



LAST MINUTE ON 15TH INTERNATIONAL RALLY **FROM** PRESIDENT SCHILHANECK

TO ALL "RALLY-BOUND" members here are some last minute reminders: LADIES you are reminded that again this year we will use our new system of waste water (dish and bath) disposal. Waste water will be carried from your trailers in plastic pipe. PLEASE be very careful not to let anything other than bath and dish water down your drains. Coffee grounds, vegetable matter and grease will clog these pipes and cause a great deal of discomfort for everyone.

RALLY FEE: Have your \$25 rally fee ready in either cash or travelers checks when you arrive at the entry gate. Remember the correct amount will speed up the details. Also, if you plan to attend the Rally without your trailer, you must pay the \$25 rally fee. This will entitle you to the same privileges as those who are staying on the grounds.

MEMBERSHIP CARD: Have your International Membership Card ready upon arrival at the entry gate. Having to search for it will cause delay, or result in your being pulled out of your place in line. Please cooperate and help speed up the procedure.

PHYSICIANS and NURSES: Please check in with Dr. Robert Rice #7574 at the First Aid Station in the Central Area upon arrival. If you have not signed up to help, do so immediately. WE NEED YOU!

COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN, DELEGATES and ALTERNATES: Check in at the Administration Office as soon as possible after you arrive.

UNIT PRESIDENTS: Have you urged your members and officers to attend the KNOW YOUR CLUB

sessions? Is someone from your unit bringing a display of your newsletters, roster, flyers, etc. for display at the KNOW YOUR CLUB programs? Have your DELEGATES and ALTERNATES been given their credentials? Have they been instructed as to your members wishes? Do you have your STATE or OFFICER FLAG and PARADE FLAG POLE ready for Opening Ceremonies? Do all of your members have the official WBCCI badges and berets? All of the children need them also. Does your unit have an entry in the 4th of July Parade, the Skit Contest, the Driving Contest? Have you sent your entries to the chairmen in charge?

CHECKER PLAYERS: Bring your checker sets and check your program for time and place.


MUSICIANS: Bring your Band instruments along - the Band plans lots of activity and fun for this Rally.
