"The Dark Side of the Moon Rally" - An Experience of a Lifetime by Paula Rosenbusch

Otto and I were in Kentucky traveling through the "Kentucky Bourbon Trail" in our 25' 2013 Airstream Flying Cloud when on Sunday. April 7. our plans to continue on to spend a week in the Smoky Mountains suddenly changed. We needed to start heading to our home in Michigan.

We knew we needed to stop somewhere halfway and remembered that the "The Darke Side Of The Moon Airstream National Rally" was going on at the Darke County Fairground in Greenville. Ohio. The forecast for the upcoming eclipse was projected to have complete visability as well as to be in the 100% totality zone in that area. In that moment, we knew we needed to see if we could make this happen.

I reached out to Fred Bryant. President of the Michigan Airstream Club (MAC). to inquire as to if it was even a possibility to join him and the other Airstreamers at the "Darkside Of The Moon Airstream National Rally" event in Greenville. Ohio. Since we had just recently joined the Airstream International Club and the Michigan Airstream Club (MAC). we had not yet met Fred and this would be our very first rally.

Fred responded almost immediately and was overjoyed at the opportunity to include us with the other members of the Michigan Airstream Club [MAC]. We were thrilled! We set out on our five hour journey north to join Fred and the other Airstreamer's for the total eclipse of the sun that was happening the very next

day on Monday, April 8, 2024.

When Otto and I lived in Stuttgart. Germany in 1999. I had the opportunity to partake in this communal experience with hundreds of other people for the total eclipse of the sun. I happened upon the hillside behind our home where hundreds of people had gathered to witness this event together. There was joyous conversation and frivolity. as we all sat together in anticipation of this upcoming phenomena.

As I sat on the hillside, the long shadow was cast by the moon as it was covering the sun and darkness began to descend upon the land. As the darkness approached us, the hillside went completely silent as we all sat in utter amazement. I felt completely connected to those around me, to the land, to the sky and to Mother Nature as we shared this communal experience together. It touched my heart deeply and I knew I had just experienced something deeply mystical and magical. It completely changed my life.

On June 29, 1966, the 9th International Rally was held in the small town of Cadillac, Michigan. A whopping 2828 Airstreams gathered for a week just south of the Wexford County Airport and was said to be one of the largest rally. According to WBCCI/WBAC Historian, Joe Peplinksi in an article written for the Blue Beret in February 2018:

"The nearly 10.000 attendees doubled Cadillac's population for the duration of the rally! The rally theme was 'Funderland' to highlight the promise of fun in all of Michigan's wonderlands, including lakes Cadillac & Mitchell, just a short distance from the rally site."



In Memory of Dorothy Hoekwater (November 26, 1927- February 1, 2024)

For the last several Michigrams, I have eulogized former Michigan Unit members of WBCCI. All those I have written about more recently: Ken Briggs, Barb Carlson, Dave Carlson, Evelyn Guth and Dale Webster were all devoted Airstreamers who enjoyed camping. We say, "roughing it smoothly."

Right when I think I am through writing eulogies. someone dies that I feel must be honored. I am sitting in front of our computer thinking about a classy lassie, forever young at heart...Dorothy Irene Hoekwater.

Ken and Dorothy Hoekwater joined the Michigan Unit of WBCCI in 1985, the same year my dad and mom joined. The first President of the Michigan Unit was elected in 1957. Thirty-six years later, in 1993, Dorothy was elected President of the Unit. She was the first woman to be elected to that prestigious position. My mom wrote a poem about Dorothy being the rose between two buds, Bud Patenge and Bud Quick, who served as presidents in 1992 and 1994, respectively.

At rallies and/or caravans I often wear the same jeans for the whole event, wear shoes that are super comfortable but ugly and tie my hair back in a ponytail with little concern about my appearance. I do wear sunscreen. At night I like brushing my teeth at the campground latrine; a routine I shared for years with my close Airstream friend. Alice Taylor.

Dorothy was just the opposite. Not only was she kind, soft-spoken and humorous, but she was fashionable, always dressed to the nines. Her hair always looked perfect. She just had it all together. For me, she was to be emulated.

In Memory of Dorothy Hoekwater (November 26, 1927- February 1, 2024).

Hoekwaters were members of WBCCI for twenty-five years or more. Still active members in 2007, Dorothy and Ken were the caravan leaders for the 50th International Airstream Rally in Perry, Georgia. Jeriel and I joined the Unit in 2006. We were blessed to be on that caravan. Hoekwaters were from Traverse

City. They named the caravan. "Cherry Land to Peach Land."

First impressions are always so pivotal and influential in forming one's opinion. We were so positively influenced. We loved it.

From that point on, we were all in: completely enthralled with the Michigan Unit Airstream family. Hoekwaters were born leaders: involved with rallies, etc. They led several caravans, three overseas.

Ken lives at Shell Point in Ft. Myers. Florida where they moved in 2011. Dorothy was 96 when she passed. Ken is a couple years older than

Dorothy was. "They" say being physically active and staying socially involved helps one live longer. They prove that theory to be true.

There is so much more I could write. I haven't mentioned their personal life or family. They lived on a sailboat for two years and sailed on the Great Lakes. They cruised the Mississippi River, to Florida, up the coast to Maine and then to the Bahamas. After their extended sailing days were over, they bought their land yacht, an Airstream, and joined WBCCI. Dorothy wrote a book about their life on the water titled, My Home Afloat.

Dorothy was an amazing lady. She was special inside and out. Jeriel and I sincerely value being included in their circle of Airstream friends. They will never be forgotten.

There is Music in the Air(stream) by Jeriel Beard

One of the highlights of the WBCCI International Rallies is the Band. The conductors and the members are all volunteers. The current historian of our WBAC. Joe Peplinski told me the Archives do not have much history about the Band. He sent me some of the reports from the early years of the Rallies. Below is what I gleaned from the reports to give you a flavor of how the Band developed over time and share my experiences as a band member.

RALLY # 5, 1962. Auburn. WA—The Auburn High School Band played for the Opening Ceremonies as the Boy Scout Troop raised the U.S. Flag.

RALLY #6, 1963. Bemidji. MN—Music was provided by the local high school band.

RALLY #8, 1965. Princeton, NJ—The WBCCI "teens" formed a dance band which played every night in the "Teen Tent."

RALLY #9, 1966—Cadillac, MI—The Don GillIman Trio played for all the Ballroom Dancing.

RALLY #10, 1967—Santa Rosa, CA—No band was mentioned. However, in a tent having an area of 40,000 square feet, there was a church choir with 5,000 Airstreamers attending the service.

RALLY #11, 1968—Hastings. NE—A Czech Boys Polka Dance Band and a 90 voice public school boys chorus performed.

RALLY #12, 1969—Laramie, WY—Laramie High School Plainsman Marching Band played for the Opening Ceremony.

RALLY #13, 1970—Hershey, PA—Featured a Talent Program with the Carlisle High School Marching Band. **RALLY #18, 1975**—Brandon, Manitoba, Canada—The World Famous Manitoba Pipes and Drums Band and the Canadian Forces Training Command Band performed.

Some years later, the WBCCI developed its own Band. One of the early conductors was Bob Griswold who had directed the U.S. Marine Band in Washington, D.C. for 18 years.

RALLY #50, 2007—Perry, GA—Our first experience with the International Band. We had received a welcome letter from our "sponsors" who played in the Band.

Monday. 25 June—A friend from Travelers Rest Resort. Dick Bartram took me to the location where the Dance Band was rehearsing. I met Gloria Cooksey, the librarian, who gave me a folder containing my concert band music. I was welcomed warmly by the conductor, John Landry. I practiced all the music that evening.

Tuesday, 26 June—I rehearsed with the Band. One of the baritone players in my section was a 10 year old, 7th grade girl, Alyson who was the daughter of a clarinetist.

Wednesday, 27 June—The Band rehearsed for "flag practice" and played that evening for the Opening Ceremony.

Thursday, 27 June—Some of us rode through the large campground on a tram while playing 2 Sousa marches, "Liberty Bell" and "El Capitan." We received enthusiastic applause when we passed the MI Unit during Happy Hour.

Friday, 28 June—The Band rehearsed most of the afternoon and played a concert that evening.

Tuesday. 3 July—The Band played Elgar's "Pomp and Circumstance" processional and a march for the Installation of Officers.

Wednesday. 4 July—The Band played marches during the Independence Day Parade and performed that evening for the Closing Ceremony.

RALLY #51, 2008-Bozeman. Montana State University

Sunday, 15 June—There was a Band orientation at the site of John Landry's Airstream. At Perry I had not played in the Dance Band, but I did at Bozeman. I played the baritone in the Concert Band which

rehearsed in the mornings and trombone in the Dance Band rehearsals in the afternoons.

Saturday. 28 June—The Band played for flag practice and the evening Opening Ceremony followed by the first Dance.

Monday. 30 June—The annual concert was performed.

Friday, 4 July—The Band played at 4:00 p.m. at the Parade and the Closing Ceremony following the evening entertainment.

For several summers, the Concert Band was directed by Mrs. Barbara Lambrecht.

RALLY #59, 2016-Lewisburg, W. VA

Tuesday, 14 June–Band orientation

Wednesday, 15 June—The 3-hour rehearsal was initiated with "warm-up" breathing and musical exercises. In spite of disastrous floods, drownings and power failures, the rehearsals continued.

Tuesday, 28 June—The Band played for the Opening Exercises.

Wednesday, 29 June–Dress rehearsal for the Concert

Thursday, 30 June-The annual Concert was performed.

Sunday, 3 July—The Band played a Benefit Concert on the lawn downtown. The proceeds were donated for families suffering from the flood.

The Installation Ceremony for the new officers was that evening.

Friday, 4 July—The Band played for the Parade.

RALLY #62, 2019—Doswell, VA—Home of famous race horse, Secretariat. The Rally was much different for the Band. Instead of going directly to Doswell, the Band members paid to stay 4 nights to attend "Pre-Camp" rehearsals.

Wednesday, 10 July—Arrival at Small Country Campground.

Saturday. 13 July—First rehearsal early Saturday a.m. Our conductor was energetic Greg Heuer [HOY-er] who is a graduate of the University of Michigan School of Music.


