President's Message

In the last edition of The Streamer, I asked "have you ever been curious about the Oregon Airstream Club Board of Directors or considered running for a board position?"

The OAC annual election to add new members to our board is coming up and we are actively seeking candidates for our Vice President and a Director positions. If you are interested in learning more about joining the board or are considering running for an open position, please reach out to me, or our nominating committee chair Cindy Muir or our 1VP Rachel Collins. We will install our new board at the Fall Bounty Rally - October 17-20, 2024.

On a related topic, I sent an all-club email in June about the vote on a proposal to amend the Airstream Club International (ACI) / Wally Byam Caravan Club International (WBCCI) Constitution to define and create a Finance Director role. I asked Kathy Geese, member of the ACI Executive Council and member of our local club, for a recap of the voting and she shared this overview.

Thank you to all who participated in the recent vote on the proposal to amend the ACI/WBCCI Constitution. The OAC always ranks highly in members who are engaged, understand the issues, and vote! You taking the time to vote is greatly appreciated. As you may or may not be aware, the constitution mandates that 20% of members must vote, with a two-thirds majority of those voting required for a proposal to pass. 36% of WBCCI members voted in this election. I am pleased to announce that the proposal passed with an overwhelming 87% in favor and 13% against.

This amendment was crucial as our organization, with its \$2 million budget, faces increasingly complex financial challenges. The expansion of the treasurer position to a volunteer with extensive financial experience allows us to better safeguard the club's financial interests. Under the new criteria, many eligible members can now serve in this capacity.

The newly defined Volunteer Finance Director role will be non-voting to ensure impartiality. The selection process for the next Finance Director will commence around August 2025. Currently, a volunteer that retired as the Coca-Cola Senior Vice-President of Finance, has stepped up to fill the role until our next scheduled election. We encourage all interested members to consider applying. The position will be supported by a Finance committee composed of experienced volunteers, and the final selection will be made by the 21-member International Board of Trustees.

Further details, including application criteria and responsibilities, will be shared by HQ in early spring 2025.

Once again, thank you for your participation in shaping the future of our organization and enhancing our financial oversight capabilities. Our IBT remains committed to its goal of "Improved Financial Analysis, Reporting, and Transparency," and your support has been instrumental in advancing this objective.

I received responses from many of you, often with great enthusiasm after my reminder email asking if YOU submitted your ballot – I love that members of the Oregon Airstream Club are so committed! I enjoyed hearing from you. Happy camping and I hope to see you out on the road!








A few of us partook in the wonderful waters at the Carson Hot Springs.

Be sure to read the reviews before making a purchase. I have * those most valuable to me. App prices may have changed and "pro" versions may now be available. Generally, a free app has a "pro" version for a fee, either one time or annual subscription. "Free" versions are designed to make the "paid" version more attractive.

Note: Apps come and apps go. Prices may have changed (increased, of course).

FIND A CAMPSITE



Allstays Camp & RV – Best \$24.95 you'll ever spend if you are stuck without a campground for the night! You set the filter for what you want to see on the map: Campgrounds of all kinds: Army Core of Engineers, city/county park, Elks Clubs, National, Forests, Independent, KOA, Military, Moose Places, National Park, Overnight Parking, BLM/Public Lands, State/Provincial Parks, propane dealers, dump stations.

Allstays directory holds more than 28,000 campgrounds. Once you have found a campground, you can view their website, phone number, and directions. **One of the best things about this app is that you can use it with or without Internet!** Available for iPhone and Android devices.

Allstay Pro has more features. \$34.95 /year. AllStays PRO is not an app, but it is mobile- friendly through your preferred web browser app (like Safari, Firefox, or Chrome). So those of you who don't use an iPhone, this is the choice for you.



***Campendium** Recommended highly by Airstreamers. Campendium has a free version, or you can purchase a "Roadpass Pro" membership which costs \$49.99/year and includes map overlays, plus memberships to a few RV- specific apps. It is gaining in popularity over Allstays because Campendium features map overlays for cell coverage as well as public

lands so you can always find the perfect campsite. Includes dump stations.



- USFS & BLM Campgrounds \$0.99 one-time purchase
- 5,650 US United States Forest Service (USFS) and Bureau of Land Management (BLM).
- Displays campground name, agency (BLM or USFS), local weather, elevation, Internet images and searches of the campground, Flickr geotag search, rec.gov info, easily locate the

campgrounds nearest you. Send location data directly to our Road Trip Planner app.

- Import routes from GPX files. This makes it much easier to find locations along your route.
- Show a route between your location and the campground.
- - Map layers include Apple, Google, and Open Street Maps.
- - No Internet connection required to view campground locations and info.
- - View Flickr photos of each location (if they exist).

BLM Maps/USPublicLands \$3.99



The US Public Lands app allows you to plug in coordinates and see exactly what type of land the coordinates are located on. This is a great way to double check that you are, in fact, staying in a location where camping is allowed without carrying physical maps, books, or digging deep online.


