Constitution

Article IV Sec. I add;

(a) All past presidents upon completion of their term as chairman of the Board of Directors shall become honorary members of the Executive Board in a advisory capacity only.

Article VIII Sec. 2 Add.
(After) two-thirds majority vote of the Units International Dues paying members.

Article III Sec. 2 Delete for the following;
All applications for membership in the Unit will be reviewed by the
Executive Board at a regular meeting of the board and if found valid
will be presented to the Unit membership at the next monthly meeting
for acceptance.

The Board of Directors 90 days prior to the annual business meeting shall add balance of section 1


Article V Section 8 of By-Laws

Any Unit officer or member of the Board of Directors who without justifiable cause is absent for 2 consecutive unit meetings or fails to attend a total of 9 unit meetings during his term of office will be subject to removal from office.

- (a) Any officer or member of the board of directors prior to being removed from office for violation of Section 8 or any other justifiable cause will be given a hearing by the Executive Board with a minimum of 7 members present prior to any action being taken.
- (b) The officer or director will be notified by registered letter of the charges, time and place of hearing at least 20 days prior to the hearing.
- (c) If by a majority vote the executive board finds justifiable cause for removal of said officer or director they will present their findings to the unit membership for a vote of the membership present at a regular unit meeting.
- (d) A majority vote of 2/3 of the members present at this meeting for removal of said officer or director will remove said officer or director from office and he will be so notified by registered letter.
- (e) All voting in Section 8c and 8d will be by secret ballot.

CODE OF CONDUCT

CHARTER OAK CONN. UNIT



- 1. Always be courteous and considerate of others.
- 2. When traveling on the highway stay within safe legal limits. Maintain a safe distance between rigs so as not to impeed the normal flow of traffic. Pull off to the right at first opportunity and permit cars to pass.
- Sites and Parking Areas:
 - a. No litter or trash will be thrown on the ground.
 - b. All sites and meeting areas will be left in a better condition then found at arrival.
 - c. All holes dug for stabelizing jacks etc. will be refilled and tamped.
 - d. When using gopher holes keep hole tightly covered at all times and take all possible precautions to prevent overflow. When leaving fill and tamp hole, level ground if possible.

4. Noise:

- a. All members will be considerate of their fellow trailorists or campers by keeping the volume of radios, TVs, etc., at a level that will not disturb others.
- b. Children should use designated play areas and be refrained from playing games around the trailers to avoid excessive noise in the area and possible damage to equipment or trailers.

5. Pets:

- a. All pets are to be kept on a leash and are not to be allowed to run loose.
- b. No pets are to be left secured or tied outside the trailer while owners are not in the area.
- c. All owners must clean up after their pets.
- d. Pets must not be allowed to chase or harass wild life.

CODE OF CONDUCT (continued)

- 6. Wild life and Property:
 - a. Parents will be responsible for the action of their children towards wild life and the property of others.
 - b. No one will cut firewood unless prior permission has been obtained from the owner of the property or his designated agent.
- 7. Equipment The following are essential for happy and cooperate rally living:
 - a. Two 25' lengths of water hose (5/8" at least) plus two y's.
 - b. Two water pails (one for fresh water and one for drain water).
 - c. One hundred feet of heavy duty electric cord (#12 wire) with pigtail or junction box.
 - d. All borrowed equipment should be returned to the owner of the equipment prior to his leaving the rally.
- 8. General conduct:
 - a. In order to maintain a good image to our fellow travelers, all bottles containing alcoholic beverages or liquor, must be kept inside the trailers except during "potluck" dinners, etc.

Alcoholic beverages may be consumed outside the trailer from glasses, cups, etc.

Wine tasting and other events may be held providing prior approval has been obtained from the executive board.

- b. Remember the old saying "Little pitchers have big ears" and refrain from obscenity or adult jokes when children are present.
- c. Any action or deed by a member of this unit, or a visiting member, that would tend to impair the morals profour minor unit members, will not be allowed and might result in loss of membership from this unit.
- d. DO NOT abuse committee workers. They are volunteers giving their time to help you have a good time.

Always offer to help when needed. Remember ours is a community project. The more you give the more you receive.


