RALLY HOSTS NEEDED FOR NEXT YEAR

Tom and Shirley are looking for members willing to host a rally in 2025. IOWA CARAVAN TO SUGAR CREEK, OHIO

Just a reminder that it is not too late to make a reservation to attend the 61st Swiss Festival Rally in Sugarcreek, OH in late September. The rally dates are 22-29. Simply Google **2024 WBCCI Swiss Festival Rally** and you will find a website that tells about the rally, as well as provide a registration form. At this time, Dale and Joan Lafrentz and Tom and Shirley Herron are traveling with Chuck and Doris Jean Cabalka to attend the rally, arriving there on Friday, September 20th. The rally is in the heart of the Amish-Mennonite area of Ohio and tours of local businesses highlite the first three days of the rally. Parades and celebrations in Sugarcreek occupy the last three rally days. For guys, the NFL Football Hall of Fame and for gals. the First Ladies Inaugural Gown Museum, are in Canton, just 30 miles NE of Sugarcreek.

The rendevous for the caravan is at Westlake County Park on the west side of Davenport on Tuesday, September 17th. The Wednesday drive is to the City Park Campground in Earl Park, IN, about 226 miles and 6 hours. Day 2's drive is 208 miles (about 5 hours really just 4 clock hours since we pass into EDT) to the Terraport at the Airstream factory in Jackson Center, OH. Chuck has reserved 12 tickets for a 2:30 tour of the new factory. Past caravans have arrived at Jackson Center by noon, so there is plenty of time to grab a lunch before the tour. Day 3's drive is just 153 miles (about 4 hours) to the rally site at the Winklepleck Grove Park campground at Sugarcreek, arriving at there in early afternoon. Before leaving Jackson Center, Chuck plans to head to Walmart to pick up some pastries to share with the staff at WBCCI Headquarters. This has become somewhat of a tradition when Chuck and Doris Jean lead caravans to the rally.

At the end of the rally, on Sunday, the 29th, the trio are heading to Marshall, MO to meet other lowans to drive the final 30 miles to the International Rally in Sedalia. The planned overnights on that trip are Sunday back at the Terraport in Jackson Center (153 miles), Monday back at the City Campground in Earl Park (208 miles), Tuesday at Millpoint Park in E. Peoria, IL (123 miles), Wednesday at Driftwood Campground in Quincy, IL (141 miles) and Thursday at Happy Times RV Park in Marshall, MO (184 miles). Each day's run is short enough that there will be time to stop and visit any interesting sites along, or near, the route.

So, read up, get registered and join your lowa Airstream friends for 17 days of travel, adventure and sightseeing. You won't regret it if you do.

SWISS FESTIVAL CARAVAN & RALLY

If you are looking for an interesting and informative place to go with your Airstream before you put it away for the winter, the Swiss Festival Rally in Sugarcreek, OH is a great place to visit. Three days of tours of Amish and Mennonite businesses, along with two parades and four evenings of entertainment and all the beautiful rolling countryside to explore, make for a busy, but enjoyable time. The rally dates are September 20-29, 2024. Chuck and Doris Jean Cabalka will be leading an Iowa caravan to the rally and you are more than welcome to join them. Rendezvous will be at Westlake County Park on the west side of Davenport, IA on September 17th.

The first day's travel (September 18th) will be 226 miles to a city park campground in Earl Park, IN. The second day's drive will be 208 miles to Jackson Center, OH with arrival such that the group will tour the new Airstream factory at 2:30 in the

afternoon. Chuck has already reserved 12 tickets for the tour. With only three couples already signed up to go, there are still six tickets available. The third, and final day, will start off with rolls and coffee with the WBCCI staff at headquarters in Jackson Center, before driving 153 miles to Winklepleck Grove, the rally site. As you can see, the daily driving distances are very nominal and should not be very tiring. An on-line rally registration form can be found at 2024 WBCCI Swiss Festival Rally and scrolling down to Rally Schedule and Rally Tour Information. That site has a registration form that can be completed on line. It also has info concerning activities at the rally. Following the rally, those who are headed to the International Rally in Sedalia, MO will be caravanning to Marshall, MO to join others from Iowa and Nebraska for the 30-mile drive to the International Rally site. This is a wonderful way to end your 2024 camping season, so sign up and join your fellow lowa Airstreamers for a great time in Sugarcreek and Sedalia. If you register for Sugarcreek, let Chuck and Doris Jean know so they can include you in the caravan.

GATHERING SPOT FOR GOING TO INTERNATIONAL

A location has been secured to serve as a rendezvous for Iowa Club members who are going to the International Rally in Sedalia and who want to park with other Iowans at the rally. The site is the Happy Times RV Park in Marshall, MO, about 30 miles north of Sedalia. Ten spaces have been blocked out at the park and are available for Iowa Club members to make their reservation for the night of October 3rd. This needs to be done within the next 2-3 weeks. You are to make your own reservations by calling **660-631-0551**. Make sure you tell them that you are part of the Iowa Airstream Club group. Those who are going to the Swiss Festival Rally in Ohio will be coming in from the east, while those going directly from Iowa will need to get to Marshall via US Hwy. 65. The address for the park is 1403 W Vest St. The GPS co-ordinates are 39°06'56.52"N and 93°12'53.44"W.

For those southbound on US 65, turn left (east) on State Rte. 20 (which is W. Arrow St.) at the west side of Marshall and proceed east for about 1.0 mile to Business 65 (also N Odell Ave.). Turn right on Business 65 (N Odell Ave.) for 0.3 mi. (about 5 blocks) to W. Vest St. Turn right (west) on W. Vest St. for

about 350 feet to the entrance to Happy Times RV Park on the right. This route will utilize right turns after leaving US 65, with no turning across oncoming traffic. Cancellations one week, or more, before October 3rd, will get a full refund. Cancellations in that last week will get only a partial refund, in the range of 80% to 90%. Hopefully there will be no cancellations necessary.

There will be an Iowa caravan from Marshall to Sedalia (about 30 miles), so you can travel and park with friends, if you so desire. For those going to the Swiss Festival Rally at Sugarcreek, OH, we will have five days to make the 775-mile trip to Marshall, so easy days and a few stops to see interesting sites, will be the schedule. If you plan to travel with that group, or with those lowans heading directly from Iowa to Sedalia, (and want to be part of the Iowa caravan to the rally site), you **MUST** have registered for one extra day at International, so as to arrive at the rally on Friday, October 4th, the day before General Parking begins. **NOTE:** If you wait until arrival at Sedalia to pay, the cost for that one day is about \$150. There was a wide variety of pizzas from which to chose, so everyone got their favorite. Then, it was back to the campground where several gathered at the Herron site for some more visiting.

A brisk breeze, blue skies and sunshine greeted everyone on Saturday morning when all gathered at the Herron trailer for a breakfast of French toast, sausages, fresh fruit and orange juice. With a forecast of high temperatures in the 90's and a heat index in the 100's, the 15-20 mile per hour breeze off the lake was quite welcome. However it did make it somewhat difficult to keep paper plates and nap-

kins corralled. Tom did a great job keeping the French toast coming, despite fighting the breeze and keeping the grill hot enough to cook the toast.

Following breakfast, the Iowa Club business meeting was held. The major item of business was the announcement of the nominations for club officers for 2025. A Sunday breakfast, consisting of a fried egg and a choice of bacon or Canadian bacon on a croissant along with fresh fruit and juice, got everyone off to a good start. The weather was still HOT, but the breeze blowing in across the lake made it somewhat bearable, as everyone hooked up and headed back home. Remember, if you cast a vote for anyone other than the nominees, that person **MUST** have indicated a willingness to serve, if elected.

You can cast your vote in four different ways. 1) Attend the August rally and bring your completed ballot with you 2) Complete your ballot and mail it to Secretary Doris Jean Cabalka at 1205 S. 8th Ave., E., Newton, IA 50208 to be received by August 7th 3) Email your vote to the Secretary at cdjcabalka@gmail,com prior to the business meeting and 4) Phone your vote to the Secretary at 480-216-8096. Obviously, the preferred way is to bring your ballot to the August rally. Each member has one vote (husband and wife or member and significant other). Installation of the 2025 officers will be at the September rally at Little Wall Lake Park due to the International Rally cancelling out our October rally.

OUR CLUBS NEEDS YOU As you can see from the included election ballot, no one was willing to accept nomination for the office of Vice President for 2025. Filling this office is VITALLY IMPORTANT if the club is to exist beyond 2025. That is because the Vice President has the responsibility to secure hosts and sites for rallies and winter luncheons in the following year. The 2026 International Rally is scheduled for August 22-27 in Minot, ND. This means there would be five Iowa Club rallies to schedule (May, June, July, September and October) because we traditionally DO NOT have a club rally during the month of the International. The Vice President can either determine where the rallies will be held and secure hosts, or do the opposite; secure hosts and let them determine the rally sites. Luncheons are held in November, December, February, March and April. If anyone is willing to take the office of Vice President, write in the name on the ballot and mail it to Secretary Doris Jean Cabalka at 1205 S 8th Ave E, Newton, IA 50208 or call her at 480-216-8096. Remember, anyone nominated for an office in the club MUST be willing to serve if elected, so make sure whatever name you submit has indicated a willingness to serve. It cannot be stressed too much that we NEED someone to step forward and agree to serve the club by accepting nomination for this office. Otherwise, you won't have a club after 2025. Think about that!!
