Question? What's the fastest speed that humans have ever traveled?

Astronauts Thomas Stafford, John Young, and Eugene Cernan reached a speed of 24,816 mph while returning from their eight-day voyage on May 26, 1969, a record that not even subsequent Apollo missions managed to top. Other speed records don't even come close the the speed of Apollo 10.

The land speed record set in 1997 by a 54 foot Thrust SuperSonci Car is 763 mph.

What speed are you comfortable pulling your trailer? Is there a difference when you're solo vs. in a caravan?




I know that I usually let the lead dog set the speed when in a caravan. My first experience was a trip to International in Michigan. The leader

There will be no movies! We'll have shadow puppets on the side of the Airstream. Who can do the best rabbit finger shadow?







FYI: Allison Creek Cancellation Policy

- Cancellations occurring 0-13 days before arrival will incur a cancellation fee of 1 night stay.
- Cancellations occurring 14 or more days before arrival will incur a cancellation fee of \$10.

Any reservation can be transferred to an alternate date without penalty.

Sites are \$41.00 + tax per night. If you are a resident of York SC the rate is less.
