

Tech Talk

Replacing the converter in your Airstream may be easier than you think.

On March 30th, knowing that our first camping trip would be the 24th of April, I stopped by our 2018 Flying Cloud just to be sure everything was working properly.

The first thing I checked was the voltage on the trailer, to my surprise the voltage meter read 10.5 volts. Knowing I just installed 2 new DURACELL AGM batteries a few weeks before, I knew there was a major problem. The voltage on the trailer batteries should be anywhere from 12.1 to 13.6 volts if the battery converter was working properly. I now knew the converter had to be replaced.

I'm not a licensed electrician, however, I do know that electricity is dangerous, so making sure my shore power to the trailer was disconnected along with the batteries were very important.

After confirming there was absolutely no power going to the trailer, I then began to check all the fuses and connections to see if I could find the problem. All seemed to be fine at that point, so I knew the airstream needed a new converter. I then made a few phone calls to RV dealers in the area to see if they could do the repair and give me an average quote. I found out quickly that the average price to replace a converter was between \$500 to \$650 Installed. That seemed to be very expensive, so I decided to see just how much a replacement converter would cost. I then googled it online and found the average price for the converter with no installation was \$200.00.

The power source in most of our Airstreams is the WFCO power unit. The model number on the unit in my trailer is Model WF-8955PEC-J. I went on Amazon and looked up converters for my model number. According to Amazon, the replacement for my converter was number WFCO WF-8955-AD-MBA which was an upgrade to the one that was currently in the trailer. The price of the converter was \$200.95. The AD-MBA upgrade converter automatically detects what type of batteries are installed on your Airstream trailer (Lead acid, AGM or Lithium) when connected. If you're looking to save up to \$400.00 and want to see just how easy it is to install the new upgraded converter, go to YouTube and type in: (Bradley Gane Replace wf-8955 RV Converter) the video is only 2 minutes long. After looking at this video, I was extremely surprised to see how easy it was to replace. Only 4 screws and 5 wires. It took only 20 minutes to install. The converter is now working perfectly. The nice part of this repair is the next time the trailer needs a new set of batteries, I will purchase lithium, knowing now I have the correct converter for lithium type batteries. Hope this information helped.



History of Scusset Beach and our Club- Present Day

A little history of the Cape Cod Club and Scusset Beach. Many of us have been meeting at Scusset Beach Reservation for rendezvous for last several years and many of us know the Reserve America reservation platform is never a guarantee of insuring a spot in state parks as popular as Scusset Beach. To add to that out of states fees are prohibitive for many folks in most State Park systems and Massachusetts is no exception.

The Scusset Beach Boondocking Rally was the result of several months of planning and working with MA DCR (Dept. of Conservation & Recreation) and Scusset Beach Reservation Staff by Cole Pirelli (new member) to secure the Safari Field and Pavilion. Cole also secured sponsorship from Major's RV in Bourne, logistics, signage for the rally, while Kristyn put together goody bags for all. I want to "Thank" them both for providing a great event for the Club and hope they will continue to Host in the future. "Thank You for a great time!"

Hi Cole,

Thank you, Cole and Kristyn for a delightful weekend on the Cape Cod Canal. It is heartwarming to see younger couples like yourselves taking such leadership roles in our club!

In our conversations with Eddie Carll, we were trying to put a historical connection to the group use field at Scusset Beach Park and the Cape Cod Massachusetts Airstream Club over the years. This field had originally been known as the ballfield and I was told that the Airstream group was the first to be given permission to dry camp on the field. The first year I have records for this is 1988. I believe all the permission was granted to Arnold Marshall from the New England Unit. For some 20 plus years it was a mainstay for the New England and Cape Cod Units to have sole use of the field on either the 3rd or 4th weekend of June. Attached is the "Blue Beret Directory" listing for rallies (rendezvous) for both clubs in 1988. Also, the May 1988 "Cape Cod Capers" newsletter with its information sheet stating it would be on the ballfield.

This location was a favorite with our family when growing up in our 17-foot 1970 Caravel Airstream. To this day both of our kids have fond memories of the annual ride with their bikes down to the Canal bike path to the Sagamore bridge and having the big pancake breakfast at McDonalds at the old Sagamore Circle. The first photos that I found with my family's involvement were from 1990. Yes, the "babe" in the pictures is Kathy along with our kids Brian and Megan.

Hope this helps putting a historical spin on a favorite Cape Cod rally site.


