Scenic Overload 2024!

Hello from Alaska! We are presently co-leading the 2024 WBCCI North to Alaska Caravan. I am looking out over the **Homer Spit (1)** as I write this. It is mid-August, 55 degrees outside. Google Maps says we are 4863 miles from home. We have traveled 10K+ miles since we left home in late May. The map shows some of our stops before the caravan, minus Florida and the midwestern states because there were too many locations for Google maps to map!

When we left sunny HOT Florida, we wandered across the country visiting friends and family in Illinois and Iowa. We toured the **Nebraska State Capital (2)** with some Airstreamers we met last year on the Discovering Cascadia Caravan. Then we stayed for a couple days in **Fraser**, **Colorado (3)** where we mooch docked with some more caravan buddies and moose. Their "cabin" was at 9000 feet elevation, so our Florida lungs took a day or two to acclimate.

As we were heading west, we were in contact with some friends on the Springtime in the Rockies caravan. We managed to get a campsite with them at **Dinosaur National Monument Campground in Utah (4, 5).** This makes two years in a row that we ran into that caravan on the road. We had a great time meeting more Airstreamers on the road. Some of the folks we knew from other caravans; another couple was heading to the North to Alaska Caravan after the Rockies.




Our first hard-to-get reservation was at **Vinnie's in Sacramento**, **CA (6)** for some necessary repairs. We had a Monday, June 10th appointment to get our front-end separation dealt with. Vinnie met us, briefed us on the repair plan, and said it would be ready for pick up on Friday the 14th.

We have a good friend that lives near **Joshua Tree National Park**, (7) southern CA, so we drove down there to hang out with him until the trailer was done. He has a jeep and a couple motorcycles so we had some adventures there.

We got up stupid early on Friday the 14th of June in order to get back to Sacramento before close of business (about 500 miles). Vinnie had the Airstream ready to go, so off we went in search of a place to camp. Of course, we didn't have reservations anywhere so we wandered north. We tried to get into Lassen Volcanic National Park, CA but the road was closed due to snow. We ended up boondocking somewhere near there on some national forest property.









After that we found a spot near **Shasta Lake (8)** in northern California. We spent a couple nights there and managed to go hiking and kayaking around the lake.

A few more miles north and we were in Oregon. We spent a couple days in Medford where we had the pages printed for the North to Alaska Caravan driver's book. From there we bee-lined it up to **Anacortes, Washington** (9) where we mooch docked with our dear friends Ed and Cheri. We spent nearly two weeks there enjoying the San Juan Island area.

While we were in Anacortes, we met up with two couples that are joining us on the North to Alaska Caravan. Mark and Connie & Jim and Suki were traveling together to the start in Dawson Creek, British Columbia (BC).

On July 2nd, we finally crossed the border into Canada. My plan was to make our way up through Prince George, BC to get to Dawson Creek, BC. I was redirected by the "boss", so we headed east-ish so that we could drive through Glacier National Park in Canada (10). We found a few campsites on the way and enjoyed some nice hikes. Roche Lake (11) and Revelstoke (12) were two of our stops on the way.

We found ourselves on the Ice Fields Parkway, Alberta (AB), Canada (13). OMG! I have seen some pretty spectacular views in my life but... OMG! We found a dry camping spot in the Honeymoon Lake, AB, Canada (14) area. We took advantage of the free firewood for a wonderful campfire after our lovely float around Honeymoon Lake. It was amazing to see how the glaciers carved the mountains over millennia. It took a good night's sleep to reset the scenic overload.

We continued our wandering northward until we found ourselves at a KOA in Hinton, Alberta, Canada. In this campground we met several other North to Alaska Caravan participants. We had an impromptu potluck dinner and started to get to know each other.

The next day we headed to the caravan starting point in Dawson Creek, BC. There were quite a few caravanners in Dawson Creek already. The caravan officially started on July 12th.











It's now the 1st of September and we are in Haines, Alaska. We spent the day whale watching on the way to and from Juneau. After the boat ride we went down the road a bit to Chilkoot Lake park and watched bears eating their fill of salmon.

Hanna Park Rally July 4-8, Jacksonville, FL

The rally at the Kathryn Abbey Hanna Park in Jacksonville over the Independence Day weekend was a no -host event. The attendees were mostly from the Jacksonville area with two Airstreams traveling about 90 minutes each from Lake City and Ormond Beach.

The campground is just part of a much larger county park. There are miles of walking and biking trails as well as a both a freshwater inland lake and miles of beach on the Atlantic Ocean. There are kayaks, canoes, paddle boards, and paddlewheel boats for rent at the lake as well as regular and e-bike rentals at the store – located just outside of the campground. Overall, it is a nice park, but the large daily attendance does leave upkeep of public facilities in need of a bit more attention.

The campground itself includes some 300 sites with water and electric, a number of bath houses, a laundry facility, and a nature center. Nearly all sites were surrounded by trees and foliage - so much so that it was easy to drive right past a campsite and not notice an Airstream tucked in with nature. The roads were a bit narrow and there were not many places to turn around – say if someone missed their turnoff on the first try.

The number of trees and foliage combined with this being a no-host event, did leave Florida Airstream Club members without an easy way to communicate and find each other (we will know better next time, now that we all realize what a great asset it is having a host). Several of us were out searching and our combined efforts located 8 Airstreams. Six of the Airstreams were affiliated with the Florida Airstream Club and those included some 15 occupants in total.





The other two Airstreams were occupied by singles. One was a campground host; and he was there for the season. The other was a woman with a new Bambi just getting started in camping.

We all had a good time camping, exploring the park, and getting to know some other Airstream enthusiasts.



Devil's Den Spring in Williston, Florida. March 31, to April 7, 2025

Hiking Paynes Prairie, Devil's Millhopper, Sweetwater Wetlands Park are some of the other activities we will be planning. Ichetucknee and Santa Fe Rivers are also nearby, with the Springs Institute in High Springs a worthy visit.
