



BACKING TIPS

I have been towing a 30' Airstream since I was 18 or roughly 27 years. I have also been driving a tractor trailer for Pepsi the past 19 years. I have driven cross-country multiple times and driven to Alaska and Nova Scotia twice each. Here are some basic backing tips that may be helpful for you.

The most important thing to remember is to take your time. Don't worry if you are blocking the road or holding someone up. Make sure your rig is safely where it needs to be in your own timing. Trying to back up quickly out of someone's way in a campground or parking lot can lead to unnecessary damage.

Get comfortable driving your rig forward. Get to know how it turns, tail-swing etc. Watch the trailer wheels in your mirror as you make turns. Longer trailers drive and back differently than shorter ones.

When preparing to back into a campsite always try and back from the drivers side, so you can see your trailer out the drivers window as you back. Pull up so your trailer wheels are at least 6 feet beyond the site. Longer trailers turn backwards at a slower angle. Short trailers turn backwards quickly and are easy to jack-knife. Remember to look out for overhangs and tree limbs.

Place one hand on the bottom center of your steering wheel. Which ever way you move your hand is the direction that the rear of the trailer will begin to move. Go SLOWLY! Quick movements of the steering wheel are not good. The slower you turn the wheel the easier it is to watch your trailer and adjust for overcorrecting. If your tow vehicle angle gets too tight pull up and straighten out. There is no shame in pulling up!

Having one person to help you spot is good. Multiple people telling you different things is never a good scenario. If you are alone get out and look. Check the site for obstacles. Make sure the rear overhang of your trailer has enough room past the end of the site. Be mindful of where your stabilizer jacks come down.

If you must back from your blind side or passenger side be very careful. Remember your tow vehicle swing radius will be greater. Again pull 6 feet past the site. Watch your trailer wheels in the passenger mirror as you begin to back. Slowly! Ask someone to spot for you.

With time and practice you will be as comfortable backing as going forward!
