2024 International Rally Community Service Project


Dear Greater St. Louis Airstream Club members:

My "day job" is membership chair of the Greater St. Louis Airstream Club. Since Drew, my husband, and I have been Airstream Club International members, we have hosted annual local rallies. We love our St. Louis community and we love our state of Missouri.

When I was asked to be the Community Service Project chair, and heard who would be the recipient of this club's generous members, I jumped right on it!

Let me tell you about the Sedalia organization, Bothwell Regional Health Center Foundation. The foundation was formed in 2005 to assist the health center and provide resources to keep health care local, state-of-the-art and close to home.

The foundation resources make possible:



- 2. Disease prevention and health education for community health-care needs,
- 3. Recruiting and retaining the best medical staff for the area, and
- 4. Locally managed and community-owned health care.

Community support is the only other source of revenue for the health center. Through generous gifts from the community, the foundation is able to fund health projects that meet a variety of needs.

This is where we step up to the plate!

We, as the Airstream community, always want to leave the international rally town better than we arrived.

The foundation has in place three initiatives that we need your help and we know we all will embrace.

Personally, I am excited about having the international rally in October. Missouri will be colorful, with our trees changing to the fall colors. But, the one color most important to many of us Airstreamers is PINK!

The first part of our Community Service Project is PINKTOBER. I LOVE THIS! How many of us love Wally Byam's wife, Stella, and we have embraced her love for flamingos. We see those PINK flamingos every where. But, many of us have embraced PINK because of a club that we didn't chose to join...breast cancer! I am a breast cancer survivor and I know a number of the Greater St. Louis Airstream Club members are survivors.

A local bank, Central Bank of Sedalia, has partnered with the foundation to sell teeshirts, with proceeds going to support the health center breast cancer center. The center provides free mammograms, gas cards to those who need help with getting to the center for treatments, etc. There will be pink teeshirts, with our international rally logo (so we all will have souvenirs), but we will have plenty of charcoal grey shirts for our husbands who have supported us girls.

There will be some teeshirts available for sale at the rally for \$20 each.





Be sure to bring a pair of blue jeans to the rally, because Wednesday, October 9, will be Blue Jeans Day at the health center and we will be asking everyone to wear their teeshirts and blue jeans to the October 9 band concert. What a sea of PINK (and charcoal grey) we will have to show our support for Sedalia and breast cancer.

The second part of this Community Service Project with the foundation is the health center is renovating their patient rooms. The health center was built in 1985 and is in need of updating and modernizing.

With every \$10,000 donated to this effort, a patient room will be dedicated to the donor. I fully plan to have a room at the Sedalia health center dedicated to the 67th Airstream International Club rally! What do you think? Are you with me? Bring your checkbook and let's make this happen!

The third part of this Community Service Project with the foundation is their Patients Assistance Fund. Any money we collect at the rally, above \$10,000, will go to this fund. This financial assistance covers the costs of prescriptions, Ensure, grocery gift cards, CPAP machines, stuff animals for the littlest of patients, etc.

I am so excited about being a part of this project. You don't need to shop and bring something with you to Sedalia! Just be sure you have a lot of money in your checking account! I promise that I will even have a pen at the table, so you don't have to worry about bringing a pen!

On a side note, we are excited to announce that the Future Streamers Intra-Club are collecting pop tabs to help raise funds for the Ronald McDonald House Charities in Kansas City, MO. Please start collecting as many pop tabs as you can from rallies, home, work and even your neighbors. You can bring them to the international rally in Sedalia. This is a great opportunity to give back to the community and support a good cause. Remember, our children (Future Streamers) are giving back to other children, and pop tabs are easy to collect when you are on the road. Let's show our love for aluminum and make a difference together!

And, side note #2, if you have been knitting or crocheting those beanies, please, please, please bring them with you. Those of us whom have lost our hair during chemo, we know how cold our heads can get. We will donate those beanies to the breast cancer center. They can always use them!
