We will be camping at Charcoal Hearth Campground at Pine Grove Furnace State Park, Gardners, PA. Make your camping reservations now as sites (especially pet sites) will fill quickly for this weekend. The rate is \$27/night. The

park brochure has a map of the campground. Stay Friday through Sunday if you can so that you may enjoy either one or both days of the festival. Sites are electric only, so fill your water tank before arrival. There are dump stations onsite.

Friday evening we'll provide a burger bar and on Saturday you can enjoy great food at the festival! With clear skies we will have campfires and BYO snacks Friday and Saturday. Coffee service will be provided on Saturday and Sunday morning. There is no rally fee. The festival in nearby Biglerville will be open Saturday 8-6 and Sunday 8-5 rain or shine. You can purchase tickets online in advance (\$10) or get them at the festival grounds. Fire police will direct you to parking fields and shuttle bus service is provided to festival grounds (included in admission). Pets are NOT permitted at the festival. 
Northeast Rail Trail Excursion by Jody Dietz BRN 4361

For three plus weeks Sue and I camped and rode our bikes on seven trails in three states with a twist. We made no reservations. We knew approximately where we wanted to camp based on trail location but we didn't know where, when we would get there, and when we would leave. Everything was up in the air, spontaneous. This is not standard operating procedure for us especially with the campgrounds being so full in the past during peak season.

The day we were set to depart, we looked at each other and said, "Let's leave tomorrow." We did just that and changed our trajectory from north, northwest to due west based solely on adding a trail that looked interesting. Our campground destination unknown. During a fuel stop we called a couple of campgrounds. Having no response we left messages and went on our way. As we approached the area both places called back. One was full the other called us 20 minutes from the campground and they could fit us in.

So, it went like that the entire trip, including July 4th weekend. While booking Maplewoods we were told we had to leave on the 4th. We took it and let them know if there was a cancellation to pencil us in. When we arrived, they had three options. Beautiful place, trail, six different firework displays. Was this luck or is this the way it is? I leave it up to you to decide.

Below is our trip in a nutshell. Thumbs up indicate we would stay there or do it again. Ratings 1 to 5, 1 being lowest, 5 being highest.





First stop, 1889 Park (County) South Fork PA \$35 a night FHU (2 thumbs up) Rating-3. Bike Trail, Ghost Town Trail and Path of the flood trail (2 thumbs up). Water was crystal clear, however, all the waterways had a rust color due to the iron content.

Second stop, Cinderella Motel and Campground Grand Island, NY Just south of the American Niagara Falls \$60 FHU (2 thumbs up) Rating-3. Bike Trails, Great Gorge Scenic Trail and West River Shoreline Trail (2 thumbs up).

Third stop, Reds Twilight on the Erie RV Resort Macedon, NY \$70 FHU (2 thumbs up) Rating-4. Bike Trail, Erie Canal Trail section from Macedon to Pittsford (2 thumbs up). Very scenic trail with cool little towns along the way. Although we didn't use the bathhouse, it was worthy a pic or two.





Fourth stop, French Creek Marina Clayton, NY \$69 FHU (2 Thumbs up) Rating-3. Bike Trail, Sissy Danforth River Gate Trail (2 thumbs down). Biking the town of Clayton, (2 thumbs down). River Gate is very poorly maintained, biking in town is unsafe. The campground is in the center of Clayton so accessing the trail and exploring town was only a block away. A lot to see and do in and around Clayton. Unfortunately, biking wasn't one of them.

Fifth stop, Maplewoods Campground Johnson, Vermont 20 minutes from Stowe \$60 FHU (2 thumbs up) Rating-4. Bike Trail, Lamoille Valley Trail Morristown to Jeffersonville section (2 thumbs up). Every view on this stop was like this.



Sixth and final stop, Hide-A-Way Campsites Central Bridge NY \$48 FHU (2 thumbs up) Rating 3.5. Erie Canal Trail Canajoharie to Little Falls Section (2 thumbs up). Note the Erie Canal trail is 331 miles long and travels almost across the whole state of NY. There are many historic sites along the Erie Canal which is still up and running today. Who knew?
