A Little Geography?

As everyone knows, Grapes & Grains is an ACI (or WBCCI, for you purists) Intra-Club. As opposed to your local cub - which is geography-based - we are not limited by any regional boundaries. Our members are from all over the U.S. and Canada and represent a broad interest in wines, spirits and beers. Clearly, that same interest is worldwide and not limited to Airstreamers. According to the very popular (and mostly accurate) Wikipedia:

Beer is thought to have been invented by the Sumerians, who lived in what is now Iraq, around 8,000 BC and ancient tablets have been unearthed showing the original brewers were women. The Sumerians even had a goddess of beer, Ninkasi.

The oldest evidence of ancient wine production has been found in Georgia and Syria from c. 6000 BC (the earliest known traces of grape wine), Iran from c. 5000 BC, Greece from c. 4500 BC, Armenia from c. 4100 BC (large-scale production), and Sicily from c. 4000 BC. The earliest evidence of fermented alcoholic beverage of rice, honey and

fruit, sometimes compared to wine, is claimed in China (c. 7000 BC).

Although nobody can say for sure, Poitín, pronounced "put-cheen," is an Irish concoction thought to be the oldest spirit in the world. A spirit, or liquor, is an alcohol that has been both fermented and distilled. Popular examples include gin, whisky, and vodka.

As history has taught us, our favorite "adult beverages" have rich and diverse beginnings, and today we have a variety unmatched in history. In the United States alone, the American Distilling Institute reports over 2,200 active distilleries. The craft brewing industry reports over 9,600 craft breweries, and Wine Business reports there are more than 11,600 wineries in the U.S. That is a lot of visits Grapes & Grains needs to catch up on!

But we are headed in the right direction. With 10 rallies and our first-ever caravan in 2024, we are rapidly growing from our meager beginnings with 18 rigs in Bardstown, Kentucky only two years ago! However, we have a **major** geographic disparity in our event distribution!

To date, we have had only four rallies west of the Mississippi, and three of those were in Texas! To be fair, the Sip of Oregon is slated for next month. By contrast, this year's second annual Mega Tasting event at International will be the second of two west of the Mississippi (although Sedalia is just barely west)! The bottom line is this: we need rally hosts to volunteer to

host more rallies out west. We need YOU!

Your executive team has worked hard to make rally hosting as simple as possible, with both event and budget templates available. If you have been to a Grapes & Grains rally, you know how much fun they are, so let's work towards extending that fun as far and wide in the west as possible! We need YOU!

We are looking at including a visit to the home of the Kentucky Derby, Churchill Downs, the Louisville Slugger and Frazier Historical Arms museums, as well as visits to local distilleries. We have not yet completed the itinerary for this rally, but we hope to make it as enjoyable as the last two that we have hosted in Kentucky.



We are trying to find a host for a G & G Rally at the Airstream Park in Mystic Springs, near Pensacola, Florida for a rally in the first quarter of 2025. We held our Sip of the Panhandle Rally there in February 2023 and it was a great place to host a rally, with a great clubhouse and reasonable camping rates. There are lots of great breweries in nearby Pensacola. Send us an email if you are

interested in hosting. We have lots of tools to make the rally planning easier than ever, as well as a number of experienced people who can assist in the planning. We are also hosting a panel discussion presentation at the International Rally in Sedalia.

We look forward to the second Mega Tasting at International, which is now on a waitlist due to its popularity last year. There is also a first ever G & G luncheon, which just opened up for registrations. Don't wait to sign up!

We hope to see our old friends as well as make new ones at International. I'm told there are still spots left. If you want to have a reserved spot at International with the G & G group, make sure that ACI knows your parking preference. You can arrive any day, any time and get to park with your G & G friends.

From Matt's Cocktail Bar... The Vieux Carré

This month, we're heading south to New Orleans for a Manhattan riff called a Vieux Carré. Named after the city's French Quarter, the Vieux Carré (Old Square in French) features Benedictine, one of my favorite herbal liqueurs for which there really is no substitute. If you like a Manhattan, you'll love a Vieux Carré. Benedictine can be a bit pricey for a full bottle but it's worth it. I always have one on the bar because there are so many great cocktails that use it, including the Widow's Kiss, Bobby Burns, and the Monte Cassino.

The Vieux Carré was first served in the 1930s when Walter Bergeron, a bartender at the New Orleans' legendary Carousel Bar, treated his customers to what is now a classic. The cocktail features some really strong ingredients and is usually served up in a coupe or fancy glass, like a Manhattan, but it also works well served over a large rock so choose how you'd like it and get that glassware chilling.

I strongly recommend measuring carefully as the balance across all of the ingredients is crucial. When you get it right, it's a beautiful sipper. I'll also warn you to not skip using both kinds of bitters as they're necessary to cut through the sweetness imparted by the Benedictine and the Vermouth. Peychaud's Bitters is a mainstay of New Orleans cocktails like the Sazerac so let's keep it authentic and get to the recipe!

2 dashes Angostura Bitters

The Vieux Carré

0.75 oz Rye (Bottled and Bond - 100 proof)0.75 oz Cognac (I use Maison Rouge V.S.O.P.)0.75 oz Sweet Vermouth (I like Cocchi Vermouth di Torino)0.5 oz Benedictine2 dashes Peychaud's Bitters

Add all the ingredients into a stirring glass, add ice, and stir for about 30 seconds until well chilled and diluted. Strain into your chilled glassware and express lemon oil from a freshly cut peel over the top and give the rim a quick swipe while you're at it.

I hope you enjoy one of my favorite cocktails, cheers!
