### Ray Schmitt Passing

The board members of Region 10 announce the peaceful passing on May 25th of Ray Schmitt, longtime treasurer of Region 10 and past president of the Montana club. He was 81 years old.

Ray and his wife Eglina's involvement in the Airstream community has been a long one. They bought their first Airstream from an acquaintance shortly after they moved to Florida while their two children (Ryan and Kay) were young. Their goal was to expose the children to the adventures of outdoor living while exploring Florida and the surrounding states. Years later when Ray's parents retired, Ray and Eglina sold the Airstream to them and his parents used it to travel around the country, mostly full time. His parents were the first to discover the Wally Byam Caravan club and became avid members. The stories they told Ray and about WBCCI and travel Eglina brought them back to Airstream when

they retired and they decided to travel themselves. They purchased a 2010 27ft Classic Limited and joined the Montana unit in 2011. Over the years, they camped/traveled over 100,000 miles. Eventually, Ray and Eglina split their residence time between Marion, Montana and Hillsboro, TX where they resided in the North Texas Airstream Community. This, of course, was when they were not traveling in their rig.

Ray's career in accounting prompted him to use those skills to support various organizations to which he belonged, including the Airstream Club. Ray liked to pretend he was a serious guy but, in our experience, he wasn't so serious as he loved both receiving and sending jokes. He loved his family and spoke highly of his wife, children, and grandchildren. He will be missed in the Airstream community.

He is survived by his wife, Eglina, his son, Ryan (Jill) and their three daugh-

ters, and his daughter, Kay Hawkins (Dan) and their two sons.
