

Located in the heart of Pennsylvania apple country, The National Apple Harvest Festival celebrates the fall season with beautiful hand made crafts, delicious food and live entertainment. The



festival has something for everyone; steam engine displays, live music, antique cars, orchard tours, pony rides, tastings and much more!



We will be camping at Charcoal Hearth Campground at Pine Grove Furnace State Park, Gardners, PA. Make your camping reservations now as sites (especially pet sites) will fill quickly for this weekend. The

rate is \$27/night. The park brochure has a map of the campground. Stay Friday through Sunday if you can so that you may enjoy either one or both days of the festival. Sites are electric only, so fill your water tank before arrival. There are dump stations onsite.

Friday evening we'll provide a burger bar and on Saturday you can enjoy great food at the festival! With clear skies we will have campfires and BYO snacks Friday and Saturday. Coffee service will be provided on Saturday and Sunday morning. There is no rally fee. The festival in nearby Biglerville will be open Saturday 8-6 and Sunday 8-5 rain or shine. You can purchase tickets online in advance (\$10) or get them at the festival grounds. Fire police will direct you to parking fields and shuttle bus service is provided to festival grounds (included in admission). Pets are NOT permitted at the festival. Courtesy Parking Moving to Harvest Hosts

Everyone should have received an email from Airstream Club International regarding courtesy parking moving to the Harvest Hosts platform. Courtesy parking hosts were required to complete a survey by June 7th. We're not yet sure of the date that it will actually move over to Harvest Hosts so stay tuned.

How we travel and camp by Bill & Barbara Earle BRN 10333

One of the great things about Airstream and RV travel in general is that there's something for everyone. Whether it's the type, size, floor plan and model of Airstream all the way to desired locations, weather and everything in between. Given that we live in Southeastern PA, my wife and I travel during the warmer months as we have no interest in towing or camping in the winter. Our Airstream of choice is a 2023 Flying Cloud 27FBQ which fits us and our camping style perfectly. Many will recommend a "shake down" trip with a new Airstream. Our "shake down" trip was the month of June 2023 traveling to Ouray, CO, Moab, UT and Lyons, CO. Our Airstream performed extremely well with no problems.

We enjoy hiking so we generally seek locations with excellent hiking opportunities. Caledonia State Park in PA is great example. We've been there a few times and are returning this year. Many National Parks offer excellent hiking opportunities as well. We also love local farm to table restaurants and have been extremely fortunate in finding a few gems. A few recommendations are Farrow in Niwot, CO, Brickhouse 737 in Ouray, CO, and Native in Honesdale, PA. We do prepare most of our own meals either in the Airstream or on a charcoal grill. We also look for local wineries where we can enjoy wines that are not readily available in PA. Finger Lakes region in NY has some wonderful wineries. Michigan is another great location when going far enough north (Traverse City area). Photography is a huge passion of mine so we're always on the lookout for photographic opportunities. We're not dry campers and our Airstream is not set up for extended off-grid camping. We enjoy full hookups. We keep our travel days fairly short trying to stay under five hours. We don't drive fast, 60-63 generally depending on road conditions.

Our 2024 travels take us to Florida Keys, Promised Land State Park in PA, Caledonia State Park in PA, Michigan upper and lower peninsula, and the Airstream International Rally. We hope to make a few local rallies next year and look forward to meeting many of you.

Michigan 2023 - Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore Area

This was our first trip to Michigan and turned out to be one of the best we've experienced so far. We stayed at Indigo Bluffs RV Park & Resort in Empire, MI. The resort is split into two sections, one for Class A Motorhomes and one for all other RVs. We had a site tucked back off the road a bit with an incredible amount of open area and privacy. Overall the campground is clean and well maintained. Click the link to visit the website and see all of the amenities. We found the area and Lake Michigan nothing short of spectacular. One of the things that hit us immediately was an incredibly comfortable vibe. The area just felt special. Little to no retail, no shopping centers, commercial or strip malls, a lot of wineries and farms. Yes, this means that shopping for food can be challenging but Traverse City is not that far away. We're returning this year and will also be visiting the Upper Peninsula.
