional Native American artifacts, including stone tools, and more.
- Historic downtown: Once the largest city between Salt Lake and Portland, Baker City offers an elegant window to its Victorian heyday. Take a self-guided tour of over 100 buildings in one of the largest intact historic commercial districts in the West. See loving restorations such as Crossroads Carnegie Art Center, the Geiser Grand Hotel, and the art deco Baker Tower.
- Soak up the beauty: This is the gateway to Hells Canyon, the Wallowa Mountains, and Elkhorn Ridge of the Blue Mountains. You can:
 - Take a scenic drive on the Elkhorn Drive Scenic Byway Travel Oregon
 - Go soak yourself at Grande Hot Springs RV Resort

- Culinary Tour: Sign up for the Baker City Historic Walking Tours | Go Wild | Baker City, Oregon USA (gowildusa.com)
- Thursday night Sip, Stroll, Shop: June 20 unWINEd: Wine Walk Baker City Downtown
- Saturday Wagon Ride: Ride through Baker City's historic downtown in a horse-drawn wagon with a guide telling stories of Baker City's Wild West history.
- 22nd Baker City Cycling Classic: Series finals for the Bloom to Baker Series. Saturday, June 22 Baker City Time Trial followed by Baker City Downtown Criterium.
- Blue Mountain Bigfoot Festival June 22, 23 (Hey, it's a happening place.)
