Editor David's Airstream Club Primer

September 2024: We Interrupt This Program...

Now wait a minute. What business do I have entitling this month's article, "We Interrupt This Program" when this program has already been interrupted by Summer since the last issue of the North Texas Roundup in June? I'll tell you.

When last we met, I was building a site map of the ACI website to give you a better idea of the resources at your fingertips (literally). We'd completed our visit to the members-only section and the home page of the public, no-login-required side. And before that, I covered our unit's website within the master club site. That's a lot of months of "internetty" stuff for a social club whose purpose is to go outside, travel, and experience things IRL (In Real Life, as the kids say ... Or maybe they don't. What do I know? I don't have kids.)

Why don't we put all that digital stuff aside and skip ahead a little this month. You have your Airstream. You're a WBCCI member. What do you do now? Well you can attend rallies and caravans of course (see my February 2024 column). But sometimes you're just on the road on your own, like Kim and I are this summer. And that's where I got the idea for this column—themed trips.

A theme will help you generate ideas about where to go next. You can apply one or more themes to a long trip, or you can pick a theme and spread it across many trips. The latter method is easily illustrated by goal-oriented themes, such as camping in all 48 contiguous states, visiting all of the Texas State Parks, or maybe even something more esoteric like visiting all AAA minor league baseball stadiums. This will set you up with ideas over a long span of time.

The former strategy is more open-ended and will tap into your creativity and imagination. I'm going to use our summer trip as an example. Nominally, we had two objectives when we left home in June: 1) be in Santa Barbara, CA in time for our friend's special, round-numbered, July birthday, and 2) be in Sedalia, MO for the International Rally. That left a lot of time and distance to fill. So we chose some themes that would direct where we stayed and what we did when we got there.

We started with three—it was a long trip after all—friends and family, museums, and trains. During the trip, we added National Parks, Monuments, and other sites run by the National Park Service because we stayed near Yosemite on our way out of California and couldn't pass it up. We bought an annual National Parks pass so we could use it as we headed east. The friends and family part was easy because we have several on the route into and out of California. Museums came about when I bought Kim a membership to the Kimbell Art Museum in Fort Worth, adding a family upgrade that came with membership in the North American Reciprocal Museum Association (NARM). That gives us free access to over 1000 museums throughout

the U.S. and Canada. It quickly paid for itself. The trains theme indulged my lifelong love for railroads. We used 2 resources to find excursions, museums, depots, model railroads and other attractions. First was the *Tourist Trains Guidebook*, published by Kalmbach Books. Second was a series of three regional maps entitled Railroad U.S.A.: Museums and Trips (Eastern, Central, and Western editions). We picked those up at a fabulous model railroad in Greeley, CO last year.

What are your hobbies and interests? Fishing? Quilting? Civil War battlefields? Consider planning some thematic trips around them. It will add some fun to the sometimes tedious task of route planning.


