

Repairs, Restorations & Cool Airstream Things

Water Leak!



Summer is finally in full swing (never really understood that phrase, oh well). We still have the rain-mow cycle happening and thankful it's not snow. Water being one of the basic requirements of life is a necessity but, not under the flooring in our trailer. About a month ago I stepped into our trailer and realized there was water between the Marmoleum[®] flooring panels and the chipboard structural floor, (one of Beatrices Foods answers to manufacturing economies). The toilet water supply valve that I had repaired several years ago with a PVC fitting and epoxy, had developed a very slow leak i.e. drip, so much for on-the-fly campground picnic table repairs. One does what they have to when the toilet is vintage and repair parts are not readily available.

In any case water had run from the toilet platform, down behind the front vertical access panel and under the floor panels. Upon taking up those panels it was discovered that the condition had been there for some time creating a very wet (soaked) subfloor of the bathroom and extending out to the gally area. On top of that there was a considerable amount of black mold to deal with, the use of chlorine fixed that condition. A wood moisture meter was purchased and test results showed a moisture content of 50-70%, good being 8-9%. After a week of fan, AC, and a new dehumidifier I was able to remove about 5 gallons of moisture from the enclosed trailer and the tests did get to the 9% value. The moldy, damaged Marmoleum[®] flooring was replaced with surplus panels left from the original project of 5 years ago, and yes, I am a packrat. And to that point, I had salvaged the main components of a scraped toilet from another project and thus I had a replacement valve.

The cautionary note here is that if you hear the water pump cycling, even very infrequently, with no faucet on, start looking for the problem. In addition, we are no longer leaving the trailer with either source of water turned on.
