President's Corner



Hello Everyone,

I'm writing this while sitting in our Airstream at Jackson Center. Airstream, Inc. is allowing our club's Board of Trustees to hold a Strategy Session at their beautiful facilities.

This is the time that we discuss what course correction that we feel needs to be made in both the short term and long term to maintain Member Value.

The Board of Trustees unanimously supports sending the following change to the membership for a vote. Our finances have grown and need more than a "Treasurer" to help advise and guide us to keep the club's financial wellbeing intact. Currently a Treasurer is picked from the member of the Council voted in by the membership. The issue that we see that can happen is that we don't always have a member on the Council with the financial expertise needed.

In early June a ballot for a constitutional change will be sent to the membership. A YES vote will change the position of Treasurer to Financial Director. The Financial Director will not be picked from the Council. The club will come up with a list of qualified candidates using a similar process as it does for Council members. The International Board of Trustees will then vote to fill this position from that list. Since this new position will not be voted in by the membership this will be a NON-voting position on the Board. A NO vote will leave things the way they are currently structured.

Here is the key point. Because this is a Constitutional Vote it takes 20% of the membership to VOTE, or the results will not count. Now, 20% sounds like an easy target, but the last vote by the membership, less than 19% of the membership voted. SO HERE IT IS: VOTE Yes or No, but please VOTE!!!!! You will receive a ballot around June 1 so please watch for it and then vote.

Okay, the camping season is close. I'm excited to see a lot of you next month at The Eclipse National Rally. (There are still a few sites available, so if thinking about joining us, go online and register or reach out to me)

The Region 4 Community Service Rally is at the end of May, and we still have room for more. Mike and I have decided that we would like to thank the volunteers at this rally by having the region sponsor the campground. Let us know if you want to join us. See Jamie's article below.

Mike and I are looking forward to visiting a lot of the Local Clubs this season. We know there are lots of rallies planned for the next several months.

When we went to the ACI website (<u>airstreamclub.org</u>) to make our schedule, we found that some of the Local Clubs don't have any events listed.



Fill up with water when you get to the campground and empty your tanks. 30 Amp power, only, provided for each rig.

These group sites rent from Wednesday to the following Tuesday. The "Official" Rally will be for arriving Wednesday and departing on Sunday. However, you can stay longer and depart on Tuesday, if you like.




