


Dear Rivet, Please remind me again about tire care during the summer. Round N. Round

Here is a reminder to inspect your **tires** before every trip and along the way. Check the tire pressure on all tires before leaving. You can find the tire pressure information on the tag for your tires and in the owner's manual. Over-inflated or under-inflated tires can make tire and axel damage more likely and put you at a greater risk for a flat or a blowout. Proper air pressure (psi) levels for your tires are detailed in your owner's manual. Use a pressure gauge to check levels all the way around your travel trailer. You should also check the air pressure on your spare tire(s). Check lug nut torque for the proper torque, and use a manual torque wrench to loosen each lug nut until you reach that level. Finally check for dry rot, uneven tire wear and the tire tread. Airstream has a excellent blog How to Inspect and Maintain Tires on an Airstream Travel Trailer


