All members should have received an email from ACI regarding an upcoming ACI Special Election with a scheduled June vote on a proposed ACI Constitutional Amendment. The Amendment was previously reviewed and approved to send to all ACI members, for their vote, by the International Board of Trustees (IBT), which is made up by the 12 ACI Regional Presidents. For this Amendment to pass, it requires a 20% member voting participation and a 2/3 yes vote of those voting. For voting, each ACI member with an email address on file with ACI should receive an email with an electronic ballot. Every vote matters, so please learn about this amendment and cast your vote.

When 133-Airstreams and 250+ Airstreamers descended on this quaint town in the Texas Hill Country, the population jumped 30% literally overnight! But what a phenomenal time we had from the minute we arrived. Greater Houston had 21 Rigs in attendance!

The primary location was Skyline Ranch RV Park which was quickly filled and overflowed to the new Riverwalk RV Resort a couple of miles west on Highway 16. While parking and registration were underway Greater Houston members, Jerry Adams, Rick Elkins, Jim Feine, Paul Francis, John Fuselier, Jim Miller, David Petit, Raj Ramlal and Wayne Wilkerson set up the rally room and stage for the Opening Ceremony. It was a sight to see when the Presidents of all 10 Clubs in Region 9 presented their Flags. Introductions followed, including International President & First Lady, Eric & LaVerne McHenry, Bandera Mayor, Rebecca Gibson, and Master of Ceremonies, Fred Richardson of Texas Gulf Coast. A beer and wine swap were a huge hit and the perfect accompaniment to a couple of 8-foot pizzas baked in a massive outdoor oven by Dirt Road Cookers and crispy salad prepared by your Greater Houston Salad Masters, Lisa Feine (2nd VP), Terry Fuselier and Liza Wilkerson.

The only damage was to the fresh water tank, which was crushed. An amazing effort that was very much appreciated!

Day 2 opened with a hearty breakfast of sausage, eggs and pancakes cooked up by the Chefs from North Texas, Texas Gulf Coast, and Texas Alamo clubs and sponsored by Sean Crimmins of Carpe Aluminum. The coffee bar was set up and maintained each day by Shelly Tumino from East Texas Lakes. We are a

camping club, but once each year we bring the business details forward. The Annual Membership Meeting was included announcement of the Region Officer election results, updates from the Region Officers and Chairpersons, discussion from Region 9 President, Nancy Fitzgerald, and Eric McHenry, on the June 20th vote for changes to the International Constitutional, as well as updates from each of the ten Club Presidents. Leadership Training closed out the morning and everyone crafted their own school brownbag lunch before the Airstream Clinics took off on Maintenance on the Road (Jeff & Cindy McKee of Texas Alamo) Solar (Roy Bruner & Bill Poteet of Oklahoma), and Starlink (Eric McHenry of Greater Bay Area). Mid-afternoon featured a "Snackchat" with Eric McHenry fielding questions from the crowd. Then we loaded up and took the Rally to the 11th Street Cowboy Bar in Bandera. Here we cooked on massive charcoal grills and enjoyed country and western tunes from a live band followed by two-stepping the night away!

Since the opening of the Rally, raffle tickets were sold for Gift Baskets donated by each Club and themed for the President's hometown and state. GHAC's President, Rick Elkins, is from Waurika, OK known for its Watermelon harvest, annual Rattlesnake Hunt, and its high school football team, the Eagles, where President Rick was the quarterback during his High School heyday!

Tech Tip By Rick Elkins





C-Zone Digital Control and Monitoring.

This groundbreaking system (found in high-end Airstreams) allows users to control their travel trailer's amenities and other functions through a Wi-Fi or Bluetooth connection.

What happens when this system malfunctions such as the screen on the display "freezes" and will not change or reset? Given the importance of this central controller, actions have to be taken to restore operation as soon as possible.

At our May Rally a member reported that their C Zone had a frozen screen and was unresponsive. The usual reliable information sources found in the owner's manual, Airstream Forums, and general troubleshooting steps did not make a difference or change the screen.

We decided to contact "Airstream ER", or if you use his other name, Eric McMurphy. Fresh off using the key to his AS main door to open another member's door who had locked themselves out of their trailer, he agreed to come help.

Attempting to do a complete power reset was tried by opening the battery disconnect and disconnecting the Shore power. With both of these off the C-Zone still had power which was confusing. We then realized that AS battery disconnect does not interrupt the power to safety devices (CO₂, Smoke Detector or C Zone Controller). (Informed after the fact that there is a key disconnect switch for the C-Zone located in the bedroom, but when Eric tried to use it, the switch did not open the circuit, but rather the switch rotated in the wall....this was added to the needs fixing list).

In spite of removing the C Zone Controller from the wall, and disconnecting and reconnecting all connections, the C Zone Controller screen remained frozen. Airstream ER said we need to check at the battery and remove the cables from the positive battery post to try to reset. We did not understand how that would be different than just removing the connectors on the C Zone controller, but well, this is Airstream ER, so lead on.

Once at the battery, we found that cables connected to the battery positive post were not tight and in fact, were very loose with about a 1/8" gap between cables on the post. We quickly tightened the connection, plugged the cables back to the C Zone Controller and, well the rest is Airstream ER history. Sometimes the end of troubleshooting is finding the fix at the beginning (of our circuit in this case).

Great job and educational for all others.
