A trip to remember! by Chris and John Millard (Part 2 of 3)

Hello everyone and welcome to late June, early July. In case you missed it from last month we were just entering PEI following an epic adventure from our home in South Surrey to the Bay of Fundy in New Brunswick. Well, what a great month it has been since then. To begin with PEI was windier than expected but nevertheless quaint and beautiful with its own charm. From visiting Anne of Green Gables to playing golf overlooking the ocean the magnificent views never stopped. For three days we boondocked at a boondockers welcome host in north-central PEI. Staying with the owners on their 100 acre farm was wonderful. We spent two evenings with them in their home which had been handed down for four generations. We found it interesting that many people in PEI live in the same area, or on the same property for generations. They were great hosts and local historians. If you get a chance, join Harvest Hosts as you can certainly benefit in many ways when travelling.

We left PEI via the ferry and made our way to Halifax. We stayed just north west of the city for 5 nights. We drove into Halifax several times to visit the Maritime museum, Pier 21, the Immigration museum and Dalhousie University. My parents met and were married there, my Dad was stationed there during the war and my mother worked as a dietitian at Dalhousie. Of special note was the maritime museum which housed numerous large scale model steam powered ships, as well as information and pictures of the Halifax explosion and some artifacts from the titanic.

Following Halifax we drove to Lunenburg and camped just within the city limits. We visited the town, its various shops etc. and had a look at the Bluenose 2. On one excursion we headed to Peggy's Cove and then picked up two live lobsters on our return. We cooked them up that night and enjoyed a beautiful meal. The next day we had enough for some delicious lobster rolls as well, what a treat!

On to Cape Bretton and the Cabot trail for a few days of camping and exploring the area. The views were spectacular however the road was extremely steep in places (up to 18%). We wondered why there were very few trailers around the northern stretch. The advantage however was that we were able to spend more time meeting the local fisherman and residents. Fort Louisburg was a highlight of Cape Bretton. The history of early Canada and what the Acadians endured was quite something indeed.

Two days of travel took us to Bar Harbour in Maine. We had no problems at the border but noticed a mechanical issue with the truck. At the time of writing this we have diagnosed the problem (broken manifold bolt) and will hopefully be able to deal with it when we get home. Today we spent a lovely day in Bar Harbour walking the streets ending up in a wonderful Irish Pub. Over the next few days we will be exploring the Acadia National Forest.

Note: while in Canada we purchased two National Park Passes (one for each of us) and used them extensively in the Maritimes. In Bar Harbour we purchased an American the Beautiful Pass (one per vehicle) which we plan to utilize over the coming year.

It is late June and to facilitate getting this in to Arlene in time we will stop here and continue the rest of our journey next month.





We have new B.C. Airstream Club crests using the design work of Marilyn VanIderstine and Tom Akam (and approved by International).






