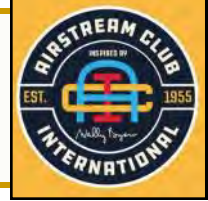

B.C. Caravan and Region 10 Rally

The Caravan

We joined the B.C. Caravan at the KOA in Leavenworth, Washington. What a change from our previous visits there! There is so much more development nearby, including a transit hub and a convenient Safeway store with associated Starbucks outlet. Our first day had lovely weather and we really enjoyed using the campground's patio furniture for our Happy Hour gathering. Karen Griffin and Rick Mattson are wonderful hosts, and they greeted us with shortbread cookies delightfully decorated in the shape of trailers and flamingoes. The next day proved very wet all day, which was a disappointment, but we got out the boots and umbrellas and explored the many fascinating shops with their German themed goods. We even enjoyed the music of a German-style band and alp-horn players at the covered band stand. With only 6 of us, we had our Happy Hour in our trailer, then we all went to the Baren Haus restaurant for a delicious German-style dinner of schnitzel, sausages, red cabbage, etc.

On to Wilbur, Washington, a tiny town in mid-eastern Washington. The campground was clean and well-organized, but it was strange to have to set up our sewer hose before the power and water hookups, and to drive the trailer over the sewer hole. Another cool night, so we had Happy Hour/Dinner celebrating Cinco de Mayo in Rick and Karen's trailer. Quesadillas, devilled eggs, and the like were the order of the day. The next day Rick and Barry played 9 holes of golf at a nearby course, and Karen, Trenor, and I drove to see the presentations at the Grand Coulee Dam – they had interesting displays, and fascinating movies. Craig and Tracey also visited the dam site, but we also stopped at the Lake to take a short hike. We were chased off the hike by some rain, and subsequently were hit by a short hailstorm nearby in the truck. Karen so enjoyed the day that she and Rick (along with her brother, Eddie) were going there after the Region 10 Rally. Upon our return to the campsite, we were treated to a delicious fish fry with Halibut and Cod caught by Karen and Rick along with sides provided by the rest of us.

Our last stop on this short Caravan was arriving a day early at Blackwell Island, just over the bridge from Coeur D'Alene, Idaho. This Region 10 Rally was Trenor's and my first big rally, so we were eager to soak up as much as we could. Our first evening, we went to the Cedars Restaurant, and we were in a floating room over Lake Coeur D'Alene. Trenor celebrated his 80th birthday in style with yummy Beef Prime Rib, his favourite, perfectly cooked.

The Rally

The Rally provided lots of time for meeting new people and connecting with people we had met before. It was super to see Paul and Sharon Lindstrom from Montana who had been on the Vancouver Island Caravan with us last September. We also re-connected with Karen Sousa and Jane Kass-Wolff, our neighbours at the Potlatch Rally at Land Yacht Harbor last summer.

As far as activities at the Rally, we had fabulous weather for the boat cruise on the Lake Coeur D'Alene, took time to explore the many shops along Sherman Avenue in the historic town, and even had a hamburger lunch at the Hudson's lunch counter. It was fascinating to watch the chef form the burger patties with his left hand, squish them with his flipper, and then so quickly transfer them to the hot grill. At the rally itself, we had hotdogs the first night, a fabulous Italian meal (prepared by Michelle and Don Paris, they are Oregon Airstream Club members and she is a retired chef), and a catered Mexican meal, along with several continental breakfasts (coffee cake and coffee/tea), and a pancakes and sausages breakfast one morning.

A highlight of the rally was the two-hour boat cruise where we saw many lovely homes, some of which are only accessible by water and require trams to bring goods up to the house. There was also a golf course with a floating hole that must be reached in two shots.

A personal highlight of the trip was going into "The Hitching Post", a small wedding chapel where Barry Hook's parents were married 90 years ago this year. Another lucky couple were preparing to take the plunge as we chatted with the woman at the entrance. They did not have records prior to the mid-1960s, but Barry already has a copy of their marriage certificate.

Club's responsibilities at the Rally were centred around the Silent Auction, which was to provide funds for the Coeur D'Alene Union Gospel Mission Crisis Centre for Women and Children. We had been working with Christine Tucker from Washington over the phone and with Zoom meetings, so it was good to finally meet her in person. As people arrived for the rally on the 8th of May, we took in over 120 items to be auctioned. Thanks to Charli Westerfield's packing acumen, we were able to store the items in a small shed before the auction on the 11th. More items arrived on the 11th, so that we were providing over 150 items for the silent auction, including some stays at beach homes, numerous themed baskets, many wine bottles, a double camping chair and stemless wine glasses from Traveland, our club's B.C./Canada picnic basket, etc. In addition, some products arranged by Steve from the Idaho club were put up for a raffle, and the lovely table centres (29 of them) made by Tim McPhee were sold. The Silent Auction brought in over \$7500 (USD) and the total amount raised was \$11,000 (USD). We are proud of the amount raised, and we know that it will be much appreciated. Many thanks to all the B.C. Club members and affiliates that helped in so many ways with this project.

Overall, the rally had many fun moments, and we really enjoyed meeting friends and making new friends. There is talk of another rally at the same site in 2025, and we would recommend that you keep watching the newsletter regarding registration for that rally. Keep in mind that the 2024 rally was fully filled within 26 minutes of the booking site being opened.

A trip to remember!

On May 1st 2024, we set out on an epic adventure (epic for us) from our home in South Surrey to the east coast of Canada and then down into Maine. The following is a brief summary of our journey. We decided to travel through the United States for the first part of our journey to decrease our fuel costs, also because we had previously crossed Canada to Toronto many times. So, we set out through Washington and Montana mostly on the I-90. We also planned to boondock much of the way as we recently upgraded our lithium solar power system. For the record the upgrade proved extremely advantageous as we were able to track our power use via Bluetooth. Lithium is clearly much better than I had imagined.

We found that many campgrounds and rest stops were closed which made finding a place to stay each evening somewhat challenging. The scenery along the I-90 was amazing and we were surprised how varied and hilly much of the terrain was as opposed to driving across the flat prairies of Canada. A couple of challenging events included stopping at Buffalo Gap National Park in South Dakota where we were introduced to newly hatched ticks, and head winds of over 80 km for 2-1/2 days courtesy of the Oklahoma twisters.

The winds even unfurled our awning despite us tying it down. Later with help from a roll of t-rex tape we repaired it as best we could and carried on. Surprisingly, in Fargo, North Dakota we boondocked at a Cracker Barrel and met several other Airstreamers from the Maine club that were heading to Alaska (small world indeed). After 8 long days of driving we arrived in Sault St Marie and stayed at an Elks Lodge campground overlooking the locks. From there we headed towards North Bay and overnighted at a casino. The amazing part of this is as we were driving around back of the casino we encountered our first moose.

On to Ottawa, Montreal, and Quebec Cities for a week of sightseeing. The Parliament Buildings in Ottawa were wonderful to see as was old Montreal. We even had a chance to see one of John's childhood homes in St. Anne de Bellvue (west Montreal) where he lived as a child and the local locks. If you haven't been to Quebec City it is a must stop. We stayed in a campground in Nevis, Quebec which worked out perfectly as we took the ferry each day across the river to old Quebec. Should you decide to stay here with your Airstream we would highly recommend the Camping Transit campground south of the city.

We continued on to New Brunswick as we really wanted to experience the famous Fundy extreme tide changes. We stayed at Fundy National Park. Windy all of the time but none the less quite beautiful. As it is now late May we are headed on to PEI over the next week and will report on this in episode 2. We hope you have enjoyed a brief snippet of our adventure so far. We have learned after travelling this far (approximately 4000 miles) that Airstreams are really designed as a tool to help you get out, enjoy the journey and to see and experience new places, people and things. We are truly blessed to have been given this opportunity to experience this wonderful country of ours with our trusty Peggy (1973 overlander) in tow.

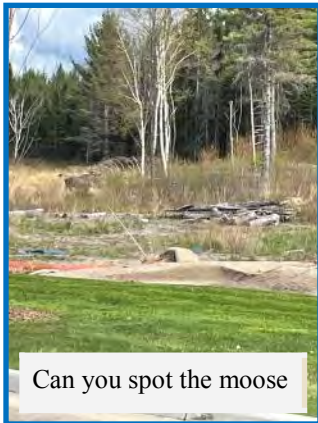

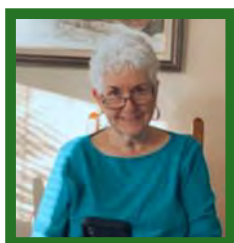

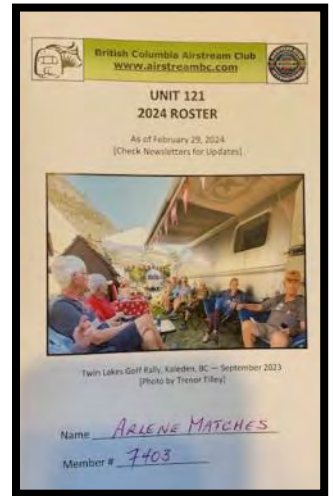
